

## FROM THE TOP

### WITH MARK SAWYER



This afternoon it gives me great pleasure to welcome all the players, officials and supporters of Oldham RLFC to the Tetley's Stadium and a

special welcome to their Chairman Chris Hamilton, someone I have known through rugby league for many years. Chris has worked tirelessly to promote and develop Oldham for a long time and through thick and thin. He has had a lot of issues to deal with over the years (as all chairmen do of course!) and I was delighted for him when they secured promotion at the end of last season.

My main concern however is the Rams and while the 2016 season hasn't gone quite as planned for a number of reasons I was ecstatic with the win at Odsal over a full time Bradford Bulls outfit, I know some of our supporters will be able to remember the last time we won there but I am told it was a long time ago and certainly well before I became involved with the club. Hopefully it will signal a turning point in our fortunes for the rest of the season. We are back in the top 8 at the moment and if we maintain that we will have a place in the Shield Semi-Finals and who knows we could go one (or two!) steps further than last season. But that's for the future. Today's game will be a real tester. Oldham were convincing winners when we played then at Stalybridge earlier this season. On paper they didn't have a great result over at Batley last Sunday but I'm told that they were far better than the scoreline suggested and we will really have to be at the top of our game to pick up the points today.

Rams supporters coming to today's game will probably have noticed the temporary fencing at the bottom end of the entrance road to the South Stand and also at the Bywell Road end of the Main Stand. This is because work has now started on relocating the car park behind the posts. Work will probably take around one month to complete. The idea is to have as level a car park as possible. The land did slope away quite considerably before the work started but the contractors are trying to build the

ground up to make access as easy as possible. Unfortunately the knock on effect of that work has mean space for the car boot sale has become a little more limited and the place was packed to capacity last Sunday when of course it was a lovely warm summers morning.

Once the work on the car park has been completed to our satisfaction then work will start on building the all weather facilities. It is a distinct possibility that this work may start before the end of the season and if it does it may mean supporters will have to use the new car park. We will be looking to ensure that pathways are in place to service both the north and south stands but there may be some temporary inconvenience while the pitches are being built for which we apologise in advance but it will be worth it in the end. Word is already getting round about the pitches, especially the training pitch, with other clubs (including one full time one) already eyeing us as a potential venue for their training sessions.

One other area we do want to develop is the use of our function rooms. We have invested a significant amount of money in upgrading and decorating them and we now need to maximise their potential. We have picked up some new additional day time conferences including clients such as the NHS but we want to develop our evening and weekend bookings again. The licensed trade as a whole has seen a downturn in business over recent vears which has had some effect on us. We have some excellent facilities here at the club and as supporters of the club you could be our ambassadors. It would be really helpful if you could spread the word among friends, family, work colleagues etc. The more revenue we can get in this area the greater our ability to develop our club becomes and we can all play a part in this.

Thank you so much for your support and see you in the Royal Suite after the game for the usual post match presentations and speeches. Oldham supporters are also welcome to join us to meet up with their team as well.

Enjoy the game and have a safe journey home afterwards.

### WITH GLENN MORRISON



Another Sunday and another important game ahead of us this afternoon, I'd like to welcome my fellow coach Scott Navlor and his backroom staff and of course all the Oldham players to

the Tetley's Stadium for today's game.

Many people are viewing this as a must win game for both teams and yes it is important. However there are another 14 games including today left to play and once we go into the 8's competition then it's very much the survival of the fittest! Looking forward to the game and there's absolutely no chance that we will be underestimating the task ahead of us. Oldham showed us earlier in the season that they are a very capable outfit and have the ability to turn over most teams in the league. They did a real job on us at Stalybridge and although we didn't help ourselves with a big error count there was no doubt that they had a game plan for us an executed it to perfection on that day. However we've learnt from that and will have tried to plan accordingly during the week to try to make sure it's us that come away with the points today.

Last Sunday of course we had that tremendous result over at Bradford. I was so proud of the effort that the boys put in. They were literally out on their feet by the end of the game. The temperature was up in the 20's, the other team were all full time players and yet they found the stamina to dig and grind out a well earned win. When Bradford equalised near the end of the game I felt disappointed because I thought we had earned two points not just one. Then to get the penalty right on the hooter was a real bonus. Looking at the video it was a clear cut penalty and I know Bradford had no complaints about it. It was then down to Mr Cool aka Svksev to hold his nerve and land the match winning goal against his and my own former team which for us made victory so much sweeter.

The other pleasing thing about last Sunday was that we finally got our completion rates back into the 90% plus level which is important if you want to be able to control a game. A lot of penalties went against us in the second half which does put you under pressure but the boys were tiring and I felt some calls were just a little harsh.

