A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

GOOD afternoon and welcome back to Bower Fold.

Today we welcome, for the first time ever in the league, a French side in the shape of Toulouse Olympique.

We were given a big welcome when we went over to France earlier this year and we hope to reciprocate that hospitality this afternoon.

While Toulouse are enjoying a fine season, back in the Championship this time around, our own

fortunes are going in the opposite direction.

We are in a desperate run of poor form and, as is usually the case, nothing seems to be going right with us picking up more than our fair share of injuries in the last three matches.

Myself and the coaching staff have had long conversations regarding what is happening on the pitch and I have had separate talks with the players to gain their thoughts too.

There is no magic wand to wave and although it may sound obvious we have to keep working hard and trust that things will turn.

Despite what some people would like to think is happening, there is absolutely no disconnect whatsoever between the coaches and the players. Every single player is behind Scott.

Last week saw Sadiq Adebisi and Kameron Pearce-Paul make their debuts and both did well. They will only get better each week as they train with us.

We also had a couple of other deals lined up but they fell through because of injuries. This is an ongoing exercise and next week will be no different.

I again have to mention the support the lads got at Bradford. Whilst understandably voicing opinions, fans again got behind the team despite the scoreline and it is, as always, much appreciated.

As a club we have experienced more tough times and challenges than most and you can be certain that this is no different.

Our opponents come to us on the back of a defeat at Dewsbury Rams last weekend which puts pressure on them to finish in the top four with Halifax breathing down their necks in fifth place and only two points behind.

Losing Jonathan Ford at stand-off left an enormous hole for Toulouse to fill, but their home form could be the answer to them appearing in the Middle Eights come August which would result in a quality first season in the Championship for the French team.

Last week was probably the toughest I've faced as a coach and to say nothing went right for us during three games in eight days would be a massive understatement.

CASTING CALL FOR NEW THEATRE PRODUCTION

Rugby League Cares is on the look-out for performers and volunteers to help to bring to life an exciting new piece of theatre which tells the story of the special relationship between Rugby League and the towns of Oldham and Rochdale.

The play, 'Rugby League in the Blood', is currently at the final draft stage and is based on the shared memories of members of the public from both communities.

It will be showcased with four performances in October and Rugby League Cares, the sport's charity, is looking for local people to get involved in the production at every level, from performing to stage management and ushers to backstage assistants.

A community cast call took place on Monday, June 19 at the Oldham Coliseum where writer Mick Martin, who is producing the play, was on hand to discuss the various roles.

About ten people attended, some from Manchester but mainly from Oldham, and a similar event will be held next Thursday, July 6, at The Flying Horse Hotel, Town Hall Square, Rochdale at 6.30pm.

Mick Martin, whose previous works include 'Once Upon A Time in Wigan' and 'Broken Time', which tells the story of rugby's great split in 1895, has been working with local volunteers to produce the play's script.

The writers have accessed a memory bank of reminiscences and stories about rugby league in Oldham and Rochdale, collected from local people by a Rugby League Cares project, 'From Stories to Stage'.

"It's been a fantastic process and we have gathered some brilliantly evocative memories which Mick and his fellow writers can turn into a thrilling piece of theatre," said RL Cares heritage consultant Trizia Wells.

"We are now at the stage when we need people to come forward and help us to bring 'Rugby League in the Blood' to life.

"There are lots of opportunities to get involved and it's something everyone can be part of; you don't need previous experience of the theatre and you don't have to be a rugby league fan."

'Rugby League in the Blood' will premiere at Touchstones Gallery, Rochdale on Wednesday, October 18 as part of the town's 2017 Literature Festival and will then be performed at The Flying Horse, Rochdale (October 25), Oldham Library (October 26) and the Mahdlo Centre, Oldham (October 27).

Clubs to consider league structure

CHRIS Hamilton will represent OLDHAM RLFC at a meeting of Championship clubs this week to discuss various proposals for the reorganisation of the league.

With suggestions to expand Super League gaining support from within the elite competition, the 12 KP Championship clubs want to examine the proposals in detail to see if there will be any spin-off relating to clubs in the second tier.

Potential restructuring will be top of the agenda.

Super League are thought to be wanting a return to a 13-club comp, or even going up to 14.

Some Championship clubs want assurances about how that would affect them going forward and the implications about changes to the central distribution of funding.

They'll also want to know whether they can win still promotion to Super League or whether the new concept will result in teams being locked into the second-tier.

Another important topic will the future of the Super Eights in the event of Super League returning to a 14-club competition.

