
The lads have worked very hard since their last game and we have changed training slightly to hopefully produce a more consistent level of rugby.

The players and staff involved with that team have shown great commitment and it would be nice for them to get some reward in terms of results sooner rather than later.


The next home game against York will not be altered or moved from its scheduled time and date of 3pm on 18th May.





# A PIECE OF OLDHAM RUGBY HISTORY

Fans who are interested in Oldham RLFC history will be fascinated by this article taken from a now extinct weekly rugby league paper in Sydney, Australia called 'The Referee'. It was last published in 1939 --- ten years after the Oldham v Australians game at Watersheddings to which this article refers.

Vic Armbruster, who wrote it, was one of the Kangaroos players and he returned to England after the tour to play for Rochdale Hornets. Cec Fifield, another tourist, came back to play for Hull and some 20 years later became Hornets manager,

writes ROGER HALSTEAD.

For unearthing this piece from the files of the NSW State Library and supplying it for use in this programme I am indebted to my Aussie friend of many years Bob McKenzie, a lifelong rugby league fan and supporter of St George Illawarra.

A crowd of 18,000 watched the game in question, in which Oldham lined up like this. Rees; Rix, Thomas, Stephens, Johnson; Oster, Reynolds; Read, Scaife, Clayton, Ashworth, Entwistle, Watkins.

The Kangaroos won 18-10, Oldham's points coming from tries by Sid Rix and Jack Oster and two goals by Tommy Rees.

#### KANGAROO THRILLS

#### Glorious Play in Rain at Oldham

("Referee" Special by Vic. Armbruster)

ILKLEY, Yorks, 12/11/29.

We have found that in England, as anywhere else, the more powerful the club the better the organisation. Oldham is the best club which we have yet to be desired. Mr. G. D. Hutchins, who was in Australia last year, has told us, following the Huddersfield game, that his club were out to beat that figure. They succeeded, and we played before a record crowd and gate for that centre.

In view of the fact that rain began about 1.p.m., and continued throughout the afternoon, Oldham have reason to be proud of their performance. They have another fine record which they wished to preserve - that of defeating every colonial side which had visited that centre. The 1921 tourists played there twice, winning on the first and losing on the second occasion.

The ground is known as Watershedding, and is very compact. There are covered stands on both sides and one end; the other end is raised similar to our "hill." The spectators are very close to the game, as the seats in the stands rise abruptly. It is one of the best grounds I have seen, and affords all spectators a fine view of the game. The turf was heavy and sticky because of the heavy rain during the week, and was our first real taste of what English conditions are going to be in the coming Winter months. We were rather glad of this in case the conditions for the second Test match at Leeds the following Saturday were bad.

The game started off with a real sesation. As Gorman had won the toss, Oldham kicked off. Treweeke recieved, passed to Prigg, whose transfer to Busch was interrupted by Osten, and he had an easy run over underneath the posts. It was the most sensational opening of any game I can remember having seen, or in which I have participated. Rees, the full-back, converted, giving them a 5-0 lead within one minute. Prigg was across the goal-line later, but failed to properly ground the balld, and Treweeke almost scored. Rees later kicked a penalty goal, and at half-time we faced a deficit of 7-0.

Our tactics continued the same, despite the greasy conditions, and we continued to to throw the ball about and finished up a great game, winners by a margin of 18-10. Spencer scored a sensational try in the last minute of the game, which was a fitting climax. He recieved the ball from Fifield, burst between the centre and wing, ran around Rees and literally bolted from the converging defence to score under the posts. Our team recieved a wonderful reception from the big crowd, being reminiscient of the ovation accorded us after our victory against Lancashire County at Warrington.

### \* \* \* \* HARRY SUNDERLAND'S ACCIDENT.

Then came disaster. As Mr. Sunderland stepped out of the bus to cross the road to the Post Office, he was knocked down by a motor car. It cast a real gloom over everybody. He recieved a bad gash in gthe head, and to us it looked very serious. "Sunday" is very popular with his own team. Fortunately the X-ray on the Monday revealed no fractures, and consequently we all felt much relieved. He has a big army of friends in Oldham, and they rallied aroundin fine style. One must pay tribute to the staff of the Royal Infirmary at Oldhamfor their treatment of the patient.

At Oldham we met Geo. Smith, who came to England with the 1905 All Blacks Rugby Union side, and again with Baskerville's 1907 side, under Rugby League; Also Joe Lavery and Arthur Kelley, other members of Baskerville's team. We are hoping for seasonably fine weather for the second Test.
