JOHN CLEGG R.I.P

THE club has lost one its longest-serving and most dedicated supporters with the passing, aged 92, of John Clegg of Watersheddings, who died in the Royal Oldham Hospital at the end of March.

A lifelong supporter, John broke a hip in a fall at home and was in hospital for about a week and a half before he died, having lived within a good goalkick's distance of the old Watersheddings ground for more than 60 years.

It is with deep sadness that we record his passing and convey to all members of the family the sincere condolences of everyone at the club.

John served with the RAF in India in the 1940s and it was on his return to the UK, and his native Oldham, in 1949 that he bought a house in Adlington Street, close to the top of Sharples Hall Street and almost in the shadow of his beloved Watersheddings.

His son Alan recalled: "He began to get passionate about Oldham Rugby when he was a 15-year-old schoolboy and he never lost his love of the club until the day he died.

"He was a keen fan for more than 75 years. My earliest memories are of the team that played in the early 60s and had that fantastic Challenge Cup semi-final series with Hull KR in 1964, but my Dad never stopped talking of the great team of the 50s.

"As the years passed by my heroes were players like Martin Murphy, Mike Ellliott and Phil Larder, but Dad used to regale me with stories of Alan Davies, Derek Turner, Bernard Ganley and all the others from that era.

"Like all Oldham fans he dreamed of watching the team at Wembley, but it was never to happen although we went close in a few semi-finals.

"When my own son, also called John, was old enough to go, the three of us would always stand on the Herbert Street side towards the Hutchins end. The same people would always congregate in the same place and you would get to know them very well."

By the time Watersheddings was sold off for housing development, John was well into his 70s. He didn't drive and his son and family were by then living in Chorley.

Grandson John takes up the story. "Dad and I got over to Oldham as much as we could to take him to the rugby, and he never lost his interest.

"We took him to Whitebank a few times and he enjoyed every minute of it."

Alan and John jnr. planned to be here at the York game today in order to pay their last respects at a match they chose specifically because the City Knights, like Oldham, are a traditional rugby league club with a great history and heritage.
