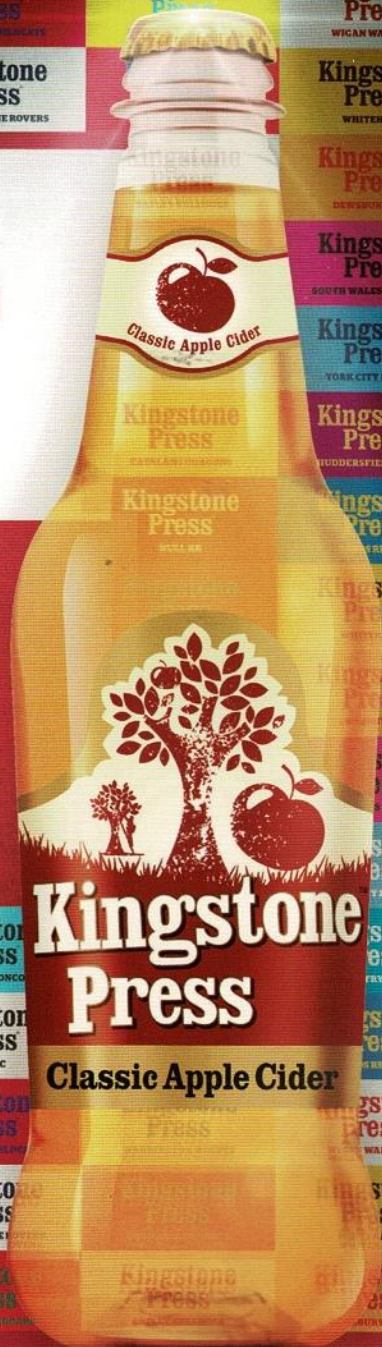

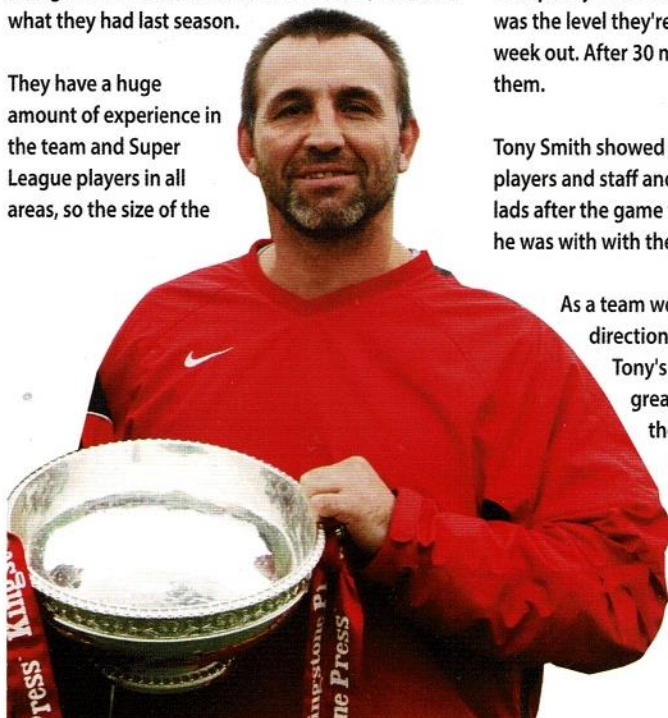
View from the Roughyeds' dug-out

Chris Hamilton... from the boardroom

WELCOME back to Bower Fold for the third week in a row. And what a great three weeks they've been --- first, a fine win against one of the Championship's leading lights in Featherstone; then a big day for all concerned against a star Warrington Wolves team in the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup; and this week another mighty test against a Leigh Centurions team packed with players of Super League quality who, understandably, sit at the top of the division.

I think it's fair to say that these three weeks have underlined what being in the Championship is all about. I know the Warrington match was a cup game but had we been in League One we probably wouldn't have got as far as we did, so there's the correlation.

To enable us to play 'big clubs' on a regular basis was the reward for winning promotion after so many near misses.

Forget the financial disparities that the introduction of the 8s has brought in. We get that and understand the reasons behind it. Also, we relish the challenges that we face each week as a club, on and off the pitch, and it's fair to say we thrive on them.

The lads have shown they are capable of playing on an equal footing with

the best; and we are making a fist of consolidating our status in this division.

There is plenty to work on -- every coach does that week in and week out -- but there is no doubting the commitment of every single member of the squad to what we are hoping to achieve. In that respect, there are a lot of clubs who would like to have what we have, for sure.

