# Sneyd ‘the boot’ joins Oldham-born greats

**MARC Sneyd and the modern game are the perfect fit.**

Older supporters will vividly recall the days when league fans scoffed at the amount of kicking in rugby union. Perhaps disrespectfully, we often referred to the 15-a-side code as kick-and-clap.

Fast-track to the way league is played today and there is certainly as much kicking in our code as there is in union, if not more so.

Our game has changed beyond recognition and whether you like it or not modern-day players can't be compared with players of yesteryear; especially those whose roles directly embrace most of the new rules and regulations that have totally altered the way league is played.

Sneyd's critics say he doesn't run with the ball; that he hasn't the speed to make an outside break to create space and running chances for his centres.

The Oldham-born maestro of tactical kicking, however, has just gone down in Challenge Cup final folklore as only the second man in history to win

the Lance Todd Trophy two years in a row and the first to win it outright in consecutive seasons. What an accolade

Sean Long won the prestigious Wembley man-of-the-match award three times, while Gerry Helme, Andy Gregory, Martin Offiah and Paul Wellens won it twice.

Wellens shared it in 2008 after winning it in 2007, but only Sneyd has won it exclusively two years on the run.

The former Salford Red Devils and Castleford Tigers player also becomes only the second Oldham-born player, behind Kevin Sinfield in 2005, to walk off with the Lance Todd.

That alone should place him alongside the line-up of Oldham-born greats despite the fact that he has still to convince a lot of people of just how good he is.

Maybe his critics haven't accepted how much league has changed and how important it is these days for any team to have a midfield general who can find 40/20s, kick goals, land a kick to the corner on a sixpence, regularly find his opponents' in-goal area and dictate tactics with an



educated boot.

In the wake of Hull's 18-14 defeat of Wigan in last Saturday's final, Lee Radford said of Sneyd: "He's the most criticised half-back we've had at the club, but he's won two Lance Todd Trophies - a phenomenal effort from a phenomenal player.

"He's had a massive impact on our club and the thing I admire most about him is the way he has handled his criticism.

"For whatever reason, so many others were destined to fail in his position at our club, but he's come in and made it his own. If he's not winning people over now I'm not sure when he will."

That's good enough for me. Well done Marc. Move over Sinny, Scully, Iestyn and big Baz and make way for a new addition around the top table.

# Remember the last time?

**ADAM Neal suffered a broken jaw in a thrilling encounter at Bower Fold which we won 14-12 on Sunday, July 2. Olympique beat us 58-18 in Toulouse on Saturday, April 8, but we made amends here at Bower Fold three months later and now both clubs will be up for the decider in a vital Kingstone Press Championship Shield encounter.**

**If it's half as tense and exciting as the last one it will be a belter and this is how the OLDHAM EVENING CHRONICLE reported a game that turned the form book upside down:**

## WHO famously said: "You don't win anything with kids.?"

It was in a different sport and it was in reference to winning a trophy, but at Bower Fold yesterday, as players and fans jointly celebrated the 14-12 victory against top-four, full-time side Toulouse Olympique, it felt like Oldham had won a cup . . . and kids in red and white played a massive part.

Six of the 17, Sam Wood at stand-off, Dave Hewitt at scrum-half, Kameron Pearce-Paul on the left wing and Matty Wilkinson, Sadiq Adebisi and Liam Bent on the bench were 21 or under.

Pearce-Paul (20) and Adebisi, also 20 and a front-row forward who drove the ball forward with the force of a tank, were on home debut and making only their second appearances at this level.

In a side containing the maximum five loan or dual-registration men, as permitted by Championship rules, dual-reg Wood from

Huddersfield Giants and on-loan Bent, from Salford Red Devils, were the youngest pair on the field at 19.

Prop Dan Smith, their senior by five years, completed the allocation of imports on a day when the youngsters quickly became of age while a more seasoned and street-wise member of the squad, Steve Nield, turned back the clock a couple of years.

Recalled from a loan spell at Gloucester and playing only his second competitive game in two years for his hometown club, the full-back scored the first try after 14 minutes and went on to enjoy a memorable afternoon. He never put a foot wrong. He wasn't on his own, either.

All ten Oldham forwards were dominant and determined in their quest to hold their own with one of the biggest packs in the competition.

