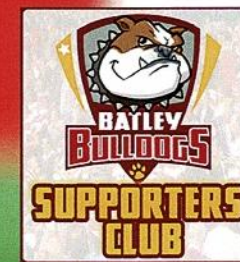

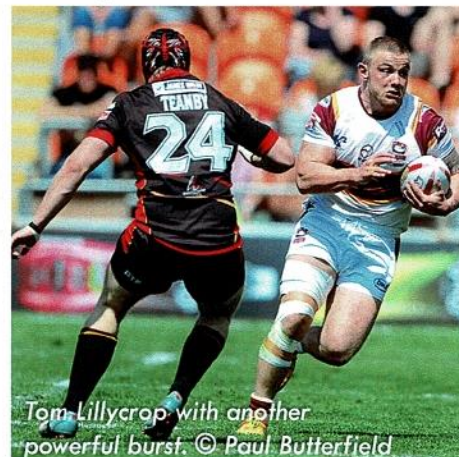

Bulldogs 28-24 Dewsbury

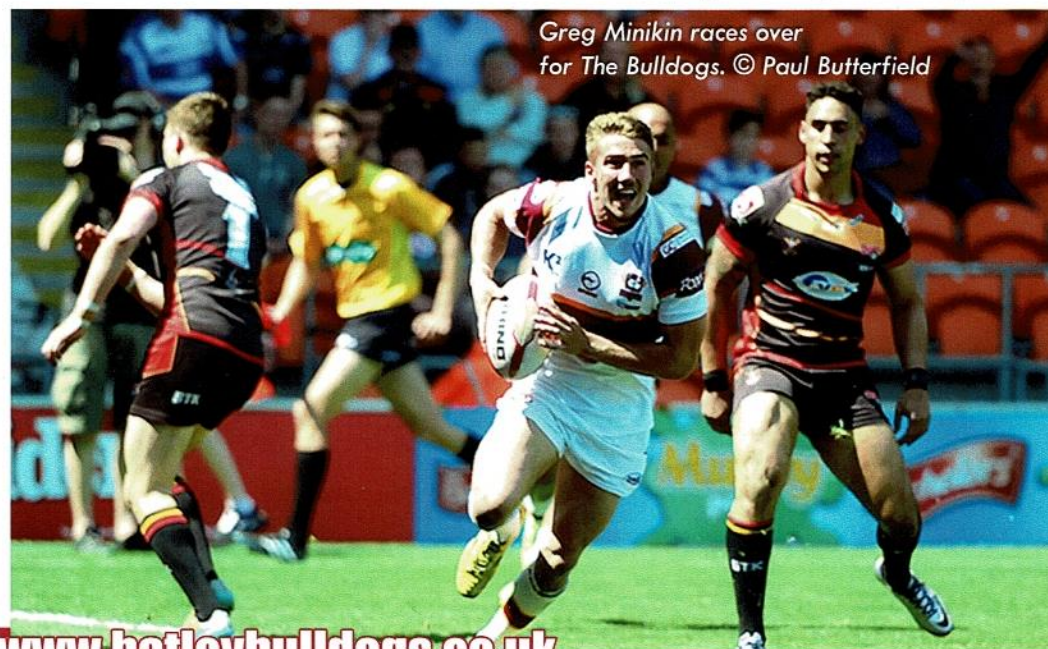
The Bulldogs edged out Dewsbury 28-24 in an error-prone Heavy Woollen derby in the Summer Bash last weekend. The result meant that Batley climbed back into the top four of the Kingstone Press Championship. Tries from Chris Ulugia, Greg Minikin, James Brown and Tom Lillycrop helped the Bulldogs bring a vital two points home from Blackpool.

The Bulldogs fell to a 12-0 disadvantage in the first 15 minutes but the emergence of Tom Lillycrop and man-of-the-match James Brown from the bench turned the tide, with both players scoring tries later on in the game.

Coach John Kear said "I thought the first 15 minutes we were awful and we got battered. We had to do something about that and the introduction of the interchange bench really did stiffen us up and made us better. They have done their job but we really need to look at how we start the game because how we started today wasn't good enough."

