Zack's back-to-back hat-tricks send him top of our try chart The only other player with the 'new' club to boast the

BUOYED by three tries against Hemel Stags and three more down in LLanelli against West Wales Raiders, centre Zack McComb has taken over the leadership of our 2018 club try chart (see player stats on facing page).

He currently has eight in six appearances - one more than Danny Bridge and two more than Danny Langtree.

People have been wanting to know when an Oldham player last scored try hat-tricks in consecutive games and the answer is winger Nick Johnson in March, 2004 with three in a 40-10 win at Chorley and three more a week later in a 56-12 defeat of Rochdale.

Jon Ford and Adam Hughes scored six tries in consecutive games, but they were four and two, rather than hat-tricks.

The only other player with the 'new' club to boast the distinction of try hat-tricks in successive games was David Gibbons who, in January, 2001, ran in three against amateurs Queensbury and four against Chorley Lynx in the following game.

Danny Bridge did his chances of finishing top no harm at all with a brace of tries against Hemel

and another one in our 74-0 win at West Wales Raiders. With seven, he pushed his second-row partner Danny Langtree down into third place and became, currently, our top try-scoring forward.

He blotted his copybook when sin-binned in Llanelli for use of knees in a tackle, but the RFL's match review panel later ruled that the yellow card was sufficient punishment.



When we played in Rugby League's very own 'White Horse Final'...

GEORGE COWBURN continues his series in which he looks at Oldham's contribution to big events in RL history

IN the 1920s Oldham were Cup Kings, appearing in four successive Challenge Cup finals, a record held until Wigan smashed it with their eight appearances in a row from 1988 to 1995, all won.

In this article we are looking at the first two finals, in 1924 when Wigan were victorious 21-4 and in 1925 when Oldham defeated Hull KR 16-3.

The 1924 final was the equivalent of football's 'White Horse Final'.

Oldham got there with wins over local rivals Rochdale Hornets (5-0), Dewsbury (18-0), Wakefield Trinity (24-10) and then a 9-5 semi-final victory over Huddersfield.

For the all-Lancashire final on April 12 the venue chosen was Rochdale's

Athletic Grounds and a record crowd of 41,831 crammed into the stadium, resulting in record receipts of £3,712.

So great was the crush that the crowd spilled on to the pitch and the referee, the Rev Frank Chambers from Dewsbury, had to withdraw the teams so police could restore order and allow the game to take place.

Oldham's team that day:

Ernie Knapman, Sid Rix, Billy Hall, Alan Woodward, Joe Corsi, George Hesketh, Alf Bates, Jack Collins, Alf Tomkins, Ambrose Baker, Bob Sloman, Albert Brough, Herman Hilton.

A goal apiece by Knapman and Brough against two Wigan tries and a goal meant Roughyeds were still in the game at half time, but three secondhalf tries and two goals, without reply, gave Wigan a comfortable 21-4 victory.

Stories abound regarding the chaos at the match.

Wigan's Tom Parker was said to have dived at the feet of the crowd for his try and South African winger Attie

Van Heerden reportedly ran round the back of a mounted policeman to get behind the posts for his touchdown. Winger Johnny Ring supposedly dived under the legs of a police horse for his score.

The disappointing result and the chaos did not put Oldham off though. They were back in the final again the next year.

In the 1924-25 season Oldham had already shown their cup-winning credentials with a 10-0 victory over St Helens Recreation in the Lancashire Cup Final.

St Helens Recs was a different club to the existing St Helens club. The Recs left the league after the 1938-9 season and their successors now

are the famous community club Pilkington Recs.

Victories over Leigh (5-0), Warrington (12-2) and Featherstone Rovers (26-0) saw Oldham playing a sem- final against their nearest and dearest, Rochdale Hornets, at Central Park, Wigan.

A 9-0 win over their neighbours took Oldham to Headingley on April 25, 1925 for a showdown against Hull KR, who had finished second in the league to Oldham's fifth. Rovers also beat Swinton in the Championship final.

Playing before a crowd of 28,335 with receipts of £2,879 Oldham lined up like this: Ernie Knapman, Joe Corsi, Sid Rix, Evan Davies, Reg Farrar, Ben Benyon, George Hesketh, Jack Collins, Alf Tomkins, Rothwell 'Rod' Marlor, Bob Sloman, Albert Brough.

Herman Hilton (capt).

Oldham dominated the first half but had to wait until the 33rd minute for their first score. Farrar covered over 50 yards in scoring the opening try which he also converted from the touchline.

Leading 5-0 at half time, Oldham steadily increased their lead with second-half tries by Brough and Corsi, plus a Farrar penalty.

Wilkinson then scored an unconverted try for Hull KR following a kick through before Oldham's veteran Welsh centre Davies wrapped things up with the final try, following good work by Farrar and Brough.

Farrar, who is still Oldham's record try scorer in a season (49 in 1921-22) was the star of the show with one try, two assists and two goals.

Squad given a boost with new



WE are delighted to confirm the completion of two new loan agreements with Wakefield Trinity involving up-and-coming 19-yearolds Luke Hooley and Lee Kershaw.

It was the last major job completed by our club chairman Chris Hamilton before he went into hospital for major heart surgery.

Full-back Hooley's latest week-to-week deal has been replaced with a season-long arrangement in which Trinity can trigger a recall option after the first month.

Winger Kershaw is back on a one-month deal, similar to that in which he scored three tries in four games for us between April 15 and May 6.

When that month was up, he went back to his full-time Betfred Super League employers, but Scott Naylor said at the time: "I'd be surprised if we didn't see him playing for Oldham again."

