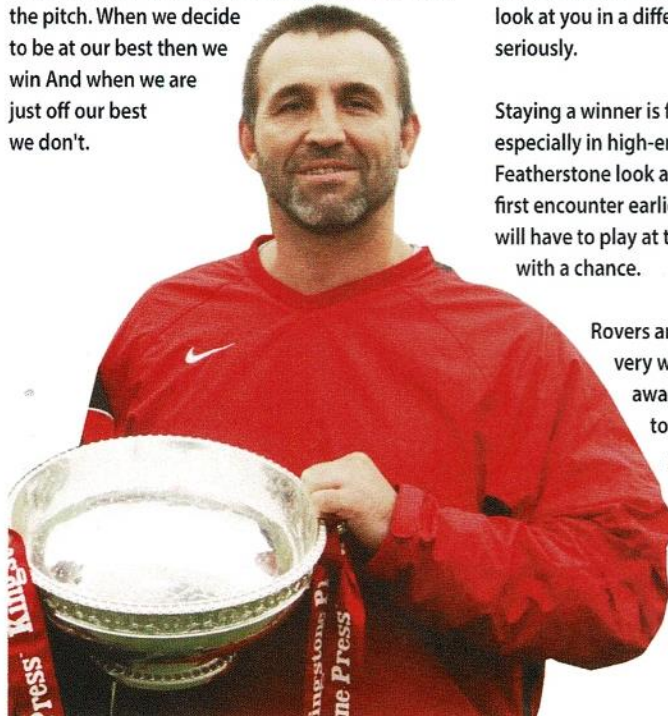
How Scott sees it...

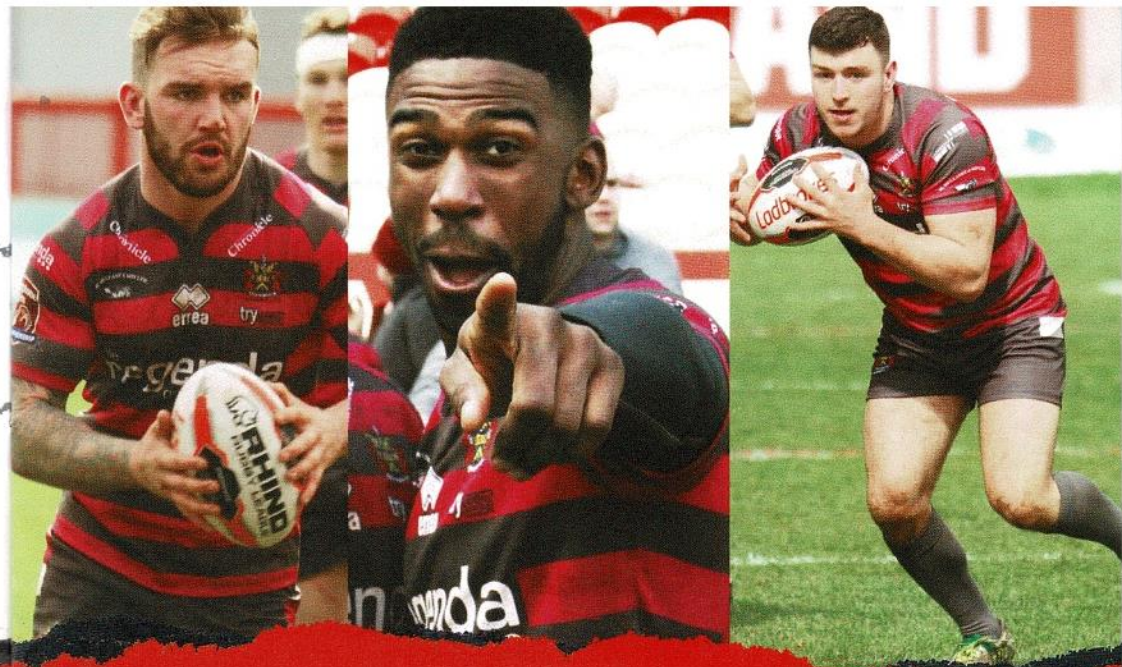

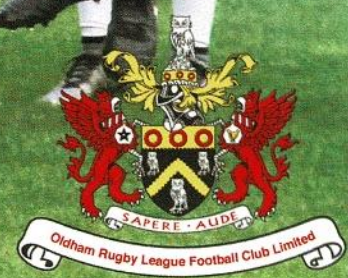
Scott Naylor's men were far superior to their Super League counterparts and were well worthy of the win. Congratulations.

