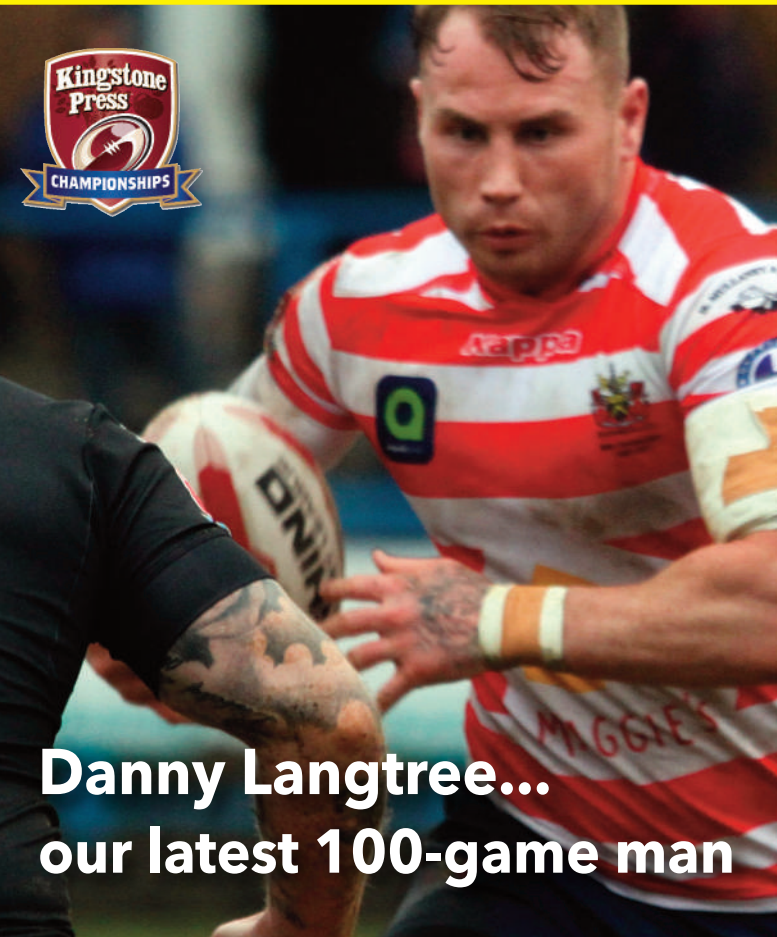

'LIPPY' is home, back for a third time, and after watching the boys blitz Sheffield Eagles in the second half to win 26-10 he expressed the view that it might be difficult to get back into the team.

Having completed his commitments with Sedgley Tigers RUFC and having finished his short spell of intense physical training to get back up to speed for Championship rugby league, he's now ready to mount a challenge.

At the end of last season, when new contracts were on offer, Lippy decided to take a step back from the game and to take up his studies again, this time at Chester, to work for a master's degree in the sociology of sport and exercise.

In the five months or so since then his life has turned full circle. He is still on with his studies, in a part-time capacity, but he's been playing the 15-a-side game, while relocating from Chorley to city-centre Manchester and taking up a

new post as a lecturer in sport at Tameside College.

Said the 25-year-old Italy international: "I'm back . . . back to where I was always going to be if I returned to rugby league. There was interest from other clubs, but I was never going to go anywhere else.

"I'm itching to get back into rugby league now and I'm looking forward to picking up the pieces again with Oldham. I've always been happy here and I've always played my best rugby here.

"I've been with Scott, 'Spanner' and Peter (head coach Scott Naylor and his assistants Lee Spencer and Peter Carey) since I was a youngster at Salford. They always get the best out of me. They're like father figures."

He added: "It will be a big achievement if we finish higher in the Championship than we did last year, but we've signed some good new players and I think we'll go well, especially when we get some of the injured lads back in the side."