But that was all last week and you are only as good as your last game so if we don't put in another good performance today we'll have undone a lot of the good work that we did at Odsal. The lads suffered a few knocks but hopefully nothing too serious although Joel Farrell has a hand injury which ruled him out of the Bradford game. As the hard grounds kick in you do seem to pick up more minor niggles and with this in mind we have brought in additional support to provide a Monday recovery session after the weekend games to help ease sore muscles and tired bodies and hopefully this will pay dividends in the last 4 months of the

Looking at the table I feel that, we still have an excellent chance of making the Championship Shield semi-finals although any Top 4 hopes are realistically now beyond us with an eight point gap between ourselves and Featherstone. There is still a lot to play for and I still believe in looking upwards rather than worrying what's behind us. If we play to our potential and win the games we are capable of doing then our aim of a Championship Shield Final is still achievable. Unfortunately so far this season we have lost two or three games we shouldn't have done but that's now history and you can't replay those games. We need to build on last Sunday and push forward for the rest of the season and I know the team buy into that ethos.

Finally thanks to the hardy core of supporters who went to Bradford last Sunday. I know you were massively outnumbered by Bulls fans but your chanting and support of the Rams could be heard throughout the stadium. The players and coaching team do appreciate what you do. Thank you once again.



### RAMS V ROUGHYEDS JAMES MORRIS DIPS INTO THE ARCHIVES



It is perhaps too early in the season to bandy the term 'four point game' around, but the outcome of today's match against Oldham Roughyeds could have massive implications for both side's campaigns. Oldham will make the journey across the Pennines from Lancashire to West Yorkshire for today's clash. Scott Naylor will bring his side to the Tetley's Stadium knowing that they sit just four points behind Dewsbury with a game in hand. Navlor's men currently sit in 11th place in the Kingstone Press Championship table, but will be confident of securing survival come the end of the season with just four points separating the Rams in 7th and the Roughyeds in 11th.

When we were beaten by Oldham earlier this season, it was the first time the two sides had met in the league since both were in League 1 in 2009. That game, played at Oldham in February, saw the home side run out 38-16 victors, inflicting our first defeat of the season upon us. Since then, Oldham have won three more games, leaving them with four wins and 11 defeats from their 15 Championship games. However, Oldham's season has been characterised by a number of

close defeats, including a six point loss to Halifax and a heart breaking 25-24 defeat at the hands of Swinton at the Summer Bash in Blackpool.

### History

Oldham were actually present in the first two seasons of Super League in 1996 and 1997, under the Oldham Bears identity. In the inaugural league, they finished a credible 8th, but the next year saw the Bears relegated, having finished in bottom of the pile. At the end of that season, the club was declared bankrupt with debts of £2,000,000. A new team, Oldham Roughveds, were formed and accepted to play at a lower level. The new team competed in the Northern Ford Premiership and narrowly missed out on promotion back to the Super League in 2001, going down 24-12 to Widnes in the Grand Final. After a series of off the field problems plagued the club in the following years. Oldham were relegated to the third tier of English rugby league at the end of the 2006 season. The side reached the final of the 2007 National League 2 Grand Ginal at Headingley, having beaten Swinton and Barrow in the play offs, but were beaten by Featherstone in the final, Oldham reached the quarter finals of the 2008 Northern Rail Cup, beating National League One sides Salford and Whitehaven in the process. They also once again reached the National League Two Grand Final, but it was a similar story for Oldham fans, this time going down 18-10 to Doncaster at Warrington's Halliwell Jones Stadium. 2009 followed a familiar path for Oldham, as they once again

beating Swinton, Hunslet and York to make their third straight Grand Final, they once again came up just short. Again, they travelled to Warrington, this time to face the Keighlev Cougars who came out on top 28-26 to gain promotion and once more break Oldham hearts. The Roughyeds were becoming known as a 'nearly team' and yet again, they came up just short in 2010. After finishing 3rd, they made it to their 4th Grand Final in a row but were beaten by the York City Knights 25-4. Oldham once again qualified for the play offs in 2011 and 2012 but were knocked out in the early stages. 2013 saw a return to the Grand Final once again for the Roughveds, where they were once more beaten, this time by Rochdale who won promotion to the Championship. Oldham fans will have no doubt been wondering if they would ever be promoted, having missed out on so many occasions. Oldham finished 3rd in 2014, behind York and Hunslet but made it to the Grand Final once again where they came up against Hunslet who they had beaten in the semi-final. However, hearts were broken again when Thomas Coyle scored a golden point drop goal for the Hawks and to consign Oldham to a oth straight season in the third tier of English rugby. What many Oldham fans would have thought was just a dream, finally became a reality last season when, after topping the regular season table. they defeated Keighley in the League 1 Grand Final to finally secure promotion back to the Championship.

