Welcome everyone for our semifinal playoff game against Oldham.



Haynes has had to battle for his shirt though this season, with Ben Reynolds initially keeping him out of the side.







Knights In The Community...

Well.... What a year, what a past 25 years and what a great way to end our time at Huntington Stadium last time out. May I just congratulate everyone that has been involved with this years success, sponsors, fans, players, staff, volunteers and coaches. Lets hope the team get what they deserve, come the 5th October

Over the School holidays we regularly ran some free rugby sessions in parks across the city including: Rawcliffe, Hull Road. Rowntrees and Westbank Park. This saw hundreds of children take part in tag rugby games and activities, some who had never played tag rugby before, and others who were there just to improve their skills and were regular players at one of the community clubs across the city.



The sessions ran for two hours and were a simple turn up and play option for kids during the school holidays and proved very successful with a number of the children attending York City Knights games as well as starting to play rugby at their local community club.

We have just started a new school term, which in turn brings new projects, and new school visits. One of the current projects we are running, thanks to a partnership with DE Ford Insurance, is the ever popular Read to Achieve, where children spend 2 hours a week with a mentor, from the York City Knights, guiding them through the process of organising a school sports tournament, which will take place at their school.

The project is geared towards enhancing the reading and writing ability of the children taking part, in an innovative way, as well as the children becoming more confident in the work that they do. The children, currently at Hob Moor School, are planning on running a football tournament in November.

The great thing about this project is that the children actually see what their work does, with the successful running of a sports tournament at the end of the project. The children ao through the process of writing letters. creating e-mails and welcome packs for the schools, as well as contacting potential sponsors using the telephone too, so they are learning a whole number of different skills needed in secondary school and beyond.



So, it's the playoff's and the 'Loser Gets Another Go' game.


For the winners, it's straight to the final at Leeds Carnegie (
Headingley) on Sunday October
5th.

Oldham came through their qualifying match at Hunslet, taking control after the Hawks had established a twelve point lead with a solid, if unspectacular opening half hour. A converted try and Josh Crowley's all important drop goal on the break were a portent of what was to come as Scott Naylor's men cut loose after the interval to record eighteen unanswered points with full back Steve Nield driving great holes off the back off Hunslet's poor kicking game and Kenny Hughes directing the likes of Michael Ward and Phil Joy to soften up the opposing defence

Dave March inspired Hunslet into a late charge but Oldham hung on by a single point to claim their trip to the HS today.

Steven Nield has the ability to play centre, on the wing or his position of late, full back and is able to strike deep into the heart of opposing defences with an eye for an opening, two great feet and a tremendous turn of pace. Nield spent two seasons in the reserves before being elevated to the senior squad and was top try scorer in the under-23s last season. He played at Saddleworth Rangers as a junior before signing for St Helens when he was 15. He was at Saints for four years before joining Roughyeds reserves in the hope of winning a pro contract. He is also considered to be a good goal

On the wing is the division's top try scorer, Dale Bloomfield, whose current league season total is twenty up to now. His pro career started at Widnes Vikings before a move to St Helens, then he spent three years at Rochdale where he scored a total of 30 tries in two



seasons and was selected in Championship One Team of the Year in 2011. He is also in his second year with Scott Naylor's side, having scored 11 tries in 23 games last season, missing only one. Given any space at all this try poacher extraordinaire will be on the scoresheet again this afternoon.

Oldham possess a superb second row pairing of tough, uncompromising battlers who make a tremendous contribution to the overall team effort. Danny Langtree came through the excellent St Helens academy setup and then spent two seasons in the Oldham reserve team and grabbing a first-team chance with



both hands at back end of 2012 season. Mainstay of reserves' pack that reached two sucessive grand finals in 2011 and 2012, Danny scored ten tries in 23 first-team games in 2013.