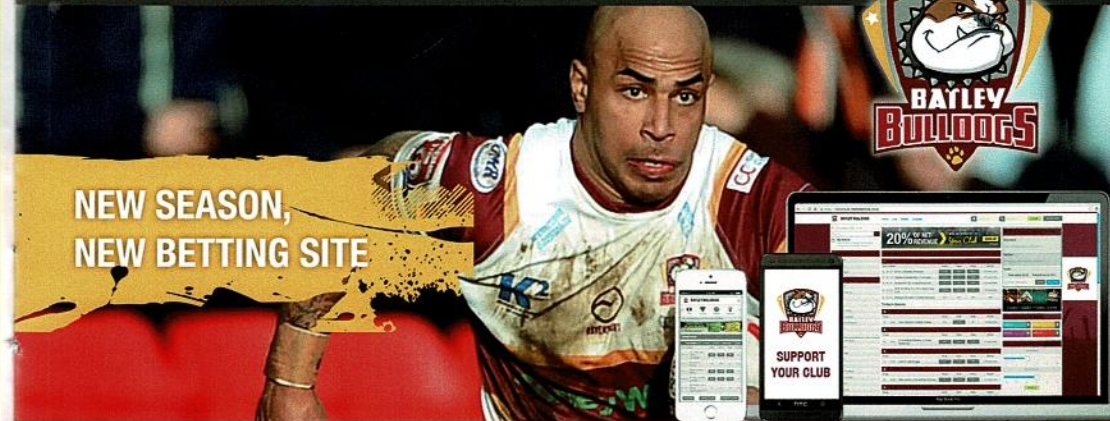

French myths

LEAGUE One promotion hopefuls Toulouse Olympique seem to be defending themselves a lot of late.

The most recent example came in response to Salford owner Marwan Koukash's incorrect claim that they receive more funding from the RFL than any other club in the competition. Koukash initially made the allegation at his colourful press conference that initially focused on his club's salary cap breach before branching off in various different directions.

He then backed that up with the following tweet on Tuesday last week: "Why the RFL are funding Toulouse much more than any League 1 club? I am all for growing RL in France but not at the expense of local clubs."

The allegation was quickly corrected by the French club on the same platform - and has since been verified by the RFL themselves. Their tweet read: "@drmarwank You have the wrong informant. We get the same funding from @TheRFL and we pay for all our trips #lookingforsponsors #cometovisitus."

It's not the first time Toulouse have been at the centre of incorrect statements.

There's a relatively popular myth - reinforced by some League One opponents - that they are running a full-time squad this season under coach Sylvain Houles.

That was put to bed by fullback Mark Kheirallah in an interview in the current issue of Rugby League World magazine.

He explained: "The only real full-timers are the imports - me, Jon (Ford), Rhys (Curran), the two Bentley boys (Kane and Andrew) and Kuni Minga.

"The rest all either work or are at school - certainly all of the French boys work.

"Us full-timers usually have gym in the morning at about 10am, and the French boys join us on their lunch from about 12.15pm to 1.30pm. Then they quickly have to go back to work - it's a fair commitment from them."

Perhaps Toulouse's early success - they have dropped just one point in League One so far, knocked Leigh out of the Challenge Cup and pushed Wakefield hard - has made them an easy target for criticism. But when it's incorrect and misinformed, it's unfair on the French club's admirable aim to try and climb the English league ladder at the second time of asking.

Three seasons in the Championship between 2009 and 2011 failed to bear the kind of fruit the club wanted, and they returned to the French domestic league in 2012, where they would later win back-to-back titles and add a cup triumph.

They felt they had outgrown their domestic league, applied to enter and were accepted into League One, and believe they now have the resources to progress.

Whether or not they will be successful remains to be seen, but the least they deserve is a fair crack of the whip and for unfounded rumours about their status to stop.

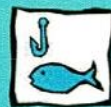

It would be nice too to see Blackpool return to the game one day. The club suffered tumult when they moved to become Chorley and then Trafford Borough, before folding. Of course the League has lost a number of clubs over the history of the game. Some have reformed at amateur level. Indeed, the short-lived initiative at Scarborough lasted just one season in the pro ranks, but happily a Scarborough Pirates team operates in the Yorkshire Men's League.

