



OUR VISITORS -BATLEY BULLDOGS

One point separates
Oldham and our visitors
from West Yorkshire.

The importance of a win for either side will not be lost on respective coaches Scott Naylor and Matt Diskin.

Diskin, a replacement for the Wakefield-bound coach John Kear, knew he was taking over at a club confident of their Championship credentials. Batley finished a creditable third in the 2016 season and therefore qualified for a place in the middle-eights and a dream of achieving a Super League place for 2017. The Bulldogs managed one win out of seven games, against Championship rivals Featherstone Rovers who were to finish pointless in the end-of-season competition.

The close season saw new recruits such as Joel Farrell (Dewsbury), Macauley Hallett (Swinton) and Dane Manning (Halifax) arrive at the club. Going in the

opposite direction were Keegan Hirst who followed Kear to Wakefield whilst Chris Ulugia joined Featherstone Rovers.

Batley's 2017 season began in earnest, literally, at the Ernest Argeles stadium in Blagnac as they provided the opening day's opposition to new boys Toulouse Olympique. The game was lost to the French team but revenge was gained in Round 4 of the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup where a second trip across the channel rewarded Batley with a 34-16 victory.

Five wins have come from Batley's league campaign so far this season. Home victories over Halifax, Swinton, Rochdale and the Roughyeds show how tough it is for any team to visit the Fox's Biscuits Stadium. Away trips have not been so rewarding however and only a solitary win against Sheffield Eagles is recorded in the away W column.



Today's game is the last before this year's Summer Bash in Blackpool. The Bulldogs will travel to the seaside town to face arch rivals Dewsbury Rams on the Sunday. Avoiding a hat-trick of defeats against their close neighbours will be a top priority, having already been beaten in both league and cup this season at Dewsbury's Tetley's Stadium.

Batley are currently winless since April 9 and have lost four games in succession. Oldham will be keen to put right the heavy loss in the capital two weeks ago. A good old fashioned four pointer to look forward to then in the shadows of the huge Etihad Stadium. We should be in for an exciting afternoon's rugby.






THREE TO WATCH BATLEY BULLDOGS



Sam Smeaton




