














WHAT THE CHAIRMAN HAS TO SAY

IT has been a long time since I was as happy with a defeat as I was last week after we narrowly lost at Featherstone.

The team's effort, determination and commitment were exceptional, given the dreadful conditions and the quality of our opponents.

Featherstone are one of the division's big spenders and as they finished in the top four last season it was very pleasing to come away

disappointed, if that makes sense.

It was also good to compare what happened last Sunday with what happened when we played there last season.

Last season we paid them far too much respect and we didn't get into the game until they had scored 12 points or so, whereas last Sunday we got stuck into the match right from the start and we didn't allow the quality of our performance to drop throughout the 80 minutes.

What's more, we didn't deserve to come away empty-handed.

I have spoken previously about the quality we have added to the squad this season and the two performances so far have proved that.

corresponding fixture last season here at Bower Fold. It was our first game at this level and although we had a lot of possession and Broncos had to drop out from under the posts at least four times we couldn't get over the line.

Personally, I think we are a different proposition this season so it will be interesting to see how we fare against them this time round.

Next week we go to another fulltime team in Hull KR, who are everybody's favourites to get promoted. We did quite well on our last trip over there so let's hope for more of the same!

The opening fixtures have demonstrated just how hard the division is and have underlined also how much we want to be in it. We want to improve year on year, both on and off the pitch, and if you are in the ground today and you are reading this, then you are one of the club's disciples.

Please tell as many people as you can about the fantastic performances the team puts in as we seek to grow our attendances so that everybody connected with the club can then benefit.

Support so far has really encouraged the lads, so please keep it up.

ONCE, TWICE, THREE TIMES LEPORI

'LIPPY' is 'home', back for a third time, and after watching the boys blitz Sheffield Eagles in the second half to win 26-10 he expressed the view that it might be difficult to get back into the team

He's not ready to mount a challenge yet, but by early March he should be starting to apply some pressure, having completed his commitments with Sedgley Tigers RUFC and having finished his short spell of intense physical training to get him back up to speed.

At the end of last season, when new contracts were on offer, Richard Lepori decided to take a step back from the game and to take up his studies again, this time in Chester, to work for a master's degree in the sociology of sport and exercise.

In the five months or so since then, 'Lippy's' life has turned full circle. He is still on with his studies, in a part-time capacity, but he's been playing the 15-a-side game, he has relocated from Chorley to city-centre Manchester and he has taken up a new post as a sports lecturer at Tameside College.

"I'm back," said the 25-year-old Italy international."... Back to where I was always going to be if I returned to rugby league. There was interest from other clubs, but I was never going to go anywhere else."

He added: "I'm ready to get back into rugby league now and I'm looking forward to picking up the pieces again at Oldham. I've always been happy there; always played my best rugby there, "I've been with Scott, 'Spanner' and Peter (head coach Scott Naylor and his assistants Lee Spencer and Peter Carey) since I was a youngster at Salford. They always get the best out of me. They're like father figures.

"It will be a big achievement if we can finish higher in the

Championship than we did last year, but we've signed some good new players and I think we'll go well, especially when we get some of the injured lads back in the side."

He helped Italy to qualify for the World Cup, to be held later this year in Australia and New Zealand, and he is hoping to have a big season at Oldham to enhance his chances of a trip Down Under, playing with and against some of the biggest names in the sport. In his two previous spells at Oldham, going back to 2013, he has scored a total of 19 tries in 53 games.

Said Scott: "We told 'Lippy' at the end of last season that if he ever wanted to come back we would welcome him with open arms. "We found out that he was willing to talk about things again and Chris (club chairman Chris Hamilton) moved very quickly to get the deal done.

"We are delighted. He's a quality player and a quality lad, who will make our back line so much stronger. "We like to start each season by leaving room in the squad for quality additions, and we did look a bit light in the friendlies when we picked up a few injuries.

"But with Richard back; Keiran Gill and Tuoyo Egodo having joined us on loan from Castleford; and some of the injured lads getting ready to return we look a lot stronger."


Oldham Rugby League Heritage Trust

BIRTHDAY BOY'S BIG WEEKEND!



TUOYO Egodo is relishing the idea of mixing it with the big boys in his first season of Championship rugby.

If he plays on Sunday it will be a massive occasion for the young Londoner, who spent four years at London Broncos before moving north to sign a full-time contract for Castleford Tigers and then coming to Oldham on loan to aid his development.

He celebrated his 20th birthday this week.

Tuoyo was born in Hackney, of Nigerian parents, and grew up in Tottenham, not far from White Hart Lane. Dreaming of soccer stardom, he was at Spurs as a kid, but was released when he was 12.

To this day, he's still a "massive" Spurs fan, but his sporting ambitions lie in a different direction.

With his 13-year-old boy at a sporting crossroads, Tuoyo's dad suggested he should try the 'rugby club just up the road'; better known to us as London Skolars.

Tuoyo thus joined the junior section associated with Skolars; was soon picked for North London Boys against South London Boys; and was ultimately scouted by the Broncos, whom he joined when he was 15.



Said Tuoyo: "I was living at the family home but last year I felt it was time for me to seek some independence, so I asked my agent to look for another club and Castleford immediately showed interest

"It was a life-changing decision to move to Yorkshire because I gave up a bank job in the City and left home for the first time.

