



COACH'S COMMENTS by Jon Sharp



This afternoon will provide another stiff test as Scott Naylor's Oldham side visit The Big Fella's Stadium following a great victory over Dewsbury Rams last weekend. It is always a big step up for promoted teams and Sunday's win will certainly give Oldham a massive boost coming into the game and it will take an eighty minute performance from ourselves to ensure we take the



points and maintain our good start to the season.

Following our good performance against Batley Bulldogs, particularly our defensive effort in the last 30 minutes, it was disappointing to see the Whitehaven fixture postponed due to a waterlogged pitch as I was keen for the team to maintain its momentum, although a trip to Cumbria on a Saturday night may not be everyone's cup of tea. Had the game gone ahead then we would have been without two of our three dual registration players who had played in our opening fixtures but the squad we recruited in the off-season is good enough to compete at this level, the dual reg players simply enhance it. Hopefully we can re-arrange the game for a blank weekend later in the season but failing that if we do need to travel midweek I'm confident that the squad we have is more than capable of gaining a positive result up there.

I'm hoping today that both Jamie Cording and Colton Roche will be available for selection having recovered from injury. Steve Snitch continues to make progress following recent surgery and should be available for selection in a few weeks. One player who will be out for longer is hooker Matty Wildie who recently underwent surgery and everyone at the Club wishes him well with his recovery. We hope to see him back in a Rovers shirt before the end of the season. We do have cover for Matty in the shape of John Davies, Sam Day and even Danny Craven but if a player becomes available that will suit our needs then we will make every effort to bring him to Featherstone.

As well as the disappointment of last Saturday's game at Whitehaven being postponed it was also a shame to lose the Reserves fixture against a Castleford Tigers XIII the following day. Our reserves have only had one opportunity to play this season and that was eight weeks ago in torrential conditions against Featherstone Lions. Brian Kellett, Craig Bower and Shaun Jewitt have been working hard with their squad and they get their season underway next Thursday at Keighley Cougars. Whilst we only have a 22 man first team squad in 2016 it is important that those players not featuring on a game day have the opportunity to play regular football, whether that be in the reserves or on dual registration with Hunslet Hawks. With the opportunity for our reserves to play against a number of Super League sides, starting down here with the visit of Hull FC on March 17th it is a great chance for the youngsters to test themselves and show to the coaching staff that they warrant a place in my first team squad.

Enjoy the game and thanks for your support. Get behind the boys, it's appreciated!



Oldham's comprehensive win over Dewsbury may have come as a surprise to many but looking at the Kingstone Press Championship table after the first three rounds it's plain to see that the 2016 season is going to be every bit as tight as 2015 with only

Batley arrived here full of confidence two weeks ago and it took a sterling display from Rovers to take the points. With victories over Leigh Centurions and Sheffield Eagles the Bulldogs have got off to a great start this season and but for some excellent defence from ourselves they could well be sitting at the top of the table with Bradford Bulls.

I'd like to thank all those who turned up on what was a bitterly cold and wet day - it was great to get over 2,000 fans here - and in particular I'd like to thank the work of the Rovers Foundation who contributed to these numbers with their Ambassadors project and the Dance Academy. Despite not receiving the Sky Try funding that some of our local clubs receive, both geographical and league wise, we endeavour to work hard in the community and I thought the picture of the side with the Lions youngsters as their mascots summed up our commitment to this area. We plan to work with the Lions to hold a celebration of their Club at the game against Sheffield Eagles on Good Friday of which there will be more details in next Sunday's programme.

It was disappointing that last Saturday's game at Whitehaven couldn't go ahead. Early in the week a picture was circulating on social media of the Recreation Ground under water and with the rain continuing to fall a pitch inspection by local match official, Gareth Hewer, ruled out any chance of the fixture taking place. There was a suggestion of moving the fixture to Sunday afternoon but the state of the pitch coupled with the forecast of incessant rain put paid to this. At the time of writing the rearranged date has not been confirmed but we have proposed to Whitehaven and the RFL the weekend of 7/8 May which is scheduled for the 6th round of the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup. Obviously we'd like to be taking on Super League opposition that weekend and if so we would then be faced with a midweek trip to Cumbria later that month.

