### A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Welcome to Bower Fold for this afternoon's match against the Bradford Bulls.

Whilst the Bulls have their own problems and the prospect of relegation to League One has, in reality, been on the cards for some time, our own situation is not improved by us not being able to do the basics.

The support over at Wakefield last week deserved better and hopefully today we will give you plenty to shout about.

The only saving grace last week was that other results went in our favour but let's not rely on others, we need to get ourselves out of the current position starting today.

Last week was interesting in that it again underlined the reasons why the "8s" were brought in. London Broncos putting up a great fight against the Catalan Dragons and Halifax, who only got into that 4th spot in our division on the last day of the season, had a real dig against Hull KR.

The Leeds/Wigan match was also played at a different intensity and I, for one, am fully behind the concept and hope that others don't feel a need to change things.

Please continue to keep behind the lads. We all do appreciate it.

On the morning of Saturday, August





# Forward star Little thrilled Oldham crowds

#### OLDHAM rugby league great Sid Little OBE has died at the age 87.

A native of Kirkbride, Cumberland, but brought up in nearby Burgh-by-Sands, the former RAF pilot joined Oldham during the 1951-52 season, having previously played rugby union for both Harlequins and the Cumberland county side.

On his arrival in Oldham, he and his wife Valerie, the daughter of Oldham's stalwart loose forward and Welsh Rugby Union international Emlyn Watkins, lived in Werneth, before moving to Moorside, where they stayed until Little's position as a company director required a move to the Midlands.

A devastating, running second row forward, he formed a tremendous back row partnership with Charlie Winslade in the entertaining Oldham side of the 1950s.

His talents were recognised by the rugby league selectors, the pinnacle of his international career was scoring a try against the 1956 touring Australians in the third and final Test at Swinton.

This not only equalled the biggest margin of victory for the British against the Kangaroos in an Ashes Test, 19-0, but both sealed the series 2-1 while at the same time regaining the Ashes. This was the commencement of 10 consecutive international appearances for Little,

interestingly most of them at prop forward.

He represented Great Britain in the 1957 World Cup played in Australia and in which the British were runners-up to the home side. He also played in four promotional matches under the banner Great Britain XIII against the French. Three of these were played in South Africa and the other in New Zealand.

Including two promotional matches in Australia against Western Australia and Queensland, Little played in a massive 58 competitive matches during the 1957-58 season. Along with his Oldham team-mates Derek Turner, Frank Pitchford, Ken Jackson, and Alan Davies, Sid was then selected for the 1958 tour to Australia, but due to his wife Valerie expecting a family addition, declined the invitation.

While at Watersheddings, Little, who also represented Cumberland at rugby league, played 249 times for Oldham scoring 49 tries.

Included in these statistics are the three consecutive Lancashire Cup final victories against St Helens in 1956, Wigan in 1957, St Helens again in 1958, Hull in the 1957 Championship final plus the defeat to Barrow in the 1954 Lancashire Cup final and Warrington in the 1955 Championship final.

The season 1957-58 saw Oldham top the league,

winning 33 and drawing one of their 38 league games. Little, a member of the Oldham Rugby League Hall of Fame, also played for the Cumberland county rugby league side on eight occasions.

At the end of the 1958-59 season, he hung up his boots in the Watersheddings' pavilion changing rooms for the last time.

In December, 1982 he was awarded an OBE for his services to the Air Training Corps, Staffordshire, which he had served since 1970, holding the rank of Wing Commander.

Whenever asked to do so, Little would gladly point his car in the direction of Oldham. Whatever the event, he would lend his support, but understandably the occasions which he enjoyed the most were those which he could share with his colleagues from that glorious era of yesteryear.

Little leaves a wife Valerie, to whom he was married for 63 years, a son Michael and daughters Jane and Sarah.









# Rising stars make their debuts

Oldham gave debuts to two new loan players last week against Sheffield Eagles in Wakefield. Luke Hooley (Wakefield) and Ben Morris (St Helens) have both arrived on-loan from their parent Super League clubs until the end of the current season.

Hooley, a full-back, played in his favoured position

and took-on the goal kicking duties, landing two out of three attempts. The loss of Richard Lepori and Scott Turner to injury has presented the 19-year-old Dewsbury born player with a great opportunity to advance his career. He's well thought of at Wakefield and recently recieved praise from his home-town club after a loan-spell playing at The Tetley's Stadium.