Warrington's visit to Bower Fold will provide our club with its biggest day since we formed in 1997 and, understandably, our chairman Chris Hamilton was in upbeat mood when the draw was made on BBC Radio 4.



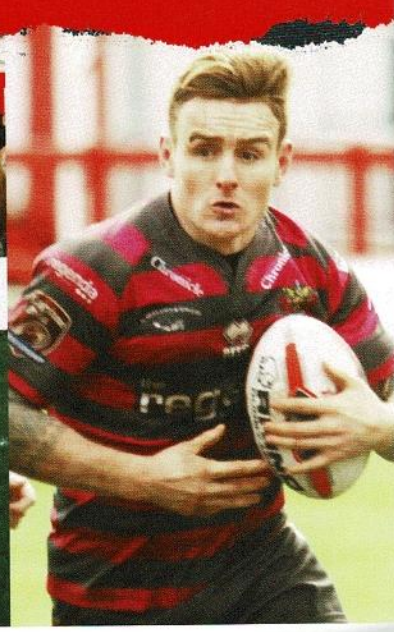
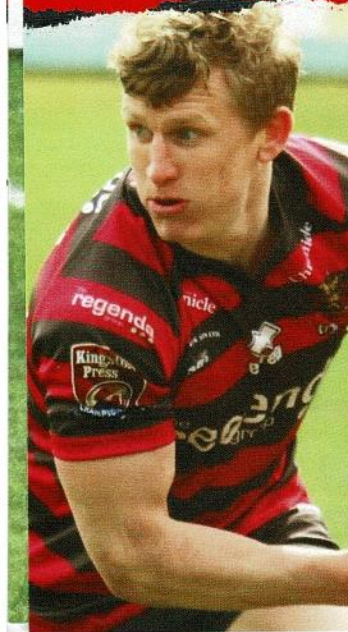
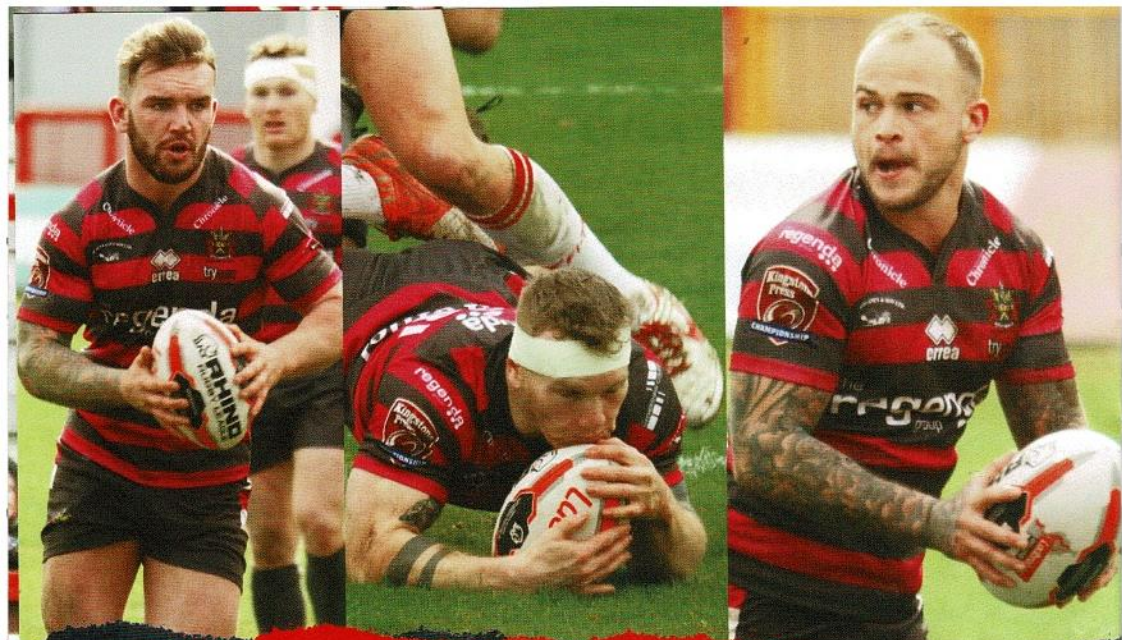
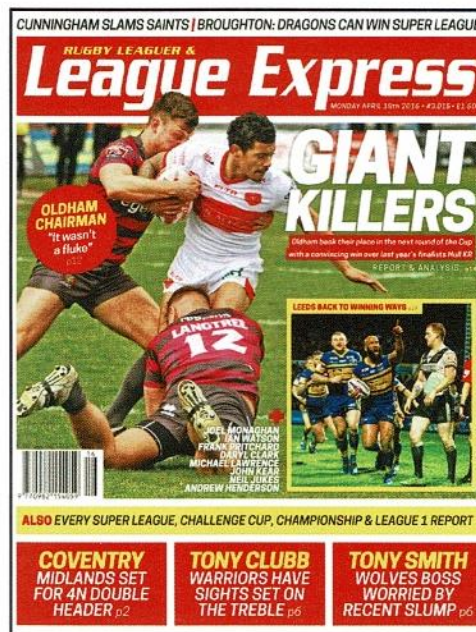
He said: "It's a great tie for us and just reward for an amazing effort in the last round. Warrington are going great guns and hopefully the tie will attract a very good crowd."

