

Scott finally gets his man!

came up trumps with the capture of winger Adam Clay, who made his debut at York last Sunday.

When the programme went to press. it wasn't known whether he would be making his home debut today, but he would certainly be in the mix.

Barrow's top try scorer in the Championship last year, 23-year-old Clay has joined us initially on a shortterm contract to the end of this season.

He figured in 27 of Barrow's 29 games in 2013, scoring 12 tries although playing in a struggling side that only narrowly avoided relegation.

Suitably impressed, newly-promoted North Wales Crusaders signed him for a second time, but he was recently released, whereupon Scott Naylor pounced to finally get his man after 18 months of trying.

"I first came across Adam when he was a kid at Leigh Miners," said the Oldham boss.

"I signed him on pro forms for Salford, and I've rated him ever since. I think he's a fine player.

"We are light on outside backs and although he's predominantly a winger, he could operate equally well at centre or full-back.

OUR search for another outside back "The days have gone when players were only ever asked to play in one position. Adam can play across the back line and he's a perfect fit for what we've been looking

> "He's a Championship player, no doubt about that.

> "We tried to sign him at the end of last season when we were hoping to win promotion, but he opted to stay in the higher division and go back to Crusaders and we fully understood his reasons for doing so.

> "I never lost my interest, though, and when he became available we snapped him up."

> Leigh-born Clay represented Great Britain Community Lions in Australia at under-18s level and shortly afterwards signed for Salford, where he spent two and a half years, much of it in the reserves working under 'Spanner' (Lee Spencer).

> In 2011 he made two Super League appearances for Salford as a 19-year-old.

> The following year he had a brief spell at Leigh (three tries in five appearances) and then Crusaders on loan (six tries in ten outings).

> It was during that season, before Scott's arrival as coach, that Crusaders did the double over Oldham, with Adam scoring a try both times.



HOW THE SKIPPER PLAYED HIS PART

CLUB captain Lewis Palfrey played a leading role in Adam Clay's arrival at Whitebank, revealed Adam when speaking exclusively to the club's media department.

"Lewis and I go back a long way," said the Leigh-born former Salford, Leigh, Barrow and North Wales Crusaders winger.

"We were mates at Salford and we've remained good mates since. I'm a big friend of his. Before I signed Lewis told me all about the club and how good it was.

"I liked what he had to say and that had a big bearing on my decision, although I also know Scott and 'Spanner' very well and also members of the backroom team and some of the players."

Adam (23) damaged an ankle last March when playing for North Wales Crusaders in a Challenge Cup tie against Pilkington Recs and although it doesn't stop him

training and playing he was due to have a scan on it yesterday.

Despite our defeat at York, Adam is optimistic about his new club's prospects of making an impact in the remainder of the season.

"It's all down to the play-offs and anything can happen in those," he said.

"Had Oldham got promoted last year I would have signed for them then, so I was at the final when they were beaten by Rochdale and I was disappointed like everybody else.

"I'd had a good year at Barrow and I wanted to stay in the Championship, so I signed for Crusaders, where I had been on loan from Leigh in 2012.

"As things turned out, I wish I had signed for Oldham in the first place, but I'm here now and I'm looking forward to my first home game and getting my career back on track with my new club."



Last-gasp winner set 'Nieldy' on his way

LOYALTY and perseverance have paid off for Steven Nield who, in his fourth season at Whitebank, has finally got the job he always wanted.

He has played consistently well since getting his hands on the full-back jersey in time to play a key role in the 48-28 home win against Oxford at the beginning of May. He has kept his spot ever since, and done a fine job, too.

In was in the next game that he scored the sensational, last-gasp try that gave Roughyeds a 31-30 win against York and his confidence and self-belief have grown steadily ever since.

Life at Whitebank is sweet right now for the former Saddleworth Rangers junior, whose fans include scores of children to whom he teaches sport in local schools as part of his full-time day job.

It wasn't always like that.

Last season, his first as a member of the senior squad, he couldn't get his hands on his favourite full-back's shirt, which was then worn by Italian international Richard Lepori.

Elsewhere, in a back line dominated by Mo Agoro, David Cookson, Jon Ford and Dale Bloomfield there were few opportunities for him to show his versatility at centre or wing.

He made only six senior appearances, all of

them at centre and all of them in the early part of the campaign.

For the remainder of the year he was on the outside looking in, back in the under-20s and playing variously at full-back, centre and wing.

"It was tough at the time. Everybody was playing well and I couldn't get an opening. I just had to bide my time," he said.