### Last time out

After opening the season with back to back wins, the Rams crashed to their first defeat of the season at a rain lashed Bower Fold, Dewsbury trailed 24-0 at the break and eventually went down 38-16 to Scott Navlor's men. Dewsbury had three men sin binned during the game and couldn't stop Oldham running in seven tries throughout the contest. Tom Ashton opened the scoring for the home side in the sixth minute after breaking free down the left hand side. Dale Morton had a try ruled out for the Rams before Gareth Owens extended his side's lead. Dalton Grant was then sin binned for Dewsbury for a trip and during that time, Danny Langtree raced in at the corner. Langtree then got his second when he intercepted a loose Dewsbury pass and raced under the sticks to make it 24-0 at the break. Referee Joe Cobb sin binned Oldham full back Richard Lepori and Dewsbury took full advantage, Dalton Grant pouncing on an Oldham knock on, Michael Ward

responded for Oldham, extending his side's lead to 30-6 before Grant scored his second for the rams. Nathan Conroy was then sent to the sin bin for Dewsbury before Owen went over for his second of the afternoon. Things got even worse for Glenn Morrison's men as Ben Reynolds was sin binned for speaking out of term, reducing his side to 11 men. Adam Clay grabbed Oldham's seventh try four minutes from time before Jack Teanby grabbed a consolation Rams try which Paul Sykes converted.

### **Key Player**

Lewis Palfrey- Half back Palfrey is Oldham's current club captain and is a huge part of Scott Naylor's side. Having had spells with Whitehaven and Batley after leaving Salford early in his career, Palfrey was voted the League 1 player of the year in 2015 having scored 11 tries and 129 goals during the campaign. The former Salford Red Devil joined Oldham prior to the 2013 season having abandoned a plan to

play in New South Wales, Australia. Since then, Palfrey hasn't looked back and will no doubt be a player that the Dewsbury defence will have to keep a keen eye on in today's match if they are to stand a chance of emerging victorious.

One idea might be a post-match barbecue later this summer, but we're open to other suggestions from



What a great performance last time out! I have only seen highlights of the game but it looked like a brilliant day at

Odsal. My good friend is a huge Bulls fan and even he had to give our lads some credit for their miraculous performance.

As I've said previously regards Bradford, they have a brilliant squad and turning them over is no easy feat. But when you have someone like Paul Sykes in your squad then you have always got a chance. I recently interviewed Paul for an upcoming copy of Forty-20 magazine. He was a very down to earth guy but he also had a very professional outlook towards the game. He has seen and done most of that there is to see and do so he is exactly the type of player you want in our situation.

However, whilst the headlines were the last minute kick. I felt Dewsbury were the better team for the whole game and they deserve



Halifax are also a danger but they can be beat, no question about it.

I would love for Dewsbury to win the shield and carry that momentum into next year. That could start today against Oldham. They have struggled this season and I think after last week's victory the lads can play without fear. I expect a tight first half but the Rams to run away with it in the second half.

Whatever happens, let's hope for an entertaining game which has positives for both sides but ultimately hope the points stay in West Yorkshire.

# PICKS OF THE WEEK

Ahead of today's Championship clash with Oldham Roughveds, we take a look at some of the stories and results from the past week of the wider world of rugby league.

### Hull KR Secure New Signing

As the Super League approaches the business end of the season, it is no surprise that those clubs outside of the top 8 are looking at new blood ahead of the next campaign. However, Hull KR, whose city rivals currently lead the way in the Super League, have seemingly completed a deal to recruit Nick Scruton.

The 31 year old prop's move to the Lightstream Stadium is made somewhat strange given the England international figured in current employer's Wakefield Trinity Wildcats 16-54 defeat to his 2017 side Hull KR. In addition to that, Scruton is a former Hull FC loanee, although his short stint there was a dozen years ago. Since then, he had a five year spell with last weekend's opponents Bradford Bulls before joining the Wildcats at

the start of last season.

There are rumours that Albert Kelly could make the opposite move, to ply his trade at Belle Vue in 2017 having scored two tries in the 54-16 crushing with his current team. He has previously worked with the Wildcats' coaching team.

### Hardaker Aches for Down Under

With the news that 2015's Man of Steel Zak Hardaker has been made available for transfer by Super League champions Leeds Rhinos having died down, the list of potential suitors for the full-back is now the main issue on most people's lips.

Any club would be lucky to have Hardaker and no doubt every Super League club would be willing to take a punt on the 24 year old. However, it seems that Hardaker will be heading to somewhere sunnier than Wigan or St Helens for example.

Hardaker will reportedly command a £300,000 fee, and Penrith

Panthers are the supposed frontrunners for his signature. However, it is likely to be anything but a straight race for the highly coveted star, with Gold Coast Titans, Newcastle Knights, and Canberra Raiders all potentially vying for his signature.

There are still more ifs than certainties at this stage of the season, but either way, the saga will be interesting. Only time will tell where Hardaker is plying his trade in the 2017 season.


