

of time they have been playing at this level.


Once again a complete performance will be needed from our lads and nothing less will be good enough.



Six of the best for anchor man 'Ropes'

AFTER half a dozen games for Oldham, onloan half-back Steve Roper says he has seen enough to believe that this could be the year of the Roughyed.

At 27, the little midfield general is one of the most experienced players at Whitebank, where he shoulders a lot of responsibility for directing operations and implementing Scott Naylor's game plan.

He and captain Lewis Palfrey, three years his junior, are Naylor's current linchpins - Palfrey on the right, Roper on the left.

The man from derby rivals Rochdale - he was in the Hornets side that broke Oldham hearts in last year's play-off final - came initially on loan for a month, but then had it extended to the end of the season.

After spending the best part of six seasons at Spotland, 'Ropes', as he is nicknamed, could have been excused for thinking he was being dropped behind enemy lines.

"In actual fact, I was made very welcome at Oldham from day one. I settled in fine. I'm really enjoying my rugby with a great set of lads." said Roper.

"It suited me fine when the loan was extended because I want to stay at Oldham to be honest, I'm enjoying it so much here.


"More than anything, I want to do my bit in seeing us win promotion and I see absolutely no reason at all why we can't achieve that.

"If we hadn't had that off-day at Hemel we would have been sitting pretty.

"As it is, we have fewer defeats than any other side in the division and we are the only team still unbeaten at home."

Roper believes Oldham have the players and the coaching staff to go all the way.

He added: "Training is a lot more intense than what I'd been used to, and I also like the type of rugby we are playing.



"It's expansive, and it allows me to get my hands on the ball a lot and to get heavily involved in what we are trying to achieve.

"That's my job. As a half-back, it's what I'm there for; to make decisions and, with Lewis (Palfrey), to guide the side around the field.

"I suppose I do feel I have some responsibility for the team, but that's the nature of the position I play; it's nothing to do with me being older and perhaps a bit more experienced than some of the others.

"We've got some very good young players, a few of them still only 20, and that's reflected in our results.

"In one of my early games, Jason Boults didn't play and I realised I was the oldest player in the team. You don't expect that at my age, but it gives an indication of how much youth there is in the side.

"We've got some tough games coming up this month, and later on there will be the playoffs, and perhaps in tight games like that my experience will come in handy."

How an Irish philosopher helped Murgy to beat self-doubt and win through in the end.

In our last programme we reported that club photographer David Murgatroyd (Murgy) was in a triathlon relay team that was to compete at Windsor and swim in the River Thames . . . a daunting challenge if ever there was one. Here is HIS story of what happened on the big day.

ANYONE who has done open-water swimming will know how much it differs to swimming in a pool; it's black, very cold and full of fish, water fowl and microbes.

I had trained for this; what I didn't expect was the extreme strength of the water flow in the River Thames. You are advised to swim breaststroke at first until you get used to the cold. No way. The river was soon pushing me back and I quickly had to switch to front crawl.

It was so tough that three guys gave up straight away and I was left in the dangerous zone of self-doubt. My head was all over the place. Why am I here? I'm no athlete. I'm 44, a fool. I'm going to let down my team mates.

Then, just ahead, I saw a chap taking a rest by hanging on to a buoy. My swim cap was orange. His was yellow, which meant he was from a group that set off four minutes ahead of me.

It drove me on to know that if I could pass him I wouldn't be last and I completed my swim in 35mins.2secs. I was hoping for between 25 and 30 mins. but I was happy with my time nevertheless, given the strength of the currents I had to battle with.

Once out of the water I then had to run for 200 metres, barefoot on tarmac (ouch!).

I wrote on Facebook: "That was the hardest thing I've ever done in my life."

It's true, and once again I want to thank Tony Gothard, whose help, encouragement, training and advice got me through.

Well, it was mainly that, but I also relied on a quotation from Irish orator, philosopher and politician Edmond Burke, which I have tattooed on my arm:


"All that is necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing."
