From The Chair...

Good evening everyone. First of all apologies for having to play this fixture on a Friday night but the stadium had already been booked for other events this weekend and try as we might we have been unable to change that.

A warm welcome to supporters, players and officials from Oldham for today's first Kingstone Press Championship Play – off game as the season moves to an exciting climax and the ultimate promotion prize in The Grand Final at Headingley looms into view. Our last fixture at Whitebank saw Oldham snatch the points in a dramatic last minute finish. Let's hope today's game is just as entertaining but with the result hopefully in our favour.

Apologies for my absence today. I'll have to follow events via regular updates from the Editor as I will be in Prague for a short break with my good lady wife.

You will no doubt have seen the recent controversy surrounding DR where, having had 3 points deducted for breaching the rules. both Batley and Doncaster successfully overturned that points deduction on a joint appeal. As part of their appeal they cited several clubs who had breached the rules in the 2013 season and not been punished. It will not have escaped those following this story that one of those clubs cited was Hunslet. So, I thought it only fair that I explain the situation from our point of view. We advised the RFL that we intended to play Paul McShane on DR in the final game of last season against Featherstone at home. The RFL notified us that Paul had not played enough games during the season to be eligible to

play. Additionally they had also noted that the previous game Paul had played for us was also after the DR deadline and as such we were in breach of the rules and potentially subject to a points deduction. However, they considered that as we had not won the game in which Paul had played then we had not received any additional benefit from his presence and so we were simply given a warning. I mention this because if the RFL acted on our indiscretion last season then I would be surprised if they had not similarly intervened in the other instances mentioned. I think there are lessons to be learned from all sides here, not least that the DR rules, and to be frank a whole host of other operational rules, need to be simplified. Additionally, I think there has to be a process that allows clubs and the RFL to handle and manage Appeals in a more professional way, out of the glare of the watching media.

Finally, we held our inaugural Heritage Dinner on Friday 29 August and the event was an outstanding success. Many thanks go to Geoff Gray and Andy Hemingway for the tremendous work they put into organising the event and the Heritage stands that Andy also had designed and produced were simply outstanding. Thanks also to Harry Gration who compered the evening so successfully raising funds for the Foundation and SiTRAN, our Club charity, on whose behalf Stuart Keane made an excellent and impassioned speech.

a Hughes bomb was followed up by Danny Langtree. The All Golds did cross the whitewash in the first half to leave the half time score 42-6.



Player In Focus...



Aston Wilson

Hunslet Hawks Aston Wilson is the player in question this week, praised for his devastating runs and powerful hand offs Aston is in his second season at the South Leeds.

A Queens RLFC amateur, Aston is a local talent with family ties to the Hawks club, following in father Warren Wilson's footsteps who played for the Hawks at Elland Road in the 1980's, he is no stranger to Yorkshire based clubs. Previously at the Leeds Rhinos reserves and in the Castleford Tigers academy Aston made a name for himself as a young impact centre/winger and was often considered to be the next big thing.

Aston was left disappointed last year managing to make only a handful of appearances through injuries and watching his side get relegated all in the same season, but Wilson is determined that this year will be a different story. "If the squad we have play to their full potential there is

nothing to stop us. Things haven't quite gone to plan all year but there is plenty of belief still in camp. Promotion is definitely still the big goal and we can hopefully keep up this good form into the playoffs."

The prospect of having promotion and relegation back in rugby league with full effects for all leagues gives plenty of potential for players to get that chance in a higher league. However as disappointed as Aston was to be released from the opportunity to go full time at the Leeds Rhinos, Wilson knows he made some mistakes but has no regrets and his happy with the Hawks.


Managing to balance his work and rugby life thanks to a supportive family, and working at a family based company Aston finds the semi professional life enjoyable. He also expresses his feelings on the club that welcomed him a year and a half ago. "I love playing at the club and feel really comfortable here. I know a lot of the supporters and it's special that my dad used to play here. It's reasonably local and the club are in a good place."

Focussing on staying off the injury list and on the team sheet Aston has struggled with staying regularly injury free for two seasons now, but taking inspiration from two of the big names at the club Wilson is ready to feature in the big games left. "I really look up to Marchy (David March) and Mauny (Danny Maun), their careers have been so successful and they are both really professional."

Aston is a strong and exciting player to watch, his opposition number are usually very aware of his presence and given space Wilson is often a big threat. A hard working centre with good ball handling skills the fans have their fingers crossed Aston is fit for the rest of the year and can have his shot to show what he has to offer. Match Report...

South Wales Scorpions 6 Hunslet Hawks 50

A trip to Mountain Ash, South Wales for the last league game of the season was the perfect setting for Eaton's boys to produce a 50-6 defeat over the Welsh side and secure themselves a second place finish in the table.

Gavin Duffy, who would go on to steal a total of 5 tries, was first on the board pushing over in the corner, it was a difficult kick for Ansell who put it just wide. Duckworth followed up with some much needed aggression throwing off opposition defence he fancied his chances reaching out over the whitewash but the try chalked off as the officials called him to be in touch. The opportunities were few and far between for the Hawks in the opening quarter with the Wales side giving as good as they got but when Watson took the ball cleanly on the restart and gave a neat pass out to Danny Maun that was the only encouragement he needed to sprint through the line and finish it off.