On the business side of the Club we have written to all shareholders with details of the AGM which will take place on Wednesday 30th March at 6.30pm in the Clubhouse. Andrew Charles from our accountants Sochall Smith will be on hand to discuss the 2014 accounts and we are seeking nominations for Board Members with details of the meeting on page 39 of today's programme.

Featherstone Ladies have been busy in the off season recruiting many junior players, who are now aged 16, and so able to compete in the open age competition.







Standing Off by Mark Kirby

Our first great stand-off was Jimmy Williams (#13), who was one of the 'Original Thirteen' that played in Featherstone Rovers' first ever senior match. As so often happens, when Jimmy retired he left a hole in the team that was hard to fill.

1930 Billy Stott (Heritage Number 93)



Local youngster Billy Stott got the chance to fill Jimmy's shoes, and there can be no doubt that if he had stayed at Featherstone for a little longer in his career, he would have gone on to become one of the club's great players too. Originally signed as a seventeen year old from our own junior set-up, Billy made his debut in March 1930. He had quick feet, good hands, a kicking game and a great step. He was obviously destined to become a very good stand-off indeed. Thrown straight into a struggling first team as a youngster presented no problems for Billy and he stood out as a future star. In his first full season he partnered the veteran Charlie Annable (#58) at half-back and managed 10 tries and 22 goals from 37 matches. The following season Rovers tried a new half-back combination with Wilf Evans (#95) partnering Billy Hayes (#106). Billy simply slotted into the centres and continued to develop his game there. In the summer of 1933 after another successful season, Featherstone fans wondered how long they could hold onto the prized asset that Stott had become. Manchester giants Broughton Rangers moved in and offered Rovers a (then) mammoth £750 and our club was in no position to turn down that kind of money. No sooner had he left Featherstone than he was rewarded with his first county cap, the first of seven appearances he made for Yorkshire.

Stott served Broughton well but as the 1930s came to a close they too had financial problems of their own and Billy was sold to Oldham to help balance the books. The story of the decline of professional RL in Manchester continued as they moved to Belle Vue, changing their name in the process. By 1955 the club was defunct. Billy continued to offer Oldham good service, and when the war was on he even found time to come back to his hometown team at Featherstone and play three games as a guest in 1940 and a further two more in 1944. Once the war was over, Billy made his final move, nearer home, when he left Oldham for Wakefield. Now in his 30s and after seventeen seasons in the game, Billy was destined to have his finest hour and write his name into the record books forever. Wakefield won through to the first post-war Challenge Cup final and faced Wigan at Wembley. Cometh the hour, cometh the man. Stott scored two tries, converted one of them and then landed a dramatic late penalty to win Trinity the Challenge Cup against the odds. He was named man of the match and was awarded the newly inaugurated Lance Todd Trophy. The list of great players who have won that honour

since May 1946 is long and glorious, and there at the top is Featherstone born-andbred Billy Stott.




Sam Day (Hooker)
Heritage Number: 1,027
Rovers Career: 2015Appearances 6; Tries 2; Points 8



Sam started his rugby league career playing for Westgate Redoubt in Wakefield. He played for them until he was 16 at which point he signed for Featherstone. He is looking to stake a regular first team place this season after Andy Ellis left the club to concentrate on his studies. Last season, Sam made 6 appearances from the bench and scored one try. He says that the trip to Catalans in the cup has to be the highlight of his career so far, especially as he scored a try in this game. Jon Sharp says that Sam is one of a crop of youngsters that he was impressed with when he came to the club last season.

Sam has recently completed his apprenticeship in Mechanical Engineering. He currently works for Challenger Hydraulics in Dewsbury.

Sam says that his favourite film is "Blind



Growing up, Sam says that his favourite player was James Lowes. His current favourite is Issac Luke. The best places he has played so far are Langtree Park or Headingley and the best game he has played in has got to be that late dramatic win against Batley last season. After working his way up through the Academy, he made his first team debut for Rovers in the challenge cup game at Catalans last season when Rovers went close to pulling off a shock result.

