

# LEPORI AND TURNER OUT FOR THE SEASON

YOU can read elsewhere in this programme the steps we have taken to fill the gaps left by the loss of Richard Lepori and Scott Turner, but it is a major setback nevertheless to face the Shield games without players of such stature.

Neither of them will play again this season and Scott's rugby league career may be over at the age of 23.

The former North Wales Crusaders wing or fullback has been concussed on three separate occasions this year and has now asked us for time away from the game while he considers his future.

'Lippy', meanwhile, has been told there is only one cure for his ankle injury - an operation. Said coach Scott Naylor: "Scott has decided he doesn't want to risk getting a fourth concussion. While he's away from the game he'll be thinking things over.

"As far as next year is concerned that's up to him and whatever decision he arrives at.

"We've been told 'Lippy' must have surgery so that rules him out as well.

"We keep getting bad news with injuries and they're not your run-ofthe-mill injuries either; they're long-term, season-ending injuries. It's relentless.

"We've just got to take it on the chin and get on with it. But as I've said before I've never known anything like it in all my career."









# Hooley here on loan to boost our back three

A BIG Roughyeds welcome awaits Wakefield Trinity's young full-back Luke Hooley, who has joined us on loan to the end of the season.

The 19-year-old Dewsbury lad is currently having treatment for a slight knee strain, nothing serious, so he will join us the week after next following the short break between the end of the regular season today and the start of the Shield games in a fortnight.

As this programme went to press we were also pursuing other signing channels as well as talking to London Broncos and Salford Red Devils in the hope of extending the loan agreements covering Kameron Pearce-Paul and Sadiq Adebiyi (London) and Liam Bent and Connor Williams (Salford).

It was the signing deadline on Friday so the week just ended has been a hectic few days for most clubs and we were no exception.

Fortunately, we had already secured the Hooley signing before the deadline dash.

Scott Naylor said: "We needed cover for the back three after losing Scott Turner and Richard Lepori for the season. It was a big help to get Steve Nield back from Gloucester and to bring in Kameron Pearce-Paul and Connor Williams, but we are even stronger in the full-back/wing areas now.

"Luke is well thought of at Trinity and his time at Dewsbury Rams will have given invaluable experience of Championship rugby." Dewsbury-born Hooley is a highly-rated goalkicking full-back. He played at community club Dewsbury Moor until he was 16 when he joined Bradford Bulls on scholarship. When Bulls liquidated early this year Wakefield quickly snapped him up as a free agent and he starred in their under-19s.

In March, the then 18-year-old signed a twoand-a-half year full-time contract with Trinity with the option of a further year.

He has since played six games on loan to Dewsbury Rams, including wins against Batley, Bradford, Oldham at Bower Fold recently, and Toulouse.

When he signed his fulltime contract with Trinity

he said on social media: "It's a dream come true, something I've wanted since since I was six years old.

"I was asked to train with the first team for a week after talking with John Kear and Chris Chester. It was tough, a lot more physical and intense than I was used to, but that's how you get better and hopefully improve."

At the time he was described by head coach Chester as "an exceptional young talent" who had played several good games in the under-19s.

While out on loan at Dewsbury, he played at full-back in the Rams' 20-16 win here at Bower Fold on June 21.

He also played for his home-town club in Championship victories against Batley Bulldogs, Bradford Bulls and Toulouse Olympique and in defeats by London Broncos and by Hull KR.

# **Our Visitors Rochdale Hornets**

# Today sees the third competitive encounter between Oldham and Rochdale this year.

Of course that doesn't include Hornets' first visit to Bower Fold back on January 22 when they defeated Oldham in the season-opening Law Cup encounter. Three unanswered tries in 15 second-half minutes and a final scoreline of 24-12 ensured that the old trophy went back to Rochdale for the first time since 2011

Hornets were promoted out of League One in the 2016 season. Finishing second to high-flying Toulouse Olympique, a promotion play-off final was their reward. The only trouble was that they had play away in Toulouse and were therefore unfancied by many pundits.

In a thrilling game, Rochdale took a late lead through a try by former Roughyed Jack Holmes before a Chris Riley four-pointer provided a cushion for a famous Hornets victory.

Coach Alan Kilshaw set about making preparations for life back in the Championship and he wasted no time in recruiting the services of Lewis Palfrev and Gary Middlehurst from the Roughveds to join previously on loan Holmes. More signings followed and players with the calibre of Miles Greenwood, Gavin Bennion, Rob Massam and Rvan Maneely bolstered the Spotland squad.

The opening Championship game of the season saw Hornets announce their presence with a 46-0 thumping of injurystricken Dewsbury. They followed that victory up with a 22-14 win over Bradford Bulls at Odsal and the Hornets were flying high.

The season's first Roughyeds/Hornets derby came at Spotland in



March. Oldham had built up a commanding lead late into the game but Hornets had other ideas and two tries in the dying minutes earned the home side a draw.

Next came the Summer Bash weekend and a tantalising fixture in Blackpool. For the second time Oldham surrendered a match-winning lead to let Rochdale overtake them and go on to win 38-28.

An Oldham win today would see both clubs level on points going into the Championship Shield games. Hornets will be keen to bag the two points on offer to put a four point gap between themselves and their old rivals. In view of recent encounters, expect the unexpected and don't think about leaving until the final hooter sounds.

#### **Rob Massam**

Powerful winger who scored 90 tries for North Wales Crusaders before moving to Spotland in 2017.

Has represented Wales having qualified through residency and played in the 2013 Rugby League World Cup.



#### **Gavin Bennion**

Described as big, athletic and aggressive, this 23yr old prop or second-row signed for Hornets from Halifax this year.

Previous experience with Warrington Wolves, Featherstone Rovers and a time with Mackay Cutters in Australia.



#### **Danny Yates**

Oldham born scrum-half and winner of the League One young player of the year award in 2016.

Learnt his trade with Gareth Owen at Waterhead and has had experience at St Helens and Halifax.





# How the Shield works: THREE games at Bower Fold for us

THE Rugby Football League are expected to announce the full programme of Championship Shield fixtures --- venues and dates --- on Wednesday.

The first of the seven rounds will be on Sunday, August 6, by which time we will hope to have some of our injured players back in action.

Over the course of the next two months we will play each of the other 'bottom eight' Championship sides just once, making seven games in total.


Either home or away, we will play Batley Bulldogs, Sheffield Eagles, Dewsbury Rams, Rochdale Hornets, Swinton Lions, Bradford Bulls and EITHER Toulouse Olympique or Halifax, depending on which of those teams finishes in the top four as a result of their final games this weekend.

Last year we beat Workington and Whitehaven at home and Swinton Lions away, losing to Bradford, Halifax and Dewsbury away and to Sheffield at Bower Fold. It goes without saying that the battle to avoid relegation will be just as tense and as tight as last year when we secured our survival with a narrow 20-18 win against Whitehaven at home on the penultimate Sunday of the season. Wow!