A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

AFTER dominating the amateur code for several years, Featherstone were admitted into the professional ranks of the Rugby League in time for the 1921-22 season and first encountered Oldham at Watersheddings on February 18, 1922.

The match saw the Roughyeds victorious 28 – 5, including five tries for winger Reg Farrar.

The return fixture took place at Post Office Road three weeks later when a tight match was decided by a solitary try by Jim Finnerty, leaving Oldham 3 – 0 winners.

Over the years there have been many titanic battles between the Rovers and the Roughyeds, not least the 1988 Second Division Premiership Final at Old Trafford when a last-gasp try from Kevin Meadows, converted by Charlie McAlister, gave Oldham the spoils 28 – 26 after Featherstone had staged a remarkable comeback from a 22 – 0 deficit to take the lead in the final minutes.

Since the Oldham club re-formed for the 1998 season Featherstone have had much the better of the exchanges, winning 12 matches to Oldham's six with one draw. This includes the National League 2 Divisional Final played at Headingley on October 7, 2007 when Rovers clinched promotion with an emphatic victory by 24 points to 6.

Typical of the intense games between the two clubs was the match played at Boundary Park on July 13, 2003. A glorious summer Sunday, with temperatures in the mid 80s, made for energy- draining conditions.

Oldham had a dream start when Lee Doran went over after a defence-splitting pass from Simon Svabic with only three minutes on the clock.

Rovers replied with a try from Jamie Stokes midway through the half, converted by Stuart Dickens, and the scores were locked at 8 – 8.

However, two tries by Will Cowell and Neil Roden, the latter a spectacular solo effort, combined with three goals and a drop from Svabic, put Oldham 19 – 8 up at the break.

The early stages of the second period were dominated by Rovers, who scored further tries by Carl Briggs, Richard Chapman and

Danny Seal, with two goals from Richard Whiting giving the visitors a 24 – 19 advantage.

During this time Doran spent ten minutes in the sin-bin for a professional foul. Going into the final quarter, and back to full strength with Doran's return, Oldham set about their task in fine style.