Willis Fawley (Hooker) Heritage Number: 323 Rovers Career: 1951-1967 Appearances: 371; Tries 59; Goals 9; Points 195



When Featherstone Rovers played their first RL Cup Final at Wembley in 1952, he choice of hookers rested between veteran Bill Bradshaw and young Willis Fawley. Fawley had been signed in 1950 from the juniors but after a bright start, his form dipped and it was Bradshaw who got the nod. Fifteen years later, when the Rovers reached Wembley again, Willis Fawley travelled with the cup squad in a gesture to acknowledge his career which had just ended after a record-breaking 16 years and 9 months - the previous record being set by Frank Hemingway with 16 years.



His temporary lapse in form prior to Wembley 1952 was unfortunate because from taking over from Arthur Wood in 1951 to 1964 he was generally regarded as Rovers' premier hooker. He made his senior debut against Keighley (away) on 10 March 1951 and scored his first try against Doncaster (home) on 22 August 1951, the first of many tries to be scored by this agile and speedy player. Indeed, during the 1950s, arguments raged as to who was the fastest hooker in the loose – Tommy Harris of Hull or Willis? Harris gained the representative honours which Fawley's form richly deserved but never came. In encounters between the two clubs, their qualities seemed evenly balanced, particularly in 1959 when Hull beat Rovers in the RL Cup semi-final in April, but Featherstone were victors in the Yorkshire Cup Final later that year.

In the opening game of 1957/58, Fawley scored a hatrick against Leigh, a feat he was to repeat against Keighley in September 1960. His try-scoring exploits reached their peak in 1959/60 when he set up a new club try-scoring record by a forward of 17 in one season. One of the most important tries was in the epic third round RL Cup encounter on 19 March 1960. Lambert's astute back pass was taken by Fawley to score under the posts and seal an incredible 11-7 victory over the powerful Lancashire side.

One of the most dramatic events was on Boxing Day 1954 in the derby clash with Castleford at Post Office Road. Half-way into the second half Castleford were leading 6-3 and exerting pressure though a kick-through. Fawley chased back and in attempting to clear, stumbled and crashed heavily into the goal post. He was carried from the field on a stretcher and a gloom descended which was reflected in Rovers play. Ten minutes later, there was a tremendous cheer as Fawley re-appeared and promptly inspired Rovers to an 8-8 draw - yes, 'Boy's Own' stuff!

He was certainly a hard player, but with his exceptional hooking skills and speed in the loose, he was also talented and very popular. He had a well-deserved testimonial season in 1960/61, when he missed only four games. The following season he was in the reserves, captaining them to the Yorkshire Senior Championship, and in November he out-hooked John Shaw, the reserve Test hooker, when he was brought back to play in the Yorkshire Cup Final against Halifax. He played the remainder of his games with the reserves and in a fitting gesture played one half of a senior game against Bramley on 5 April 1967, prior to Wembley at the age of 37 years and5 months. What a rousing reception he received, testimony to the esteem in which he was held.

fevnut's musings

It's a miracle!

The miracle I refer to is the survival of a professional sports club over a period of 95 years when it is based upon such a very small population. That would be problematical enough but there are additional factors that compound the difficulties.



For a start we are not the most affluent of communities, and the town still hasn't really recovered from the closure of the pits. That has a big bearing on the ability to find and attract directors with money to put into the club and to generate revenue through sales, sponsorship and advertising. Nor do we any longer have the means which held the club together over many years which is the ability to grow our own players and then sell them on. That ended in 2003 when Hull FC took two promising Fev youngsters (Richard Whiting and Andy Bailey) and what the RL deemed to be satisfactory compensation was a ludicrous pittance. There is also the fact that for the vast majority of the summer era we have had to compete for resources with two clubs close by in Super League. Put all that together and it really is a miracle.

That we have survived I put down to the incredible way in which supporters volunteer to help the club. Obviously the most outstanding example is the work accomplished by the stand gang over the last few years, but there are many others as well such as the tireless work by a few people in running the club shop. And aside from the volunteers is the remarkable work done by our commercial manager in attracting sponsors and advertisers.

We all want to help and sometimes fans with little spare cash find it hard to find the best way of doing so. Well. I've got a suggestion. Look carefully at the advertisements in the matchday programmes. If we can do a little to make them believe that paying for advertising in this way is beneficial to them they are all the more likely to continue using Fev for advertising and thus assist the money coming into the club.