"It was hard to get into the team, but I could see how well the other lads were playing so I had to accept it. It was just one of those things."

'Lippy's' departure at the end of last season created an opening, but Steve then found himself in competition with another local lad, Tom Whitehead, who lost his place after a bad defeat at Hunslet on Good Friday.

Steve added: "I've had to be patient, but I'm getting a good run now and I'm loving every minute.

"Everyone is starting to click. We are playing well as a team and hopefully we are coming good at the right time.

"We've got some massive games coming up, but if we play to the best of our ability we should be okay."

Roper's OUR lad now - Scott New talks with Rochdale end fears of a recall

OLDHAM have negotiated Steve Roper's release from Rochdale Hornets and tied him up on contract to the end of the season.

"He's our lad now," said a delighted Scott Naylor, of the half-back who has become a key member of the Oldham side since arriving from Spotland on loan in early May.

He came initially for a month. The loan agreement was then extended to the end of the season, but it carried with it a recall clause which would have enabled Hornets to drag him back at any time.

At Whitebank there was a fear it might have happened at the business end of the season and with the top-five play-offs not far away.

Explained chairman Chris Hamilton: "We needed to be in charge of our own destiny, so we have been working on trying to get Steve's release for quite a while.

"It was completed on the Friday night before the Gloucester game so that been beenwas his first as a fully-fledged Oldham player.

"That removes our concerns as we look ahead to the big games that are coming up."

Roper, 27, has been a Roughyeds regular for the past couple of months, taking up a pivotal role with responsibilities for ensuring the attack runs smoothly on the left-hand side of the field.

Added Naylor: "It was important we secured his

services. On and off the field he has done a great job since he came to us in May, knowing he had to prove himself.

"Because of the key role he was going to fill, I needed to have a good look at him and spend time working him into our systems, so he trained with us for the best part of a month before his first game.

"He grabbed his opportunity and he has brought a lot to the team in terms of experience, a higher skill level, composure and a good kicking game. He's very calm and composed in everything he does.


"There was a worry that Rochdale might have wanted him back, but that's gone now so we can look ahead with confidence."

Roper said: "I didn't want to go back to Rochdale anyway. I'm enjoying my rugby at Oldham and it's good to know everything is sorted out.



"We've had some disappointments -- don't mention Grand Finals --- but we've had some great times too and I would like to thank everyone with whom I've shared those ups and downs over the years, team mates, club officials and fans, who have always supported me through thick and thin.

"I'll never forget my first try for the club. It was at Batley in my third game, but the first time I was in the starting line-up.

"The following season we had that amazing run to the play-off final. We were one game off Super League, but Widnes beat us at Spotland.

"It's difficult to pick out outstanding players because there have been so many but Phil Farrell, my pal, was a fantastic captain; Mark Sibson was a freak finisher, who scored some of the best tries I've ever seen; Paul O'Connor was brilliantly consistent; and there were naturally gifted players like Shane McMenemy and Bryan Henare."


NEIL holds two club records - most appearances and most tries. His retirement from playing at the end of last season marked the end of an era for Oldham RLFC (1997) Ltd.

In his two spells at Oldham - 2000 to 2004 inclusive and 2007 to 2013 inclusive - he amassed a club record 296 cup and league appearances, scoring 113 tries, another club best that is unlikely ever to be surpassed.

Such is his affinity with the club he first joined as a 19-year-old from Wigan Warriors that he was delighted to accept an invitation to become coach of the under-20s, a position he has filled with the sort of cool, calm professionalism that was the hallmark of his distinguished playing career.

The son of Wigan's chief scout, Jack Roden, Neil - then a 19-year-old with hair! - and his pal Phil Farrell arrived at Oldham from the Warriors in the Spring of 2000 when Mike Ford was player-coach.

Neil made his debut off the bench in a 61-26 defeat at Featherstone to launch a fantastic Roughyeds career in which he played in four play-off finals; was twice named in divisional team-of-the-year sides (2007 and 2010); played in every game of the 2001 and 2007 seasons; top-scored with 20 tries in 2002; and played alongside 23 different half-backs.



He played mainly at scrum-half in his early days but in his second spell, after two seasons at Batley and Leigh, he was an automatic choice at stand-off.

Of the many half-backs he partnered, he made most appearances alongside James Coyle (49 times), David Gibbons (30) and Gareth Barber (26).

He played in four Grand Finals, partnered by David Gibbons in 2001, James Coyle in 2007, Thomas Coyle in 2009 and Greg McNally in 2010.