The other aforementioned second rower is Josh Crowley will be



making his 38th consecutive appearance today in an Oldham shirt. Josh made his way into the game with Warrington and then had three years at Widnes before becoming Scott Naylor's first signing for Oldham ahead of the 2013 season. He is a tremendously strong-running forward who was an ever-present in his first season with a maximum 24 appearances. Josh has also won more man-of-the-match awards than any other Oldham player.

23 year old Phil Joy plays at prop forward and is very much the local lad, playing his amateur rugby league with Waterhead. A product of the Oldham development system, he gained two reserve team player awards in 2012, won his first senior contract for 2013 and carried off the coach's player-of-the-year award in his first season at that level. Off the field Phil got a BSc Joint Honours degree in maths and economics at Leeds and now studying for a masters. The proverbial 'big unit', he will look to dominate upfront in the opening 20 minutes and set a platform for his side to rack the points up.

28 year old Steven Roper will be one of Scott Naylor's pivotal players this afternoon, directing operations on Oldham's potent left side of attack and using his accurate kicking game to turn the opposition around. A relative newcomer to Whitebank, Steve arrived in early May this year on loan from Rochdale Hornets. He made his Roughyeds debut in the 30-22 win at Gloucester and can play in either half-back spot or hooker. Steven is a vastly experienced player, having spent six seasons at Rochdale. And was previously with Workington and is a very adept kicker of goals.



A New Era!

I've found myself in a rather exclusive club these past 12 months; a small collective of individuals within the rugby league press who have been consistently supportive of and enthusiastic about the RFL's radical plans to restructure the league pyramid.

From the very beginning, while others were quick to brand it 'contrived' and 'over-complicated', the '12s and 8s' plan appeared to me to be a very reasonable compromise between the interests of two diametrically opposed 'factions' within the sport.

There are those who feel licensing was working and, not only that, that it was the very best way to nurture young talent. On the other hand, others saw it as a betrayal of the British sporting culture and a means of protecting the 'elite' and keeping the clubs currently below Super League out of their 'closed shop'.

In coming up with '12s and 8s', Red Hall sought to make both camps happy and while (depressingly but predictably) that failed, it does now at least appear that there is a growing acceptance of the system.

I raise the matter of my early support for what will be known as the 'Super 8s' not to blow my own trumpet or make any claims to being first on the bandwagon should it turn out to be a spectacular success (although I reserve the right to do so!), but to highlight my personal taste for innovation prior to making this statement... Bonus points are a terrible idea.

Not in the Championships, you understand. I think a single point as consolation for a narrow defeat is a perfectly acceptable way of motivating part-time players to keep going once a game is realistically lost. Whether they need that motivation is an entire debate in itself, but while I may not personally have introduced bonus points for the lower leagues I was not passionately against it. However, such a system has no place in top level sport. You win or you lose, and that's it. Sometimes it isn't fair but sport isn't about

fair. It's about competition. It's about winners and losers. It's about the joy of victory and the despair of failure – a despair that would only be cheapened by the 'reward' of a losing bonus. Top level sport needs to be ruthless because ruthlessness is compelling.

That's a fact recognised by the RFL in other facets of the league structure. The play-offs, for

instance, are hardly fair on the team finishing top but they are great to watch. Similarly, there'll be little consolation for the team that loses the new 'million pound game' – and that's what is so compelling about it.

There's also the so-awful-itdoesn't-bear-thinking-about scenario in which, come the final round of the regular season, one team who needs three points to finish in the top eight (or the top four of the Championship) has a match against another that needs only a bonus point to do the same and we end up with rugby league's very own version of the 'Disgrace of Gijon', when West Germany and Austria 'came to an arrangement' at the 1982 FIFA World Cup, Highly unlikely, I know, but possible nevertheless.

The naysayers already have enough ammunition to fire at you with should they wish and should next season not go quite as well as you all planned. It might be wise not to give them any more.




View From The Stands...


We need to match that enthusiasm and aggression today, we have consistently been the strongest




