

Idham have a vast amount of experience at League 1 level, once again, they are part of the leading pack in 2015. They may not have had luck on their side in the past

couple of seasons, as they have agonisingly missed out on promotion to the Championship with play-off final

defeats in both 2013 and 2014.

But they have put themselves in a good position to go one better and win promotion in 2015, currently sitting pretty in top spot. Once again, Oldham's Whitebank Stadium has been a fortress this season and has no doubt been a platform for what they've achieved to date in 2015.

They started off this season with a perfect April: a win over local rivals Rochdale Hornets on the opening weekend of the season was backed up with a win over Coventry Bears, before further successes against South Wales Scorpions and London Skolars.

Then, Oldham started off May well with victory over Gloucestershire All Golds, before they fell to their first defeat of the season at Barrow Raiders.

tle Thunder, who were in their best spell of form at the time, but the Greater Manchester club then lost the weekend after at Keighley Cougars.




on loan, they haven't sulked about it, they've gone down well for South Wales and I had no hesitation about putting them into the team for the previous games they've been involved with. Once again, today's

Oxford, on the back of the 96-4 hammering to Swinton Lions, looked as if they'd be heading for another heavy defeat as they found themselves 22-0 behind at halftime.

But a strong second-half response saw them finish not too far off the All Golds. With a litte more time on the clock, they may well have secured a result.

Finally, South Wales Scorpions let a 22-18 half-time lead against Hemel Stags slip as they lost at home.

Two tries from both Yannic Parker and Connor Farrer before the break gave Scorpions the lead, but the Stags were in full control in the second-half to secure the two points, which moves them up to eight points in the table now.
