HAYDOCK... WILL BE BUSTING A GUT TO PULL OFF A MASSIVE SHOCK

OUR results against amateur teams in the modern era stand up to the closest possible scrutiny

Exactly one year ago this weekend we were here at Bower Fold in a Ladbrokes Challenge Cup fourth-round tie against crack Cumbrian outfit Kells, against whom winger Jamel Chisholm scored two of our eight tries.

We won 40-6 to set up that never-to-be-forgotten fifth-round spectacular at Hull KR.

Our 36-22 triumph against a then Super League outfit on their own ground ranked as one of the biggest Challenge Cup upsets of all time.

Those fans who made the trip to the eastern extremities of Kingston-Upon-Hull will never forget that day or the tries we scored by Richard Lepori (2), Will Hope, Steve Roper, Adam Clay and Gary Middlehurst.

For Roughyeds the boot is on the other foot from last year and while we have never been beaten by amateur opposition since the formation of Oldham RLFC (1997) Ltd, that 100 per cent record will count for nothing when the teams walk out today in front of the BBC cameras.

We have played and beaten amateur teams (or community clubs as they are now called) 18 times in the past 20 years, starting with Heworth of York, whom we beat 36-14 at Boundary Park in 1998.

There have been a few memorable ties along the way, like the fight that Castleford Panthers put up before going down 16-8 at Boundary Park in 2004; like our 56-10 win against the British Army at Aldershot in 2008 which led to our signing of the Army's Fijian winger Ben Seru; like our 80-6 romp against Welsh side Blackwood Bulldogs at Sedgley Park in 2010, which provided Roughyeds with their highest-ever score.

But one of our current players will have good reason to recall our two wins against Sharlston Rovers -- in 2004 at Boundary Park and in 2005 at Post Office Road, as the Featherstone Rovers ground was then called.

Danny Grimshaw still lives in the former pit village to this day and back then he played at half-back for his local side against Oldham before turning pro in a career that has seen him reach 150 senior games.

It remains to be seen whether there are any up-and-coming Grimshaws in the Haydock team today, but you can be sure of one thing . . . the lads from up the East Lancs Road will be busting a gut to spoil our excellent record at this stage of the Challenge Cup.

FOUNDING FATHERS...

ONE of the three men who got together to form the Haydock club in 1979 is still there, pulling the strings as club secretary.

Frank Bradshaw has been at the club's coal face since day one, but he's seen nothing to compare with the meteoric strides the team has taken in the past 12 months.

Eric Smith, another founding member, died last year, while the third pioneer,

Robert Berry, is still connected, helping out whenever and wherever he can, although he is also a keen Wigan Warriors fan.

"We were all local chaps and, knowing how much rugby league interest there was in the village, we decided to roll up our sleeves and get a team going.

"It's been a long, hard slog and it was a major setback when we lost Eric.

"But we've got some cracking

lads; a great coach in Chris (Smith); a good backroom team; and the structure to steadily move up the ladder.

"We've a senior committee of six plus a separate junior committee of five who look after the cubs (under-5s) and the other age-group teams at under 7, 8, 11 and 13.

"We play on a council pitch and we have a good relationship with the local community centre. We are very much at the centre of Haydock life."



Despite a second-half sin-binning for Haydock's Scott Johnson, Thornhill only managed to improve their score with a solitary try which was cancelled out by a Danny Gee match-clinching four-pointer with only nine minutes left on the clock.

Round three was conducted by Super League players Stefan Ratchford and Ryan Brierley who paired Haydock with Chiswick based Wests Warriors, the London Men's League champions. Warriors had progressed from round two in impressive style at Featherstone Lions, stunning the West Yorkshire team 10-26.

Unfazed by the draw, a large travelling group of Haydock


fans made their way to the tie, held at New River Stadium in the capital, home of London Skolars.

Haydock withstood some early heavy-bombardment from Wests but held firm and were first on the scoresheet following a Mike Sexton try. From that point on Haydock were always in front. As the game unfolded Haydock had to contend with on-field flare-ups, running out of substitutes and coping with 15 second-half penalties against them.

Despite the adversity, Haydock managed to dig deep and pull off a cracking 12-26 victory and ultimately set-up today's fixture.

Oldham now stand in the way of a potential Haydock game against a Super League side in round five. Roughyeds, last year's cup-shock side, will not want to suffer a reversal of fortunes and so today's encounter should be a thriller.

HAYDOCK coach Chris Smith, in his fifth year with the 'Yickers', had a Super League playing career spanning 120 games with Castleford Tigers (37), St Helens (71) and Hull FC (12) between 1996 and 2002.

His 41 tries as a winger --- one every three games on average -- wasn't bad, either.

His playing days ended with York City Knights and then York amateurs Heworth, where he was player-coach.

Now aged 41, and loving every minute of his time with the 'Yickers', Smith led his Haydock lads to championship success in the North-West Men's League last year and has masterminded this year's phenomenal march through the first three rounds of the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup.

He would have preferred a League 1 side to Oldham in round four, but whatever happens here at Bower Fold today he knows his men will give of their very best.

At the time of writing, they had gone ten games without defeat, stretching back to last season, and had stunned the entire community arm of the sport with wins against Wath Brown Hornets, Thornhill Trojans and Wests Warriors of London in the Challenge

Cup. Smith told the specialist website Love Rugby League: "It was great to win in London because Haydock is a small community and it's all about rugby league.

"About 120 fans went down to support us and it was great to share the victory with them. It was a very special day.

"We are making history (Haydock are the first side from tier eight to reach this stage of the Challenge Cup) and nothing or nobody can take that away from us.

"I was nervous before the game for everybody connected with the club, but it was a great feeling when we had won and to see how much it meant to the fans."

Smith hopes Haydock's success in the past 12 months will now rub off on the local council.

He added: "There are about 12 clubs in the St Helens area and we seem to be overlooked. We're not one of the big clubs like Thatcho Heath, Blackbrook or Pilks (Pilkingtons).

"Hopefully, this attention we're now getting will help with maybe a bit of funding from the council to help us to get a better ground and improved facilities."