A break up the middle by prop Dane Morgan set up the position from which Paul Anderson went over. Svabic's conversion nudged the Roughyeds back in front before Roden again showed the Rovers defence a clean pair of heels, after taking an inside pass from Jon Goddard, to cut through for his second try.

Svabic was again on target with the conversion and the victory was made complete with Doran's second try in the last minute to leave the final score 35 – 24 in Oldham's favour.

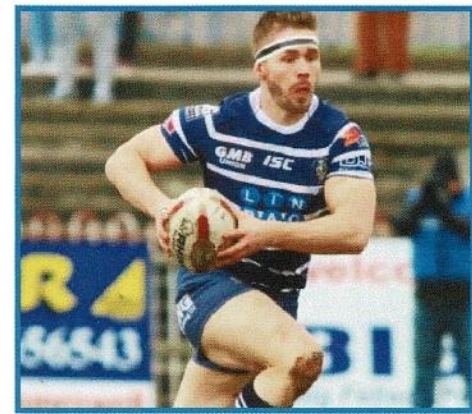
Oldham welcome Featherstone Rovers to Bower Fold today, the first time we've had a home fixture against them since the 2007 season. On that occasion Oldham failed to hang on to a 10-6 half-time lead and the men from West Yorkshire ran out 23-12 winners.

The most recent game between the two sides took place at The Big Fellas Stadium in February when Featherstone capitalised on a slow-starting Oldham, scoring two tries before the visitors had warmed up. The remainder of the game was a closely fought contest and the 20-6 scoreline possibly flattered Featherstone owing to a late try from Kyle Briggs.

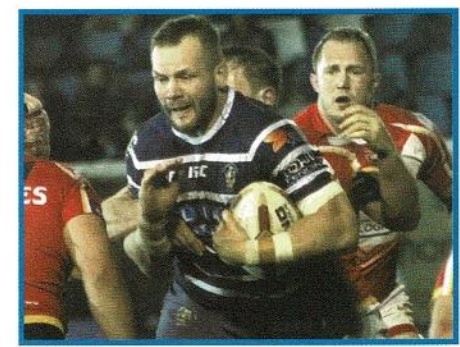
The Rovers star half-back won't have the opportunity to repeat his performance today since he's currently sidelined with ankle ligament damage. Featherstone arrive after being knocked out of the Challenge Cup by Batley followed by a home loss to Leigh Centurions last week. They'll be hoping to return to winning ways today having ran the league leaders very close, the scores were only separated by a try and a goal.

THREE TO WATCH.

ANDY ELLIS
Experienced 31-year-old hooker who is quick off the mark and dangerous from dummy-half. He was named Championship Man Of Steel in 2009 while at Barrow Raiders, also leading the Cumbrian club to Championship Grand Final victory in the same year. He joined Super League club Harlequins in 2010 before moving on to Wakefield Trinity Wildcats in 2011. Now in his fifth season for Featherstone, Ellis opted to take a year-long career break at the end of the 2015 season but made himself available again in March of this year. A key member of the Rovers squad, scoring a try in last week's home defeat by Leigh Centurions.



DARRELL GRIFFIN
Born in Witney, Oxfordshire, Griffin began his career in Rugby Union, graduating through the youth systems at both Oxford and Witney rugby union clubs. The prop-forwards switched codes to rugby league in 2003, signing for Wakefield Trinity Wildcats. He subsequently enjoyed spells with Huddersfield, Leeds and Salford and was a member of the Leeds team that won the 2012 Grand Final. Griffin has gained representative honours, having toured with England in the 2010 Four Nations Series down under.



ANTHONY THACKERAY
A Hull born, 31-year-old half-back who started his career at Hull FC before playing for Castleford, Widnes, Halifax and most recently Dewsbury Rams. He moved to Featherstone this year, signing a three-year deal. The player has made eight appearances this season so far, scoring three tries which include one in the 20-6 defeat of Oldham at The Big Fellas Stadium back in February. Thackeray combines his playing role with one as Community Development officer. His aim is to to develop young talent and encourage more youngsters to get involved with the game of rugby league.
