A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I WANTED to write these last programme notes of 2017 while all the emotion of what happened a couple of hours earlier at Swinton was still raw.

As I'm sure you can imagine, there are 1,001 things going through my head right now given that we've been relegated back to League 1 only two seasons after winning promotion.

I hoped against hope that we could win at Swinton and give ourselves the opportunity to stay in this division but, like countless other times this season, we flattered to deceive and our second-half performance was not good enough. There are lots of reasons we could point to as to why we have gone down but ultimately we have just not been good enough on enough occasions.

We invested more money into the squad this year thinking we would be further up the division, but it's not worked out.

As a result of that you will probably be watching a lot of people today for the last time. Sadly, that is a reality of the situation we are now in.

We have lost £100,000 in central distributions plus everything else that goes with it such as lower revenues from attendances and commercial income -- and that's just for starters.

The playing budget will be significantly reduced by necessity and there will be other cutbacks for sure.

There is so much up in the air at present and right now, if I'm being honest, it's hard to be positive. I'm expected to be the one who lifts people, who says "it will be all right" and who leads the way forward again. Just one question - who does that for me?

For 20 years I have given heart and soul for this club - often to my personal detriment - but at times it seems it's only noticed by people who are not from Oldham It's easy to be despondent for obvious reasons right now and maybe that's what's happening, but I'm merely being honest like I always have been. Writing this and sitting here alone I'm finding it hard to be anything else.

We've tried so very hard to give those of you who have stuck with us this season the rewards you deserve, but we've come up short. Home and away the support has been nothing short of outstanding and had we matched that consistency on the field it would be a very different story. For that, again, I thank you so much.

As is tradition at the last home game of the season I want to thank each and every person who has helped the club this year in any way, shape or form. As I have said previously, Oldham is no different to any other club in that it cannot exist without the help of volunteers and we are very fortunate to have a loyal, hard -working group.

This afternoon's game will seem very strange now after last week but I ask you, for one last time in 2017, to show your support for the lads as we try to end on a high.

TERRY O'HARA, former hooker. Roger Bannister writes: "Terry married on a Saturday morning in 1951 and then played for Oldham in the afternoon. He invited the whole family to watch and they saw him sent off early in the second half to the disgust of his Mum. This got an honourable mention at Terry's funeral service.

"Terry moved to the Chichester area many years ago and raised his family here. My memories are of the Halifax team in the mid-1950s and Terry also remembered the likes of Alvin Ackerley, Jack Wilkinson and Ken Traill

GEORGE CROSSMAN: Allan Gibson writes: "George passed away on February 23, 2017 at the age of 76 after a short battle with cancer. He was a lifelong supporter of the Oldham Rugby League team and he particularly loved the old ground at Watersheddings. In his younger days he pushed his girl friend through the 'penny rush'. He was there at the very last game and he loved to talk of the Oldham greats of the past.

"He continued to support Roughyeds at their various homes after Watersheddings, remaining a season-ticket holder at Bower Fold until his death. We will miss his cry of, 'Flopping, ref!".

PHILIP GEORGE BROCKLEBANK

(January 15, 1956 to April 7, 2017).

Philip was born in Oldham and although he moved to Yorkshire, the Red Rose would forever represent his Lancastrian pride. He was an avid Oldham Rugby supporter from the age of five, a tradition that

club's dearly departed

TONY ACKROYD

GORDON LANG DALZELL died January 31. 2017, aged 87. Gordon was a lifelong supporter of Oldham RLFC and despite failing health in his final couple of years he continued to hold a season ticket, attending matches when he was physically able to. Gordon watched home game and occasionally travelled to away games with his good friends Helen and Karen. He played for Higginshaw in his younger days and his passion for the game and especially for Oldham RLFC never diminished. He was always keen to support the club in whatever way he could. In recent years he became a generous contributor to ORSA, sharing his enthusiasm of all things 'Roughyeds' with his good friends Grant and Sheila.

ALEX GIVVONS jnr: Alex died aged 82, a leading referee in the 1970s and 1980s and the elder son of a former club legend in Alex Givvons snr. Well known as a local golfer, Alex jnr. played as a centre or winger for Halifax, Swinton and Blackpool Borough where, for a time, he was centre to the legendary Brian Bevan.

In later life, while still a referee, Alex penned a regular article in the Oldham RLFC match programme, headed, "Alex Rules OK".