Led by second-rower

Sebastien Planas, the Toulouse forwards were a formidable force with stand-out performers in French Test hooker Charles Bouzinak, Kiwi prop Tyla Hepi, Aussie second-row man Rhys Curran and a monster of a man coming off the bench, Constantine Mika.

Had Oldham's forwards showed even a hint of weakness they would have been bossed and bullied and intimidated to the point of capitulation.

In the event, they stood their ground, tackled like men possessed, fought fire with fire, produced big hits galore and restricted a side that put 58 points on them in Toulouse to two tries -one of them a 'softie' near the end when they let Bouzinak slip in from dummy-half close to the line.

Every Oldham forward did a superb job, but special credit to terrier Thompson, tackler supreme and back to his best after a lean spell, and to young Adebisi, whose power on the drive in his second spell was particularly noteworthy.

Outside of the pack, Oldham's threequarters were almost as physical and as 'up for the challenge' as were the men in the middle.

Marguerite and Ader, the French centres, were given a battering by Tyson and

Gee, the latter stepping in as captain in the absence of Gareth Owen and Scott Leatherbarrow and leading by example - not a completely error-free performance but one which underlined the dogged determination of this Oldham side to avenge their defeat on French soil a couple of months ago.

Back then, Toulouse were served by two wonderful half-backs in Jon Ford, an Aussie, and Frenchman Stan Robin.

Without this injured pair to lead them around the park, they were but a pale shadow of the attacking force they once were, but that should take nothing away from what Oldham achieved on a significant day for the club in terms of ending an eight-match losing streak and building confidence for the battles ahead.

A key part of that were the young halves, Wood and Hewit, who shouldered a lot of responsibility in

Leatherbarrow's absence.

Wood had a first-rate game on attack, defence and as a field kicker with a big boot, while Hewitt constantly pummelled the left-side touchline to set up good field position and did well with his goalkicking after a nervously-struck first shot which he pulled wide.

Oldham were off to a good start with Kenny Hughes twice held up over the visitors' line before they opened the scoring after quarter of an hour. Hewitt switched the direction of attack in the Toulouse 20-metre zone and Thompson found Nield powering through on the burst.

His surge took him through a gap and across the line for an unconverted try which must have given the home side immense confidence.

Crunching tackles by Thompson on Marguerite and Tyson on Maurel brought high-fives all round, but a rare mistake, and then an infringement, gave Toulouse momentum and they went in front with a Planas try, goaled by Kheirallah.

Highlights of the remainder of the first half were excellent defensive covering by Luke Adamson and a spectacular, one-handed collection of a Toulouse kick by Nield, who looked safe and self-assured

in everything he did.

Oldham had the slope in their favour in the second half and they made it count to put constant pressure on the visitors' defence, culminating in a second try when Langtree sent Tyson powering through a huge hole for a try which Hewitt improved on the an gle.

New-boy Wilkinson, off the bench, started to terrorise Toulouse's marker system at the ruck and as Oldham kept up their momentum Hewitt added two penalty goals, the first after a bad tackle on Langtree, the next one when Bouzinac slowed down Gee's recycle.

At 14-6 with 15 minutes to go, Roughyeds were in a commanding position, but Toulouse wouldn't go away and when Bouzinac squeezed in from dummy half and Kheirallah kicked the goal it set the scene for a tense final few minutes.

This time Oldham managed to hold on and the celebrations could begin.

Matty Wilkinson came on a permanent deal after being released by Salford and he figured prominently in the 22-22 draw at Batley Bulldogs, as did young loan signings Liam Bent, Sadiq Adebiyi, Luke Hooley and Ben Morris.

Kameron Pearce-Paul didn't play at Batley, but he was back in the side at Rochdale last Monday and he contributed significantly to the battling 30-24 triumph.

So, too, did Kam's London Broncos team mate

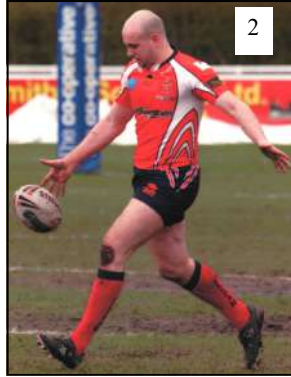

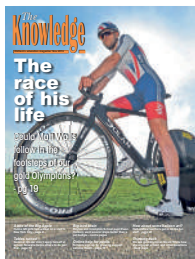