Lepori helped Italy to qualify for the World Cup, to be held in Australia and New Zealand later in the year, and he is hoping to have a big season at Bower Fold to enhance his chances of a trip Down Under, playing with and against some of the best players on the planet.

Said head coach Scott: "We told Lippy at the end of last season that if he ever wanted to come back we would welcome him with open arms.

"When we found out he was interested Chris (chairman Chris Hamilton) moved very quickly to get the deal done.

"Lippy is a quality player and a quality lad who will make our back line so much stronger."

HAYDOCK HERE IN CHALLENGE CUP

HAYDOCK, from St Helens, the only community club still left in the competition, will be our fourth-round opponents in the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup when they come to Bower Fold over the weekend of March 18/ 19.

They've been giant-killing all the way, knocking out National Conference premier division side Wath Brow Hornets in Cumbria; then BARLA National Cup holders Thornhill Trojans (Dewsbury) at home; and then Wests Warriors, pride of London and Harry Jepson Trophy winners, in round three at the home of London Skolars.



Current champions of the North-West Men's League, they have already made Challenge Cup history by becoming the first team from the eighth tier of the sport to reach the fourth round.

Describing their cup exploits so far as a "fantastic achievement", Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton said: "Congratulations to them. What they've done up to now is fantastic. That in itself means we have to be on our guard."

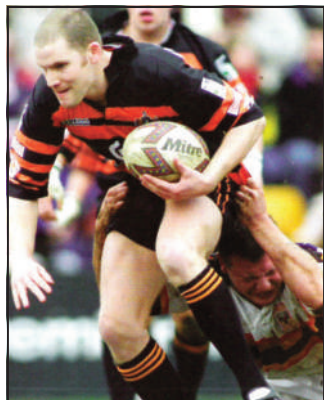

OUR VISITORS - DEWSBURY RAMS

Dewsbury Rams have made an inauspicious start to the 2017 campaign and arrive at Bower Fold still seeking their first points of the season.

A large injury list has hindered the efforts of coach Glenn Morrison's team with key players such as star full-back Josh Guzdek and forwards Luke Adamson, Tony Tonks and Jack Teanby missing from the ranks.

Pre-season signings Lucas Walshaw and Hamish Barnes have bolstered the squad to replace players leaving the club in 2016. Dalton Grant, Shane Grady and Joel Farrell have all moved on and the new-look side has struggled through the opening games of the year.

The Rams have a dual-registration facility with Wakefield Trinity, meaning that players such as Keegan Hirst and David Fifita have pulled-on the famous Dewsbury colours in the opening encounters. Recent signings Alex Brown from Batley and month-long loan signing Daniel

Igbinedion from Castleford should add to the Rams' firepower.

Liam Coe, another new man, was formerly on the books of Bradford Bulls and has arrived from amateur club West Bowling; the half-back enjoyed a spell with Hemel Stags in pre-season.

Last-time out, Dewsbury faced London Broncos at the Tetley's stadium.

Poor conditions and a swirling wind prevented the match from being a classic but Dewsbury were able to put on an improved display.

Igbinedion and Coe made eye-catching debuts as did the sole Wakefield DR representative, Chris Annakin, who played a forceful game at loose-forward. The game finished 6-20 to London with Jarrod Sammut, no stranger to Oldham fans, weaving his magic throughout.

Worryingly for coach Morrison, forward Toby Adamson, brother of the already sidelined Luke, dislocated an elbow and scrum-half Andy Kain limped off mid-game without making a return. Morrison

will hope both can make swift returns to the side.

Dewsbury will want to kick-start their season with a victory at Bower Fold, a ground where they were comprehensively beaten last year.

They'll face an Oldham team looking to bounce back from a big defeat at Hull KR. Losing will not be an option for either side.

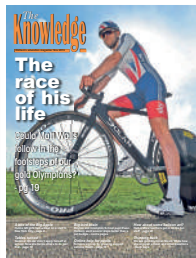
