A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

WELCOME back to Bower Fold for the second instalment of this month's trilogy.

We have a lot going for us as a club and it saddens me sometimes that not enough people in Oldham recognise it. Certainly, people from other clubs do. A sign of the times I suppose.

There is nothing better than fighting for all you are worth when things are going against you either individually or as a club and, believe you me, we are kicking and screaming right now as we fight our way out of the present run of no wins in five.

I know I have mentioned this many times but the support from those of you who made the effort to be at the game last Sunday was outstanding, both in the level of noise generated and the way it carried on throughout the match.

We aren't far off and when we do get that next win you will all have played your part in it.

Scott is back in his usual role from today and that will also lift the lads.

OUR JOE IS A WORLD CUP HOPEFUL ...

ACCORDING to the Wales RL website, our prop Joe Burke is one of 32 contenders to represent their country in the 2017 World Cup, to be played out later this year in Australia and New Zealand.

The 32 includes nine forwards who are all billed as props --- Joe Burke (OLDHAM), Craig Kopczak (Salford), Matty Barron (Newcastle), Jake Emmitt (Toronto), Dan Fleming (Toronto), Anthony Walker (Wakefield), Izaak Duffy (South Wales), Morgan Evans (South Wales), Sam Hopkins (Leigh).

Kopczak has most caps, 19, and Joe is next with 11, two more than thirdplaced Barron of Thunder.

Newport-born Joe (27) has played in 14 of our 18 games this season in all competitions, scoring four tries, more than any other forward apart from Michael Ward, who has touched down five times. He made his Welsh debut in 2010 and with 11 caps to his name he is one of the Principality's most experienced forwards internationally.

Of his prospects of making the trip of a lifetime Down Under on World Cup duty, Joe said: "At the moment it's just a waiting game. Nobody knows.

"There's still a lot of rugby to be played in the domestic season and my only thoughts at present concern doing my best for Oldham. If, in the course of that, I can put myself up for Welsh selection again that would be great.

"Anything can happen. I'll just do what I've always done, which is to concentrate on my club rugby and anything else will take care of itself."

Joe's sharp support play enabled him to capitalise on Scott Leatherbarrow's early break against Hull KR last week and

register his fourth try of the season in a team performance that was the best for several weeks.

"We proved to ourselves that we could hack it with the top team in the competition," he said.

"We went back to basics, stopped making lots of mistakes and proved that we can play a lot better than we have been doing.

"We were less panicky; we stuck to the game plan; and we cut out the errors.

"Taking it one game at a time, the focus has to be on us - and what we do - rather than what our opponents might or might not do."

For season-ticket holders its only £10; for everyone else its £25, but that includes your admission to the game, whether you require a main-stand seat or you prefer to stand.



- **SWINTON:** The Lions are hoping to sign a Super League forward on loan.
- **OLDHAM:** Don't forget we're back here on Wednesday (8pm) in a rearranged game against Dewsbury Rams.

Our Visitors Halifax RLFC



Break-away league leaders Hull KR look certain to claim one of the available positions and therefore Halifax need to keep up with the chasing pack of Toulouse, London and Featherstone.

After 17 games played, the men from the MBi Shay sit in fifth place, only three points short of the leading pack. This leaves just six games of the regular season to make up the difference making each one a virtual cup-tie.

Halifax last appeared in the middle-eights in 2015 after finishing fourth over the first 23 games. Despite being the lowest ranked team in the competition, and part time, they beat promotion favourites Leigh and Sheffield Eagles to finish 6th out of 8 securing improved central funding for 2016.

The conclusion of the 2016 season saw the departure of forwards Dane Manning and Sam Smeaton to Batley Bulldogs but the return of winger Rob Worrincy from Sheffield Eagles gave the squad a welcome boost.

Oldham and Halifax last met on Easter Monday this year. The evening tie over in Yorkshire was a close-run affair finishing 16-14 to hosts. Leading 6-0 at half-time, Halifax extended their lead to 14-0 before Oldham launched a spirited comeback and could have taken the spoils in the final minute but for a disallowed Adam Clay try.

In last week's game. Halifax handed out a 54-0 ten try beating to Sheffield Eagles at Wakefield's Beaumont Legal Stadium, Coming off the back of consecutive defeats to Toulouse and London, a close game was expected but the Eagles had no answer to Richard Marshall's young team. Hat-trick hero Conor McGrath and man-of-thematch James Woodburn-Hall were the stand-out players.

Oldham failed to take points off Halifax in 2016, playing them three times over the 30 game season. The points on offer today are vital to both sides and with each putting in great performances last Sunday, an exciting game should play-out here at Bower Fold.

Scott Murrell

Son of former Leeds full-back Bryan Murrell, the Halifax half-back began his playing career at Leeds.

A 2006 move to Hull Kingston Rovers saw him score 240 points for the Robins in 178 appearances.

Moved to Halifax in 2013 and is the current club captain.



Rob Worrincy

Vastly experienced winger who can name Castleford Tigers and Sheffield Eagles as former clubs.

A prolific try scorer, the player returned to Fax at the start of this season and has been a regular in the side.



Jacob Fairbank

Halifax born and the nephew of the former Bradford player Karl Fairbank.

A prop or second-rower, Jacob came through the Huddersfield Giants youth system.

Loan spells at several clubs have added to the players experience, including a game for Oldham in our 2015 promotion year.