"I don't drive and the first few weeks were tough, but I've settled in now; I've got to know the Cas lads; and when I was put in touch with a barber in Leeds guess who it was --- Jamel Chisholm, would you believe!

"I know Scott Leatherbarrow from Broncos and after four months in the north I prefer it up here

now. The people are more friendly."

He couldn't have had a tougher start than going head to head with Menzie Yere in the Sheffield game.

Added Tuoyo: "Menzie's a juke box! He smashed me a few times, but I gave him a bit back and that's what I wanted -- to be playing against tough men who have been in the game for a long time.

"I've lost weight at Cas -- down from 101k to 94k --- and I prefer centre to wing because you get more ball and a greater chance to use your feet, which is what I like doing."





BIG DAY FOR LEATHERBARROW



SCOTT Leatherbarrow played 17 times last year for a London Broncos side that finished second to Leigh Centurions in the regular Championship season and then took Salford Red Devils to the wire for the right to play in the Million Pound Game.

A Wiganer, he later moved back north to become a Roughyed on a two-year deal --- and on Sunday he faces the prospect of going head to head with his former team, shouldering heavy responsibility as our chief play-maker, main tactical kicker, vice-captain and goalkicker.





RH: How's life treating you back in the north?

SL: All good. Loving it. Georgia and I are back in Wigan and ten weeks ago
Georgia presented us with baby
Autumn, who's keeping us both busy.
I've got my old job back, teaching PE at a primary school in Haydock, so things couldn't be much better.

RH: And how are you finding it as an Oldham player?

SL: Great. We're a closely-knit bunch, training and coaching are good and we showed what we're capable of when beating Sheffield Eagles in our last home game and then taking Featherstone down to the wire at The Big Fellas Stadium.

RH: Will it be a special occasion for you today?

SL: I suppose it will in a way. It's my first game against my former club, where I made a lot of friends. I'm looking forward to it. I hope we can perform well.

RH: Have you supplied Scott Naylor with any inside tips?

SL: I've mentioned one or two bits but, of course, they might have changed things around this year. And it works both ways; they know all about me as

well.

RH: Is there much of a difference between full-time and part-time?

SL: Yes and no. The actual training is very similar, not much difference at all. But full-timers get a lot more time for recovery, rehab and things like that. There are other perks too. As part-timers we have to cram everything into three sessions a week.

RH: Finally, your thoughts on today's game?

SL: Broncos will be looking for another good season and getting up to Super League. We know it's going to be tough, but if we play anything like we can we can compete with them and then see where we go from there. Regardless of the result, if we put in a good performance we'll know we can compete with the top teams and that will stand us in good stead for the rest of the year.

A product of Wigan St Pat's, Scott spent his formative years with Wigan Warriors and Warrington Wolves, followed by a season at Keighley Cougars, two at Batley Bulldogs and then this year as a full-time pro in the capital. A goalkicker, he has played 102 senior games, scoring more than 500 points.

In his two seasons at Batley, he

amassed 315 points in 54 games and caught the eye of London's Aussie boss Andrew Henderson, who lured him to the bright lights down south on a full-time contract for the 2016 season.

When he left for pastures new,
Henderson said: "Scotty leaves us with our very best wishes. In leading the side around the park, he will do a big iob at Oldham.

"He's at the stage of his career where he needs to be a starting half-back every week, shouldering the responsibility that goes with it, and I couldn't guarantee him that because we have a few good half-backs here. "Also, he wants to head home for family reasons so the move will be good for him and good for Oldham.

"He was a good player when he came from Batley -- I saw a lot of potential in him -- and he's even better now, and a better person too, having worked in a full-time environment with myself and my staff and playing alongside other full-time players."

Scott said at the time: "The capital was okay, but I'm a Wigan lad and there's no place like home. We finally made up our mind when Georgia became pregnant. We wanted to be back with family. "I was looking for a Championship club in Lancashire and when Oldham came in for me I knew right away it was the club for me.

It was the narrowest of margins that prevented London Broncos from claiming a place in the 2016 million pound game. Salford benefitted from a superior points difference and were able to travel to the East Coast to face Hull KR in that jaw dropping end-of-season finale.

Relegated in that game, Hull KR are widely predicted to be the Londoners main rivals for the Championship Leaders trophy this year and both clubs will be keen to progress even further and return to Super League.

Last week in round two, Hull KR travelled to the Broncos home at Trailfinders in West London for the first of their 2017 encounters. The home side took an early lead but the visitors mananged to gain the initiative before half-time and led 16-6 at the interval.

The second period saw tries scored by both sides and although KR never relinquished their advantage, London would not lie down and be beaten; they remained in contention until the closing moments of the game. The match concludet at 28-22 to Rovers and the close result will add spice to the next meeting of the two big guns later in the season.

Broncos head coach Andrew Henderson has recruited well in the Winter. Jarrod Sammut, Jay Pitts and former on-loan Roughyed Tom Spencer have joined his squad together with Hackney born Kieron Dixon who returns for his second spell at the club. They join players with the calibre of hooker James Cunningham who was named Kingstone Press Championship Young Player of the Year for 2016.

Oldham suffered a double loss to the Broncos last season, losing 22-0 at Bower Fold in round 1 before falling to a 56-16 defeat in round 18. Both clubs will be hoping to add to their points tally this afternoon, each having one win and one loss under their belts. The two sets of players will be smarting from close defeats last weekend and should be fired up to put things back on track. We should be in for a thrilling encounter.
