

After the Swinton game, Pete said it was essential that the group of players continued to stick together as one, as we know they will.

Scott was free to head-up training this last week,

Said David: "Roary and I picked them up in Worsley. I didn't charge him as he kept his promise to give our lads a cheer.


"It's hard enough to explain what a Roughyed is to anybody let alone to a Frenchman in broken French."

LUKE TURNS BACK THE CLOCK TO YESTERYEAR

LUKE Adamson, our new forward from Dewsbury Rams, made his debut in the second-row at Summer Bash; kept his place against Swinton Lions; and is likely to make his first Bower Fold appearance today against league leaders Hull KR.

We have signed the 29-year-old former Salford and Halifax backrow man on a short-term deal to the end of the season.

He is one of the most experienced players in the Kingstone Press Championship.

Born in Lowton, near Leigh, Adamson played 112 Super League games for Salford and then had a brief spell with Bath RU Club before returning to League with Halifax, for whom he played 47 games in seasons 2013 and 2014.

He was in his third season at Dewsbury where he clocked up about 60 appearances before asking to be released from his contract last month after a 52-10 loss at Featherstone.

"Things weren't working out for me and I just felt it would be right for me and the club if I moved on after two and a half years there." said Adamson.

"Dewsbury's a great club and I enjoyed my time there. I was also grateful that they didn't want to stand in my way.

"After that things moved pretty quickly and I was really pleased to sign for Oldham where I know a lot of the lads, and the coaches, from my eight years at Salford, who signed me initially from Leigh East.

"I've worked previously for Scott (Naylor) and I played alongside George Tyson, Jack Spencer, Adam Neal, Adam Clay and Gareth 'Gaz' Owen when we were all at Salford as kids.

"I've played in the Championship a long time. It's a tough division and Oldham are doing well for a club that's only

in its second season at that level."

Naylor said: "Luke and I go back a long way. He has loads of experience, something we've perhaps been missing a little bit in our middle unit.

"He's a good pro who's played the game at a high level, and that's just what we've been looking for.

"He can play anywhere in the pack and he knows most members of the team, which will help him to settle in quickly."





LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON ...

OLDHAM have added to their squad by signing Batley Bulldogs' young prop Brad Hill, initially on a month's loan.

The son of former Bradford, Leeds and Halifax front-row man Brendan Hill, the 21-yearold Brad is joining Roughyeds to widen his experience of playing with and against men at Championship level.

Karl Harrison, his agent, was a key figure in brokering the deal which gives Scott Naylor another prop to compensate for the loss of the injured Phil Joy, who is waiting for an operation on the shoulder that he has twice dislocated this season.

Hill played for Bradford amateurs West Bowling as a boy and then passed through the Bradford Bulls academy ranks before moving on to the Bulldogs, where he is in his first season.

He trained for the first time at Oldham last week and made his debut at Swinton Lions on Sunday, although he didn't get much game time because hadn't played for about a month.

Said Brad: "It's always exciting to move to a new club and I'm looking forward to getting some game time.

"Everybody has made me feel very welcome."

Added Naylor: "Brad's a good, young prospect

who's been in Batley's 18-man squad a few times. We needed more numbers and this gives me another front-row man with prospects.


"We've got eight very important games to the end of the regular season and then another seven in the Shield so to all intents and purposes we're only half way through the season.

"We're going to need more numbers and the capture of Luke Adamson and, more recently, Brad Hill will be a big lift in that respect."

Our Visitors Hull Kingston Rovers

Championship leaders Rovers make their first visit to Bower Fold today and are sure to have a healthy support shouting them on.

One of the two famous Hull clubs, Rovers were relegated from Super League in the final game of the 2016 season. The winner takes all shootout known as the Million Pound Game saw Salford grab survival in the dying seconds of the match and consign the Robins to rugby league's second tier.

Tim Sheens, the wily Australian coach, prepared his side well for the 2017 season and they have wasted no time in cementing themselves at the top of the division. Only one defeat in 16 outings points to an almost certain place in the middle-eights and the club will have both eyes focussed on a swift return to the elite top division.

Last season saw Oldham travel to the KC Lightstream Stadium in the Challenge Cup where they were able to pull off one of the competition's all-time shock wins.

Inevitably, there was a small score to settle when Roughyeds made a 2017 league visit to the other end of the M62.



Rovers weren't going to be turned over twice on their own patch and readily dispatched Oldham 48-0.

In last week's game, round 16, Rovers visited the LD Nutrition Stadium to take on an in-form Featherstone Rovers. In front of a crowd of 4,072, Fev's highest of the season, the two teams battled out a humdinger of a game and the Flat Cappers led their illustrious visitors by 16-0 at half time.

The second half saw Rovers claw their way back to lead 18-20 after 71 minutes but a Kyle Briggs penalty levelled for Featherstone. A failed KR drop-goal attempt from Jamie Ellis in the final seconds meant the honours were shared at 20-20.

Hull KR will want to return to winning ways on their Super League return mission. They won't take Oldham for granted that's for sure and on the new Bower Fold surface we should be in for a cracking afternoon's rugby league.

Shaun Lunt

30yr old hooker from Cockermouth in Cumbria. Started his professional career at Castleford Tigers before moving on to Workington Town.

Lunt transferred to Huddersfield Giants in 2009 where he scored 71 tries in 123 appearances.

Loan spells with Leeds Rhinos and then Hull KR saw him make a permanent move to East Hull where he is currently enjoying his third season.



Ben Cockayne

Long serving member of the Hull KR squad, Pontefract born Cockayne was part of the team that gained promotion to Super League ten years ago.

Can operate anywhere in the Rovers' three-quarters or full-back positions and is a definite fans' favourite.

The player is in his second spell with KR having returned from Wakefield Trinity for the 2014 season.

Another Pontefract born player, Addy signed from Bradford Bulls where he started his professional career.

An accomplished goalkicker who can play in the key roles of hooker, loose-forward or half-back.

Unlucky 'Gilly' out for rest of season

THE best wishes of everybody at Oldham, from Chris, Scott, staff, players and supporters go out to Kieran Gill, who was injured in Castleford's win against St Helens last Sunday and will be out or the rest of the campaign.

The young centre, who was due to return to the Roughveds next week on loan from the Tigers, suffered a serious knee injury on his Super League debut on the right wing.

Gill (21) scored five tries in nine appearances for Roughveds this season, including his sensational last-gasp winner against Bradford Bulls in April.

The Betfred Super League leaders gave him his big chance in a side that beat Saints 16-12 without the services of key men like Luke Gale. Adam Milner.

Matt Cook, Michael Shenton, Zak Hardaker and Grant Millington.

He celebrated by scoring Castleford's first try in the corner after 34 minutes, but his Super League dream turned into a nightmare early in the second half when he went off with a badly-damaged knee.

He will have an operation in about three week's time to repair ruptured anterior and posterior cruciate ligaments.

Said Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton: "I've spoken to Kieran and, as you would expect, he's down in the dumps after being so upbeat to be given his debut at that level.

"He was due to come back to us next week but instead he has had

"He says that, as soon as he is able, he will be coming over to get behind the boys and give them his moral support."

Said Kieran: "It was an amazing experience to make my Super League debut, but I was very nervous before the start. Once the game started I was okay, but I felt my knee after my first real run after about five minutes.