Over the last few years I have had to employ people to do some landscaping work in my garden, to replace fencing damaged by the appalling storms we have had, to fit some blinds and I also needed a skilled decorator. Each time I have turned to the programme and found advertisers who fitted my needs. And I must say that each of them not only carried out the work I required but did so to a very high standard. That's not so surprising because most of the advertisers are Rovers fans themselves and they clearly wanted to do a really good job for fellow supporters.

So, if you ever need something and you can find an advertiser in the programme that fits the bill, you will get a high standard work or goods and you will be finding yet another route of continuing the miracle!

Heavyweight Clash

THEY provided some of the most memorable clashes of 2015 at any level, and this weekend the Championship's two heavyweights Bradford and Leigh collide for the first time this year.

It's a contest that plenty of neutrals will be keeping a keen eye on from afar, alongside the faithful support of both clubs.

The two teams enter the game having experienced differing fortunes in the opening three rounds.

The Bulls have gone quietly about their business, following up a gritty opening victory over Featherstone with accomplished 40-point wins at Whitehaven and Swinton.

There has undoubtedly been more focus on the Centurions following a chequered couple of months.

They were already strong pre-season favourites to top the league again this season following a winter of high profile arrivals at the club.

And whether it has been predictions of an unbeaten season, the sudden departure of coach Paul Rowley or a shock defeat at Batley, headlines have again followed Leigh around in recent weeks.

Perhaps that Broncos win will prove a turning point for them under new coach Neil Jukes - who will be under no illusions that he faces his toughest test to date at the Provident Stadium.

Both clubs have made eye-catching signings in recent weeks as they look to bolster their promotion bids.

The Bulls pulled off a significant shock by bringing vastly experienced fullback Richie Mathers out of retirement, and added to that with the arrival of respected Australian forward Rhys Lovegrove.

Leigh - who have suffered a host of injuries to date - signed former Grand Final winner Lee Smith on the eve of that season, and followed that by recruiting Richard Whiting on loan from Hull FC.

The majority of players on display this Sunday will have some sort of top flight experience, and while the outcome of the match isn't going to decide anybody's season, it should provide a decent insight into both teams' prospects for 2016.

Elsewhere in the Championship this weekend, Halifax against Batley looks an intriguing prospect given recent results, while League One clubs get their Challenge Cup campaigns underway with a host of fascinating ties.

There has been much to be positive about outside the top flight so far this season and this weekend should be no different.

DOWN THE YEARS by Chris Heinitz



The fact that Oldham have won more games between the clubs than have Featherstone comes as a reminder that, despite being in the doldrums for the last few years, Oldham is a club with a proud and powerful history. One of the founding clubs of the Northern Rugby League they have won both the Championship and the Challenge Cup three times. Their Championship wins came in 1909-10, 1910-11 and 1956-57. The Challenge Cup trophies were from the 1898-99, 1924-25 and 1926-7 seasons. During that 1924-25

Challenge Cup campaign they defeated Featherstone 26-0 in the third round. That was after Featherstone had had two draws with Halifax before beating them at Headingley in the first round and then knocking out Hunslet in the second round.

The most surprising venue for a match between Rovers and Oldham was when they met at Queens Park Rangers football ground in 1955 in a competition called the ITV Television Trophy. It was only played that year and all the matches were played in London. Oldham won by the narrowest of margins - 8-7.

Other than the 1924-25 Challenge Cup match referred to above, they have been drawn against each other on two occasions. In March 1945 they met twice in the first round. During the war, and a few years following, first round ties were decided by the aggregate score of matches played both home and away. That year, Oldham won both, 18-4 as Post Office Road and 8-7 at the Watersheddings. The only other time they met in the Challenge Cup was in 1964 with Oldham at home. Yet another close match saw Oldham win 9-7. So, Rovers have lost all the Challenge Cup matches between the two teams.

There have been two play-off matches, both won by Fev. In 2004 Rovers won 22-8 in a National League One Elimination Play-Off at Oldham and then in 2007 Rovers won 24-6 in the National League Two play-off final at Headingley securing promotion back to National League One for the flat-cappers. In 1988 the teams met at Old Trafford in the Divisional Premiership final with Oldham winning 28-26 despite Rovers making a gallant second half effort clawing their way back from a 6-22 half-time deficit.

The record of league encounters is very close indeed. In 81 matches, Rovers have won 37, Oldham 38 and there have been 6 draws.