WE also said farewell to several former Oldham players, these including:

RAY CLARK died January 9, 2017, aged 72. An active member of the Oldham Past Players' Association, he signed for Oldham from Warrington during the 1968-69 season. Scored 19 tries in 95 games for Roughyeds. Later moved to Huddersfield and then coached at Swinton, Rochdale, Leigh and Mansfield. Also went to New Zealand in 1983 as a coach on the BARLA under-19s tour.

BILL CHURM, also died in January, 2017 while abroad on holiday. Oldham-born, Bill signed for his home-town club in 1969-70 and was at Watersheddings until the 72-73 season, making 51 appearances. He was a tough looseforward, who always played well above his weight and, as such, was a fans' favourite.

RICHARD 'DICK' BONSER, a Rochdale-born forward, who came to Oldham in the twilight of his career after time at Swinton, Widnes and Huyton. In a relatively young pack, he played second-row with teenager Bob Irving, making a total of 39 appearances between 1970 and 1972.

TONY BARROW jnr, who died aged 45 after a long battle against a brain tumour. Signed at Watersheddings as a teenager when his father, Tony snr., was coach of the club, Tony jnr. was a promising utility forward, who later moved to Swinton. Throughout his illness he was a keen supporter of the Steve Prescott Foundation and he ran the St Helens 10K with his wife, Ann-Marie, by his side.

TERRY RAMSHAW, a tough Yorkshire-born prop. Died aged 74. Signed for Oldham in 75-76 from Hull KR, played in 32 games for Oldham and was given coaching duties on a temporary basis in the 76-77 season following the premature passing of coach Jim Challinor.

SID LITTLE OBE, aged 87.

A member of the Oldham RLFC Hall of Fame,

Sid played 249 games for Oldham (49 tries), while also representing Great Britain in the 1957 World Cup in Australia. A star member of the fabulous Oldham side that won the Championship in 1957, he formed a fabulous second-row with Welshman Charlie Winslade.



Our Visitors Dewsbury Rams



The 2017 season didn't start too well for our friends from the Heavy Woollen area of West Yorkshire. An early season injury crisis meant that the Dewsbury Rams were still searching for their first league win in mid-April.

The Rams coach of 5 years, Glenn Morrison, left the club in late March to be replaced by Neil Kelly, a man who coached Dewsbury from 1996 to 2001.

Kelly led the Rams to victory over Leigh Centurions in the 2000 NFP Grand Final, lifted two League Leaders Shields and a Trans-Pennine Cup, and guided the club to a NFP Grand Final appearance in 1999.

The former coach had no illusions about the job in hand and immediately set about galvanising his new charges with the

goal of climbing out of the bottom two places in the Championship. The transformation in form has been impressive and instead of finding themselves locked in a relegation battle at the business end of this current season, the Rams easily secured safety with games to spare.

Dewsbury were due to play Oldham at Bower Fold in March when they were at the low point in their form slump. A flash downpour in Stalybridge worsened an already sodden pitch and the game had to be abandoned close to kick-off.

The abandoned fixture meant that the first 2017 meeting between our two sides took place at the Tetley's stadium on the last day of April. Leading 24-6 at the interval the Rams must have thought the two points were already in

the bag but Oldham managed to stage a remarkable comeback to take the points, winning 28-24. Maybe Adam Clay's surreal 40/20 off the touchline unnerved the home side.

The two clubs last met in mid-June for the rearranged fixture at Bower Fold. This time it was Dewsbury's turn to stage a second half reversal, turning a 12-6 half-time deficit into a late 20-16 victory and gain some revenge over a shell-shocked Oldham side.

Oldham's current league position means it's almost certain that our two sides won't meet in a league fixture next year. Let's hope we can renew our friendly rivalry at the earliest opportunity.






Three to watch Dewsbury Rams



Macauley Hallett

A centre who started off his professional career at Hull KR. Spent four seasons with the Robins where he made two first-team appearances. Moved onto Swinton in 2016 and then Batley Bulldogs for 2017. Joined the Rams in June of this year.



Toby Adamson

Younger brother of Oldham's Luke Adamson, Toby joined his brother at Salford in 2010 to begin his professional career. Took a brief sabbatical from the game to complete a law degree before returning in 2012 and spending three seasons at North Wales Crusaders. 