Last week's game was harsh in terms of the score. Having only two props against a team of Warrington's quality was always going to make an almost impossible task even harder.

Even so, I'm convinced that anyone who watched the first 25 minutes would have been thinking at that stage that an Oldham win was possible.

We started on the front foot and as Tony Smith and Ashton Sims have said publicly: "They gave it to us early on." Yes, that's us, Oldham, just up from League One, part timers with only two props but 17 giant hearts. We gave it to a team of internationals from both hemispheres. Get in!

Today is another big test against another full-time team who are hoping to get promoted to Super

League. Leigh's Director of Rugby, Derek Beaumont, whom I have known for a number of years, has put his money where his mouth is in an attempt to gain that promotion.

Leigh are the only team so far to beat us by a convincing margin and that was in only our second game at this level. But even then we won plenty of plaudits for the way we played and I know Scott and the lads will be chomping at the bit to have another crack at them.

A final mention about the support the team has been getting. You know we appreciate it. And it does lift the lads, so please keep being loud and proud and who knows what can happen.

A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

In welcoming Leigh to Bower Fold we are up against one of our fellow founding members of the Northern Union (Rugby League). However, the first meeting between the clubs took place on September 1st 1891, some four years before the professional break away from the Rugby Union.

After the formation of the Northern Union, the first season saw honours-even with Leigh winning at home 6 - 0 on November 9th 1895 and Oldham victorious in the return at Watersheddings 23 - 4 the following April.

In those early days the most important match between the two clubs was the Challenge Cup semi-final of 1899 played at Broughton. The Roughyeds were in top form winning 16 - 2 before the assembled 18,000 spectators.

Since then there has been many great games between the red rose rivals with Leigh twice denying the Oldham 'super' team of the late 1950s on the way to Wembley. First in 1955 when 25,000 turned up at Hilton Park to see the home team triumph 5 - 3 in the 2nd round.

Two years later same round, same result! Well almost, in freezing conditions and on a quagmire of a pitch Leigh prevailed 5 - 0. A late try from Stan Owen sealing the home win.

Then there was the notorious match at Watersheddings in January 1984 when the referee abandoned the game midway through the second half for fighting! A particularly bad decision for Leigh who were winning 26 - 14 at the time only to lose the replay 13 - 10 to a last minute try from Ian Birkby two months later.

Since the Oldham club reformed for the 1998 season there have been two NFP elimination play-off matches between the clubs. First in 2000 Leigh defeated the Roughyeds 18 - 10 at Hilton Park but the following year Oldham produced a massive shock by defeating the league leaders 15 - 14. It was on July 8th 2001 at Hilton Park, where Leigh hadn't lost for 18 months, but on the day a mighty effort from the visitors proved just enough.

Oldham dominated the early stages and were unlucky not to take the lead when Leo Casey could not hold the ball after a defence splitting break from Neil Roden. However, they did take the lead soon after with a Pat Rich penalty goal. This was soon followed by a Keith Brennan drop goal which proved to be the decisive score. Unfortunately for the Oldham hooker he was injured a few minutes later but

the Roughyeds had a ready made substitute in John Hough and it was he who scored the first try darting over from close range after Joey Hayes had been held inches short. Another goal from Rich gave Oldham a 9 - 0 lead at the interval.

Leigh got their act together in the second period and tries from Neil Turley, Paul Anderson and Michael Watts with a goal from Simon Svabic put the home side in front. Perhaps the most significant moment came when Dave Whittle also crossed the line only to be held up before he could ground the ball. In the meantime Rich had kicked another goal and within two minutes of Watts' try a swinging move down field was finished off by full-back Mark Sibson who took Turley and Hadcroft over with him as he dived in at the corner. The conversion was missed but the Oldham defence saw out the last ten minutes for a sensational victory.