Any change to the numbers in each of the two divisions will entail changes to the regular season format and the Super 8s themselves.

An additional complicating factor is that any changes made to the league structure must be approved by Sky.

Sky's current broadcasting agreement with the RFL carries the proviso that both Super

League and the Championship are 12-team competitions with the Super 8s format so any adjustments would have to be accepted by BSkyB.

A BIG Roughyeds welcome is extended to the two young players from London Broncos, Kameron Pearce-Paul and Sadiq Adebisi, who have joined us on loan.

They are here initially for one month with a view to extending the agreements if it suits both parties.

Our thanks and appreciation go to Andrew Henderson and the Broncos for their assistance and co-operation in helping to steer the deals through to completion.

Both players are aged 20 and are full-time members of the Broncos'

senior squad, Kameron as a centre or wing; Sadiq ('Just call me Sid') as a front-row or loose forward.

The logistics of having two young Londoners in our squad will work like this. They will spend part of each week in London with Broncos and the other part up here with us, training with Scott, Pete and the boys on Thursday nights and Saturday mornings and then being available for the Sunday games.

Each Sunday night they will travel south again, have Monday off, train with Broncos on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and then come back to Oldham on Thursdays, ready for training with us that night.

As most of you will know, they both made their debuts against Bradford Bulls at the Provident

Stadium, Odsal last Sunday, Kameron in the centre and 'Sid' off the bench.

While it wasn't a good day for the team, they both did very well individually, especially so considering they were in a new environment with new team mates and had only trained once with the squad on the day before the game.

There was no training last Thursday, of course, because we had played Dewsbury Rams on the Wednesday.

Kameron played with

Croydon Hurricanes in South London from the age of 11 or 12 and was eventually scouted by the Broncos, who signed him up for their Scholarship scheme.

Sadiq's junior club was Richmond Warriors in West London and he followed a similar path to Broncos where he developed through the Scholarship scheme with Kameron.

They are now at that point in their careers where they can benefit from playing more regularly against men, just like the Castleford boys we had,

Kieran Gill and Tuoyo Egodo, and the young players we get from Huddersfield Giants on dual-registration.

Said Sadiq: "The move gives us both the opportunity to get more game time and more experience and if we can help Oldham at the same time that will be great. We are both looking forward to it a lot."

Kameron added: "It would be super if we could help Oldham to get back to winning ways. I like playing both centre and wing, but if I have a preference it's for centre."

Our Visitors

Toulouse Olympique



Today we welcome Toulouse Olympique to Bower Fold for our first home fixture against the side from the south-west of France.

Olympique can trace its history back to 1937, two years after the formation of the French Rugby League Federation. The club played competitive Rugby League in the French leagues until the start of the 21st century when Toulouse became ambitious to become a member of the European Super League.

The Rugby Football League introduced licensing for the 2009 Super League season but Toulouse were unsuccessful with an application to win a licence. The consolation of an invitation to compete in the Championship was accepted and they spent three seasons in the second tier competition.

A return to the French

Elite One Championship in 2012 saw two league titles in three years before the Olympique once again applied to join the English rugby league system. They were permitted to join League One for the start of the 2016 season.

2016 saw Toulouse undefeated until the promotion final against Rochdale Hornets, unexpectedly losing to the Lancastrians on home soil. They made no mistake in the play-offs however and returned to Championship status by beating Barrow in the play-off final.

2017 has seen 13 wins from 19 games meaning Toulouse currently occupy fourth place in this year's Championship. Halifax, only two points behind, are breathing down their necks and so the Frenchmen need to continue picking up league points to gain a place in the coveted end-of-season middle-eights competition.

Over 1700 fans, many of them Oldhamers, watched Toulouse easily defeat the Roughyeds 58-18 at Blagnac back in April. A second half rally gave Oldham the briefest thoughts of another memorable comeback but it wasn't to be.

Last time out, Toulouse visited Dewsbury Rams and fell victim to the Yorkshiremen's recent recovery of form, losing 34-22. The continued absence of the talismanic Jonathan Ford may present a chink in the Gallic armour that other teams can exploit.

To plug the gap left by Ford, Toulouse have signed Louis Jouffret from Catalan Dragons on a dual-registration basis. Jouffret should be no stranger to our fans, having turned out for Whitehaven against Oldham last season.

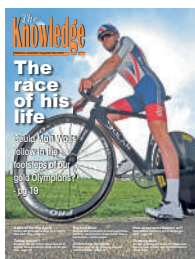