Watson was later denied a try because of a forward pass. Barry's side had managed to keep the Welsh side defending for the majority of the opening quarter but when Mike Grady's side had their share of the position they were eager to get some points on the board. Connor Farrer would have been clean away from half back if James Coyle had not have produced a scrambling tackle to stop him. When Stenchion knocked the ball awkwardly just metres from the Scorpions line Emanuelli capitalised kicking it through for himself to get a hand to touch down. At 8-6 things could go either way at the break. Stenchion was keen to make up for the earlier error and wasted no time powering over the line to push the Hawks another try in

Duffy kicked things off in similar fashion as he had opened in the first half, pouncing on an accurately placed Tom Coyle kick to score in the corner Storming into the final 49 minutes Jimmy Watson was the last pair of hands on the ball as it travelled across the field the fullback darted through the defenders and buried over the line for a try moments

later. When Michael Haley latched onto a pass and charged over there seemed no way back for the home side, but this did not cool the Hawks onslaught. Another setback came for the Scorpions as winger Lee Brickwood sprinted down the touchline to steal one for himself. The defence was also impressive noticeably Aaron Lyons and John Oakes who forced a drop goal on 60 minutes from a turnover relieving any pressure the side would face. Keen to finish in style Gavin Duffy ran in another 3 tries and Coyle managed to fix up the goals and finish the game up at

A score line that did not quite reflect the efforts of the home side in the first half but an almost flawless second half gave the Hawks the victory they deserved. A difficult run faces the boys now and a home fixture against Oldham kicks it all off on Friday night hope to see you all there as we get ready for the promotion push.



We caught up with season ticket

holder Simon Hirst who was representing the club as a flag bearer at the challenge cup final at Wembley.
Saturday 23.08.14
The big day is here! I got up at 7 am and put on my Hawks kit with pride, then made sure I had all my photo ID and other

information that I needed for the flag parade and access to Wembley stadium. I headed down for a full English breakfast in the Hotel restaurant. Once we had eaten, we then got on the tube as I had to be at the stadium for 10:30am.

Whilst walking up Wembley way (at around 9:30ish) I was surprised to see many fans milling around at that time, it was good to see as the atmosphere was building up nicely. Once I reached the stadium, I signed in, got my access badge and went into a room, under the stand where the Castleford supporters would be sitting, with the other flag bearers, where we had a briefing on the day ahead and what would be required of us. Once we had a briefing we had 2 pitch rehearsals and then a quick drink and bite to eat. Just doing the rehearsal gave me goose bumps, so imagine what it would be like walking out in front of 77,000 people a bit later on. I even took a Selfie on my mobile phone! After the rehearsal and a debrief I went pitch side with a couple of other flag bearers to watch the School boy final and to see the stadium starting to fill up, which got us all excited.

Around 1:45 we had to go back to the room to get ready for the parade. Then at around 2:30 pm we lined underneath the tunnel stand ready to walk out for 2:45pm. Whilst waiting, Ben Thaler and Steve Ganson walked past us to a sound of boos and jeers, can't think why? I was excited and nervous as I could see and hear the crowd.

2:45 we walked out and was hit by a sound of 77,000 supporters cheering, it was unbelievable. Once the parade was finished we took up our respective positions, waiting for the 2 teams to come out for kick off. and I was stood behind the try line, near the corner flag at the Leeds Rhinos end. To my left Pat, Ben and the rest of the Benatmane family were cheering and waving with their Hunslet flag which brought a lump to my throat. Once the teams came out we stayed on the pitch, we sang abide with me and the national anthem, which was emotional, as it made me think of my granddad who I was close to, and always watched the challenge cup final.

Once the formalities were over, we marched off the pitch, handed the flags back and sat in our seats to watch the game. The game for me was very entertaining, with Leeds deserving there victory. After the game we headed back to the hotel to freshen up for the evening. We went for another meal and did the tourist thing by walking round Piccadilly and went past the Houses of Parliament and the London Eye. "Thank you Hunslet Hawks for allowing me to represent the club, it meant the world, and hope I did this great club proud."

It didn't seem like a Super League ground at all and yet we'd been kept out because of our ground. Yet look what Batley have done with their ground - it's retained its character whilst making improvements. On a sunny day, you can't beat getting there early and eating chips at the picnic benches. It's got a Welcome Home feel about it.

Do you remember the Plate Final at the old Wembley? It was my first visit there and it was another place which looked good on tv but was pretty awful in real life. We sat on benches like at school and when you went to the ladies' toilet there was a window behind you as you sat down with a staircase to the upper tiers so everyone could look in and see your bum.

Fastest wee I ever did!

Bramley was another ground we shared. Now it's gone the way of Wigan's old place and become housing and shops and Bramley have moved to Rodley Rockets. In this year's Challenge Cup, walking up to Wigan's ground was like walking to work at a factory: it seemed to be in the middle of nowhere and lacking character. But our fans brought along some spirit and enlivened the harsh metal beams and plastic seats.

Yep, it's people who make the grounds great, with their banter, their friendliness, their passion. It sinks into the woodwork – takes a bit longer to sink into steel girders, that's all. Oh yes, and clean toilets too.