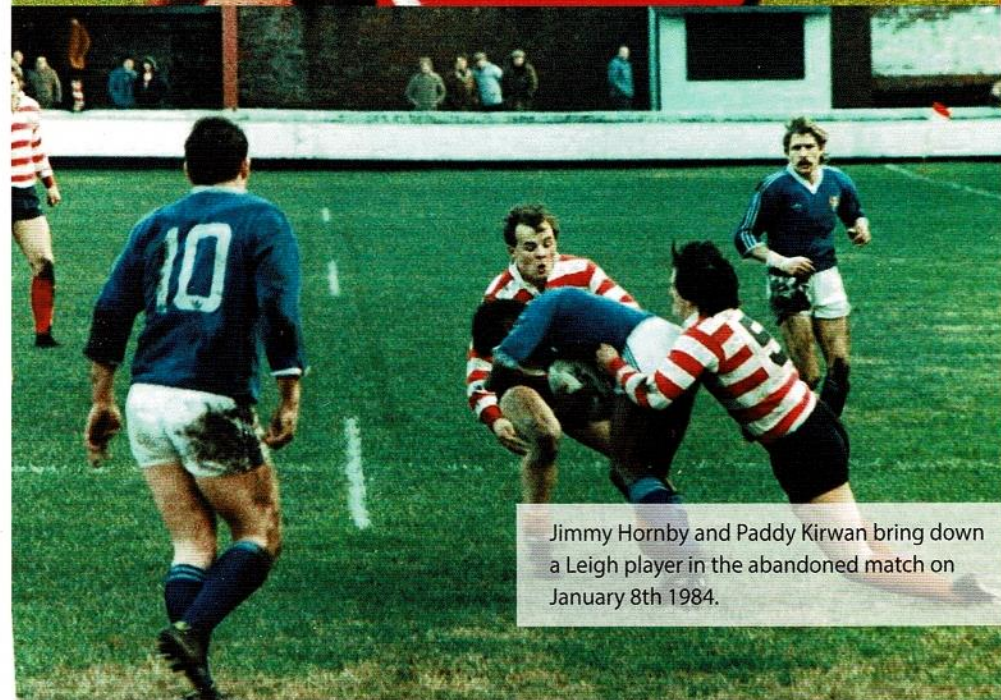

Championship League leaders Leigh Centurions arrive at Bower Fold today fresh from a break due to the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup fixtures last weekend. On the same day that Oldham shocked the rugby league world by defeating Hull KR, Leigh travelled to Toulouse where they lost 10-8 to this season's League 1 newcomers. That defeat meant a free weekend and a chance to take a breather.

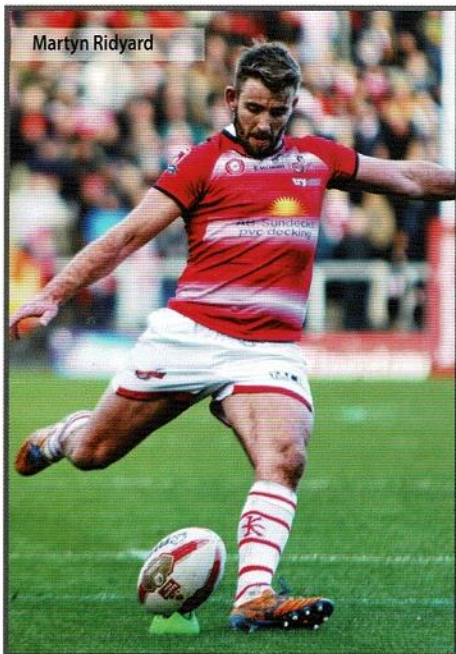
Leigh started their 2016 campaign with one aim, success in the middle-eights at the business end of the season and subsequent promotion to super league. Their intent was evident with keynote signings such as former man-of-steel Rangji Chase, Harrison Hansen and Cory Paterson, all from Salford Red Devils together with Dayne Weston from Melbourne Storm.

A pre-season injury blow for full-back Greg McNally was eased by the signing of former Leeds Rhinos and Wakefield Wildcats man Lee Smith.

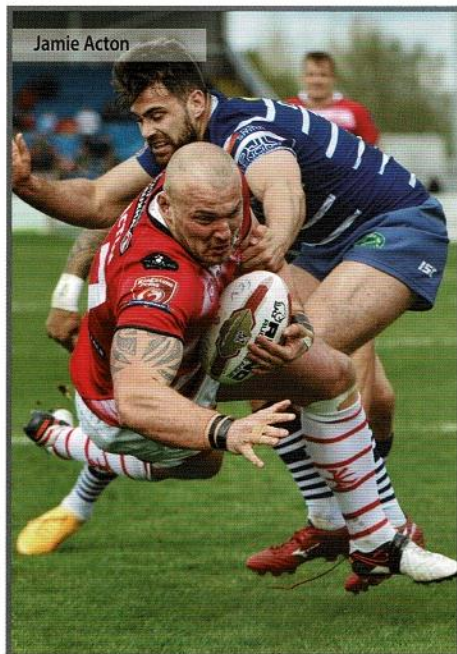
The departure of Ryan Brierley to Huddersfield Giants meant that the new Leigh coach Neil Jukes had to further shuffle his squad, leaving the way open for Ben Reynolds to partner Martyn Ridyard in the halves.