Roughyeds wish to place on record their appreciation of Wakefield's assistance and especially the help given by chairman Michel Carter and head coach Chris Chester.

Scott said: "This is brilliant news. We've always found that Wakefield Trinity is a great club to work with.

"Luke (Hooley) has always been fantastic with us. He's a great lad. To have him training with Trinity during the day and playing for us at weekends is good for him, for Trinity and for us. It's a great deal for all concerned.

"It's only a matter of time before he's playing first-team for Wakefield, but in the meantime he can give us a lift and we can help him to make progress with game time at a senior level.

"As for Lee (Kershaw), he played extremely well the last time he was with us. He's very young, but he's learning the game at a fast rate and, like Luke, he's also a good lad.

"He's one for the future at Wakefield. He needs game time and we know what he is

capable of. We obviously wanted to get him back and it's great to know it's happened."

Hooley first came to Oldham's attention last year when he played in six of Roughyeds' seven Championship Shield games while on loan, kicking 18 goals from 21 shots and scoring a match-winning try at Rochdale after following David Hewitt and taking the scrum-half's final pass.

He was twice named Oldham's top performer by League Express, in a 22-22 draw at Batley Bulldogs and in a 24-18 defeat by Toulouse Olympique at Bower Fold.

This season, both he and winger Kershaw (then aged 18, now 19), came on a month's loan following the home defeat by Hunslet on April 8.

They both played in four games -- wins against Keighley Cougars (32-18) and Newcastle Thunder (28-12) at the Vestacare Stadium; a 32-0 home defeat by Hull KR in the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup; and a very impressive 32-10 win at Workington.

In that game, Hooley scored a brilliant solo try just after half-time to take Roughyeds into a 20-6 lead.

Kershaw played left wing in all four games, scoring twice against Keighley on his firstever appearance at senior level and adding another in the win up at Derwent Park.

He has been at Trinity since he was 15 after representing West Yorkshire at age-group rugby union and then switching to League, first with Keighley Albion and later with Eastmoor Dragons, a community club with which Trinity have close associations.

When this season's initial month at Oldham expired for both players, Kershaw returned to Trinity temporarily, while Hooley remained at Oldham on a week-to-week basis although he didn't play against Hemel Stags and West Wales Raiders.

Our Visitors Doncaster

Doncaster are currently sitting in fourth position in Betfred League 1, just one place below Oldham who hold a narrow points-difference advantage.

The two sides have each won seven and lost three games so far this season but the similarities in results doesn't end at the bare figures alone. Those three losing games for the men from the Keepmoat Stadium were against York (H 14-16), Hunslet (H 16-35) and Bradford (H 6-32); the same teams that have lowered Oldham's colours in the league this year.

Last season Doncaster finished in fifth place in League 1's regular season, taking their place in the division's Super 8s competition. Hopes of finishing in the top five and a play-off place were dashed as the South Yorkshire side managed only one win out of seven and finished in 6th place.

Doncaster coach Richard Horne began a squad rebuild in preparation for 2018. Former Castleford and Wakefield full-back Richard Owen was recruited and he was joined by former teammate Ryan Boyle, a prop-forward with almost 150 Super League games under his belt with Castleford and Salford

Only last month Doncaster moved to further bolster their squad with the signing of Scotland international Frankie Mariano. Coach Horne was delighted to beat-off the attention of Championship clubs to seal the arrival of the ex Wakefield and Castleford player who adds more size and strength to the Dons' pack.

Doncaster began their 2018 campaign with a thumping 70-10 at home to Coventry Bears. Whitehaven were despatched next with another home win before a narrow two points victory away at Newcastle. Those wins enabled the Dons to stake a claim at the head of the league table despite those reversals against York and Bradford

On the same weekend that Oldham were running up the points against West Wales down in Llanelli, Doncaster entertained Hunslet at home. The Leeds side led 14-10 at the break but restricted their hosts to only six points in the second half while they went on to amass 35 points and take the win.



The two results meant that Doncaster dropped out of the top three for the first time in the year. Scrum-half Liam Harris had departed for Hull FC in the week before the game and that disruption, coupled with a below par performance, contributed to the loss.

Today's encounter with Oldham is the first game in a tough month for Doncaster. They take on Keighley at home next week but then travel away to both Whitehaven and Bradford as the season midway point is reached. It's likely they'll be missing the services of dual-registered back Hakim Miloudi who will be required by his parent club Hull FC.

Writing in the Doncaster Free Press, Richard Horne described Oldham as "a big powerful team, similar to Hunslet. They play it tough and they are direct and we'll have to handle that".

This clash of third v fourth should be a cracker and allow each side to assess how they are progressing in the season as a whole.

Jason Tali

30 year-old centre from Papua New Guinea who joined the Dons from Newcastle Thunder ahead of the 2016 campaign. Won international honours with PNG at the 2013 Rugby League World Cup. Re-signed a two-year deal to keep him with Doncaster until the end of this current season despite attention from Super League clubs.



Richard Owen

Very experienced full-back who began his professional career with Castleford Tigers in 2007. Scored 59 tries in 121 games for the Wheldon Road outfit before moving on to Wakefield Trinity Wildcats in 2014.

Owen played 45 games for Wakefield until released from his contract in 2016. Joined Doncaster at the start of 2018.



Ryan Boyle

Prop-forward who, like his teammate Owen, started off at Castleford Tigers, signing in 2006. Left for Salford City Reds in 2010 before returning to Cas in 2013.

Boyle moved on to Halifax in the Championship in 2016, initially on loan but signed full-time for the 2017 season.

Signed for Doncaster at the start of this season and has a big role to play in motivating the team.