Morris took up the leftcentre role in the Sheffield game and had plenty to contend with up against a strong and determined Eagles team.

A former Blackbrook junior player, the 20-year-old formed part of the unbeaten St Helens academy side in 2016. His performances earned him a call-up to the full Welsh international team. He made his debut against Italy in a World Cup qualifier, scoring two tries in the process.

Ben has been named in the Welsh train-on squad for the World Cup alongside our own Joe Burke. He'll be keen to impress whilst at Oldham and will look to augment his international credentials. That can only be good news for the Oldham club during his stay with us.







# **Kieran Gill and that try!**

The visit of Bradford Bulls to Bower Fold today will surely invoke memories of that afternoon back in early April when our friends from West Yorkshire were last here.

Leading 22-20 going into the last 5 minutes, Bradford kicked along the ground to the Oldham left flank on the last tackle. The ball rebounded off Tuoyo Egodo's shins and as he rushed forward to gather the ball his rising posture enabled him to brush-off two Bulls tacklers and race away

downhill towards the try line.

On his outside and in support was teammate Kieran Gill who gleefully accepted a pass. Gill initially headed for the corner before checking his run to outstep the Bull's scrambling defence. He then jinked one way and then the other as the Bulls defenders tried in vain to bring him down.

Unbelievably the posts were now the target and the young Castleford Tigers loanee was able to shrug off a series of attempted tackles to

place the ball between the sticks.

The Oldham fans were ecstatic. On commentary for Oldham Community Radio, Gerald Brierley and Dave McGealy were producing iconic radio and the video clip of the try was all the rage on social media in the days to follow.

There have been some memorable late tries in the history of Oldham Rugby League and the young three-quarter from Castleford can add his name to the list of treasured Oldham try scorers.



# Our Visitors Bradford Bulls

Bradford Bulls make their second visit of the year to Bower Fold today however they arrive as a club already destined for League One status in 2018.

The Bulls began the 2017 season hampered by the deduction of 12 points before a single ball had been kicked. Financial issues had seen the demise of the previous Bulls administration but the new, reformed club were reprieved from instant relegation and invited to remain in the games second tier.

Hull KR provided the opening day opposition and the Bulls were beaten by the relegated former Super League club 54-24. A home defeat to Rochdale Hornets followed in round two before the first points of the season arrived with a tough away win at Swinton Lions.

More wins against Toulouse, Batley and Dewsbury followed and the men from Odsal were steadfastly chipping away at that twelve point handicap.

A loss in the closing moments at Bower Fold against Roughyeds stymied the Bulls advance to zero points and they'd have to wait until another game against Oldham, this time at Odsal, to remove the minus sign from their points tally.

The Bulls defeated Oldham 47-12 but that remained their last victory of the regular season, finishing bottom of the pile; 11 points short of 11th placed Oldham and 12 points short of levelling with 10th placed Swinton and survival.

Toulouse, who narrowly missed out on a quaifiers place on the last weekend of the season, provided the



Championship Shield opening fixture last weekend. Since Oldham (11pts) and Swinton (12pts) have to play each other in the Shield's round 6, 13 points or more was the target for Bradford, effectively seven wins out of seven games.

The Bulls went down at home by 12 points to 26 against the French team and a bottom two place is now a mathematical certainty.

Despite the disappointment of their impossible position, the Bulls are not an outfit to be taken lightly and they can turn out a team strong enough to match any in the Championship Shield. Oldham will have to be on their guard to make it two wins out of two at home to the Bulls in 2017.

### **James Bentley**

19 year-old Leeds born back-rower who's been making a name for himself in the 2017 Bulls team.

Highly rated by coach Geoff Toovey, the player scored four tries against Sheffield Eagles back in April and has bagged a total of 14 four-pointers from 21 appearances this season.



#### **Colton Roche**

A utility forward who can play prop, secondrow or loose. Roche is a former Leeds Rhinos academy player who left Headingley in 2012 to join Sheffield Eagles. He also played a couple of games for Oldham in the same period.

After time spent with Featherstone Rovers and York City Knights, joined the Bulls in 2017.



#### **Scott Moore**

Vastly experienced hooker who has played for a string of Super League clubs such as St Helens, Castleford, Huddersfield, Widnes, Wakefield and London Broncos.

Was youngest ever Super League player when he made his debut for Saints aged only 16.
