












## X --- O X OS NATTER WITH NOBBY

We had also signed (again!) Jon Ford on a threemonth loan deal and he slotted straight in as though he had never been away...


We are still on the look-out, as ever, for any additional quality we can bring to the club on the playing front and Fordy is another example of that.

As Scott has already mentioned this week, we have two massive games coming up today and then in the League One opener at Rochdale on Good Friday.


First things first though and with your support we can hopefully look forward to a big day out in May. Keep up your support of the team, it does make a difference.

# Remember this? 2013 and all that - the year Crusaders and Roughyeds led the charge

IF today's game in the semi-final of the iPro Sport League One Cup is half as exciting and as intense as the 2013 Kingstone Press Championship One games between Oldham and North Wales Crusaders it will still be a great advertisement for rugby league at this level.

It was the year these two clubs dominated the division, Crusaders eventually pipping us to the championship and automatic promotion by just two points.

In June we narrowly lost in Wrexham 22-20 — our only away league defeat — before producing one of our best all-round performances of the season to beat the Welshmen 28-10 at Whitebank at the end of July.

The crowd of 1,209, which included a large and vociferous following from North Wales, was the second highest at Whitebank and the best in Championship One in 2013.

For the record this is how the teams lined up for those two cracking games:

Seven weeks later Oldham had to win the return match to retain a realistic chance of winning the title, and they did it in style at a packed Whitebank that rocked to the hymns and arias of the Welsh fans and the hearty responses from enthusiastic Roughyeds followers.

By denying Crusaders a bonus point, we went five points clear at the top but, crucially, Crusaders had five games left to our three and they edged home to finish top by winning all five, despite a fright at Gateshead where they narrowly made it by 24-20.

A glance at the final table clearly indicates how the men under the commands of Clive Griffiths and Scott Naylor totally dominated the division, no fewer than nine points separating second-placed Oldham and third-placed Rochdale Hornets.

This is how the League Express's 'Rugby League Yearbook' summed up the overall performances of the two teams in Scott's first year here:

OLDHAM: "They were left to rue uncharacteristic slips against Oxford and Gloucestershire All Golds

(a 24-24 home draw) in finishing two points behind the leaders. But when the dust settled on another season of coming so close, Naylor and his squad could reflect on a positive campaign, and one that saw a host of young players spring to the fore.

"Richard Lepori and Jon Ford made the All Stars team, while Adam Files also shone. Lewis Palfrey was key man for much of the year, while Josh Crowley and Danny Langtree formed arguably the best back-row partnership in the competition."

CRUSADERS: "They sealed a remarkable two years since formation by lifting the title and, with it, promotion to the higher level. With crowds continuing to rise and the first-ever Northern Rail Bowl already in the bag, this was a season to remember for the fledgling club.

"Veteran boss Griffiths was rewarded with the (divisional) coach-of-the=-year award, while Jono Smith took the player-of-the-year prize, edging out Andy Moulsdale.

"Both made the All Stars, alongside Rob Massam, Dave McConnell and Gary Middlehurst."

Two years on and Crusaders are back in the third tier, but only because the bottom five came down from the Championship as part of the sport's major restructure.

They finished fourth bottom, above Rochdale, Swinton and Barrow and come to Whitebank today in this cup semi-final ahead of a return visit in League One on Sunday, June 7 and then our visit to Wrexham on Sunday, July 26.

While we were beating Coventry Bears at home and Barrow Raiders away in the first two rounds of the iPro Sport Cup, to reach today's semi-final, Crusaders won 36-10 at West Hull and 28-4 at home to Rochdale Hornets.





- 22: ALEX THOMPSON -- another who will feel



"It was a big help in my case because I knew a lot of the Oldham lads from our Salford days and it was a bit like turning back the clock.


"There's a great spirit in the camp, they're very fit and I think they can look forward to a good season."