Similarly, old adversaries of the Bulldogs, Bramley, formed a new fans' owned club and had success in various national amateur summer competitions. After a season out without a team, the Bramley Buffaloes recently returned to the field in the Yorkshire Mens League, but this time playing in Bramley for the first time since the McLaren Field days, attracting a crowd of 250 at the Bramley Phoenix RUFC ground, a crowd that compares well with some of the attendances in League One. Liverpool too had its' club. Liverpool City, who became Huyton, Runcorn Highfield and then Highfield before losing their place in the competition. Maybe the decision to take the Four Nations Final to Liverpool's Anfield will re-ignite interest in that city.

The other "gala" development that has been taking place in recent years has been the growth in representative rugby at all levels of the game. For years we had GB BARLA, the amateur rep team alongside Great Britain, and even a team representing overseas players here, called Exiles. With the England team now at the peak of the rep game we have seen the growth of Scotland, Wales and Ireland. Just recently we saw The Associations Cup being played by teams representing the British Army, England Students, GB Teachers and GB Police.

A cracking tournament was held but there is one vibrant sector of the sport that is crying out for a rep team and international competition. That has got to be a team representing The Championship. Think of the talent there. Keegan Hirst would be a "shoe in". Alex Rowe, Pat Walker, Dom Brambani and James Brown, and several other Bulldogs would all be contenders for selection. This team could play France and the other Home Nations in what would be a meaningful international competition. The games could be held in Championship stadia and our Fox's Biscuit Stadium would have a strong case.

But what needs shouting from the rooftops by the RFL is that the Kingstone Press Championship is a great vibrant competition in it's own right, worthy of bigger crowds, more press and media coverage. With a second successful Summer Bash, exposing Championship Clubs and the competition to a wider public hopefully this will be built upon by the powers that be, so that it stands alongside Super League as a major plank of the sport amongst the population at large. John Kear has said he thinks the Summer Bash should continue, with the odd modification but the Bulldogs determined performance to pip Dewsbury Rams, thanks to the boot of Pat Walker, moving Batley back into the top four, alongside the excellent nature of the other games at Blackpool, underlines the value of this gala event in exposing the quality of the game at this level. Many fans love the idea of a gala day out, or a weekend away, but most of all they want a broader recognition of the vibrancy and quality of their teams and competition.

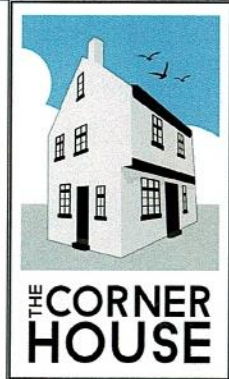

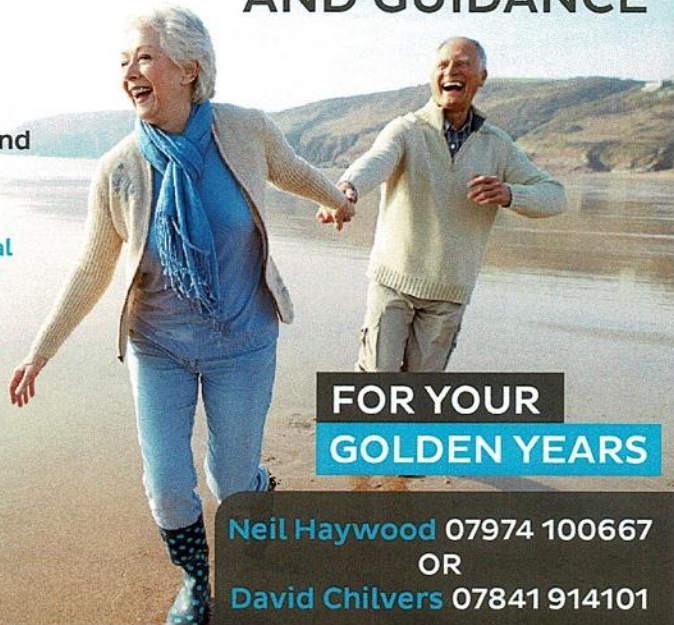