Oldham coach Scott Naylor will take heart from the fact that although maximum points were gained by Leigh in their last two matches, an injury stricken Featherstone pushed Leigh all the way only losing 24-30. Similarly Batley put up a fight on May 1 when they travelled over the pennines looking to complete a league double over the Leythers, only losing out by seven points with the score finishing 37-30 to Leigh. Interestingly, Oldham have also defeated both Batley and Featherstone in recent weeks.

Coach Neil Jukes should be fully aware that Oldham will be keen to bounce back from their Challenge Cup exit at the hands of Warrington. The Wire coach Tony Smith had plenty of praise for Oldham's performance despite the scoreline, comments that will not have gone unnoticed.

Trio of Stars

Martyn Ridyard

Ridyard is a local hero having come up through the ranks of Leigh Miners before turning professional with the Centurions.

He is a former BARLA Young Lions and GB Community Lions international.

Since making his debut in 2009 in Leigh's first season at LSV he has become the third highest goal-kicker and points scorer in Leigh's history.

Martyn enjoyed an outstanding 2014 campaign and carried off the Kingstone Press Championship Player of the Year Award and the Tom Bergin Trophy as Man of the Match in the Grand Final victory over Featherstone Rovers.

In 2015 he continued to earn critical acclaim not least from former GB star Garry Schofield and was instrumental in another successful season.

He is one of only five players in Leigh history to score one thousand points for the Club and has made over 200 appearances and scored over 1,500 pts.

A superb goal-kicker, he kicked 165 goals and two dropgoals in 2014 and followed up with 158 goals and one dropgoal in 2015.

Jamie Acton

One of Leigh's stand-out forwards in 2016 Jamie was recently rewarded with a two-year contract extension.

London born Jamie first played Rugby League with Hemel Stags as a 16-year-old having initially played rugby union. He moved to Wigan Warriors and was a regular in their Under-20s Academy side in 2011 and has also represented England and BARLA at Under-18s level.

Jamie made his senior debut as a dual registered player with South Wales Scorpions in 2012 and later that season played for Oldham.

In 2013 he was a regular in the Workington Town side, before joining Leigh in September 2013 and soon becoming a firm fans' favourite at LSV.

Dayne Weston

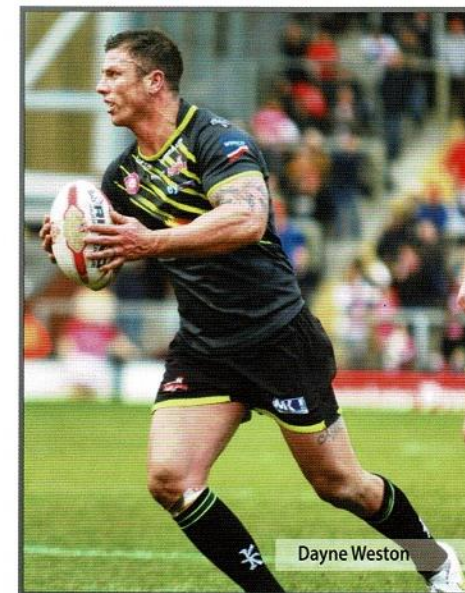
A vastly experienced Australian prop, Dayne has enjoyed an outstanding season so far at LSV and been one of Leigh's most consistent performers.

Dayne agreed terms with Leigh in July 2015 and at 6ft3 and weighing in at 16st7 brings an imposing physical presence as well as top-flight experience to the Centurions pack as he follows in the long line of distinguished Australian players to play for the Club.

Hailing from Goulburn in south New South Wales Dayne earned a scholarship with Illawarra Steelers and began his top-flight career with Cronulla in 2007.

He subsequently played for North Queensland and Penrith and also in the Queensland Cup for Mackay Cutters and Burleigh Bears before joining Melbourne Storm midway through the 2013 season.

He has made a total of 80 NRL appearances and represented Queensland Residents in 2010. Dayne readily agreed to become an ambassador for Leigh Community Trust and makes regular personal appearances in schools and other organisations as part of his valued off field role.
