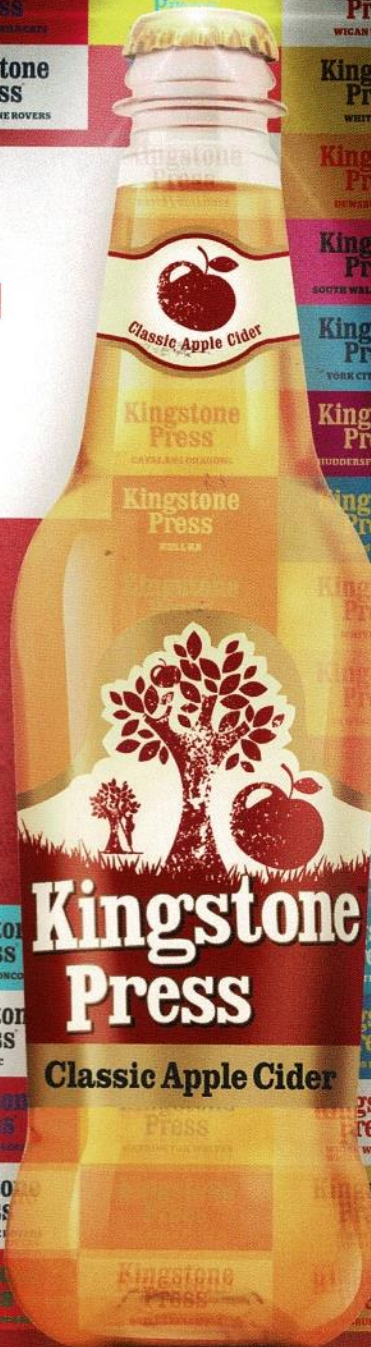

How Scott sees it...

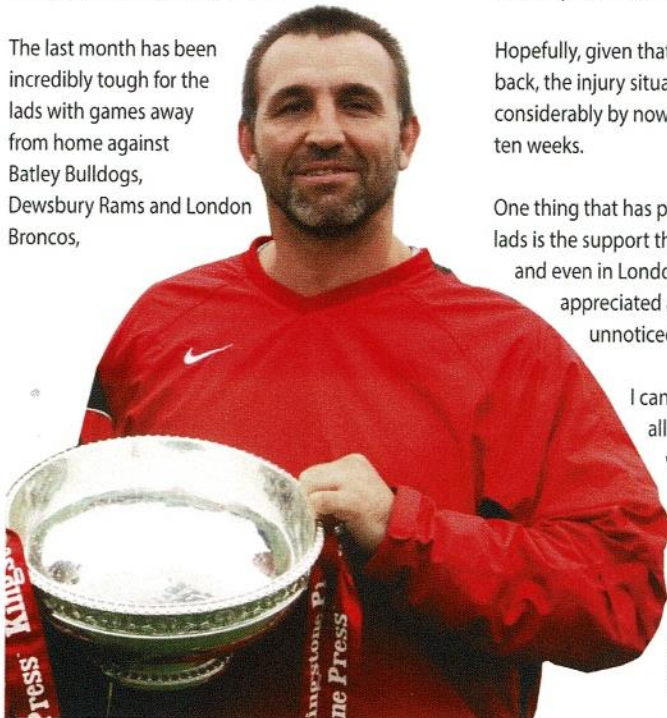
View from the Roughyeds' dug-out

Top-table topics...

Chris Hamilton... from the boardroom

WELCOME back to Bower Fold for what is a big game for both ourselves and for Whitehaven. After a run of defeats against some of the full-time teams and other top teams in the division we have reached one of those points I made reference to before the season started.

I made it clear that the players would face different challenges this season, suggesting we might suffer a run of defeats before going into a crucial game that, if possible, we would need to win.

That is exactly where we find ourselves now. I think it is important, however, that we regard today's game as an opportunity (to pick up precious league points), rather than anything more sinister or more decisive. We will certainly be keen to get what could be a very important two points from our friends up in Cumbria.

We should hopefully have a couple of players coming back from injury, which will also make a difference to us.

This is the first opportunity I have had to write programme notes since the tragic death of Ronan Costello, the 17-year-old academy player from our partner club, Huddersfield Giants. It was a tragic accident in which a young man lost his life. He had most of his life

ahead of him and his family were rightly and understandably proud of him.

It provided a reminder of the sacrifices and the risks taken regularly by all players, not only to fulfil their own dreams and ambitions, but to satisfy the lust we all have for the great game of rugby league. We generally take for granted what players do to put on a spectacle for us every week. Add to that, the thousands who play in the community game and it really hits home how lucky we are to have so many dedicated players within our ranks.

Back to this season and Wayne Bennett has announced his 31 players who will form the squad for the Four Nations Series later this year. Perhaps the biggest surprise was the inclusion of Stevie Ward, who has yet to play a game this season for Leeds Rhinos after suffering a serious injury. Given the brutal nature of any match against the Kiwis and the Aussies, this looks like a big gamble, although I'm sure Stevie must be absolutely delighted.

The other thing that struck me was the number of Leeds players in the squad. I think there were about seven. Given the sort of season Rhinos are having,

that was a bit of a surprise initially. On closer inspection, though, you look at the names that are in there and you think... yes, I'd pick him... and him too, etc, etc.

It just goes to show that Super League 2016 has been, and still is in many ways, a crazy division. Rhinos, after all, are currently bottom of the pile!

Back to today's game and I ask, as ever, that you continue to give the lads your wholehearted support as we enter a vital stage of the season.

Oldham children take Summer Bash by storm...

Our Community Programme goes from strength to strength ...

THANKS to our Community Programme's successful application to the National Lottery for an 'Awards For All' grant, which realised funding of £8,100, more than 100 children from local primary schools took part in a dance extravaganza during the RFL's televised Summer Bash event in Blackpool.

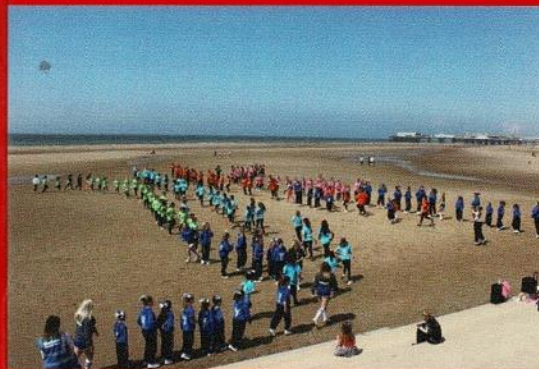
With thousands of rugby league fans watching in Blackpool's Bloomfield Road Stadium, the children from Oldham joined forces with smaller numbers from two or three other clubs to perform on the pitch during the half-time break in the game between Oldham RLFC and Swinton Lions. We were informed that we had far more children involved --- 114 to be precise --- than any of the other participating clubs.

'Our' children were from Greenhill, Alexandra Park, Medlock Valley, Holy Rosary, St Martin's, St Hugh's and Richmond primary schools, which form Hathershaw College's cluster group.

The College's Lorna Phillip, who is heavily involved with the cluster group and who worked tirelessly with Oldham RLFC to bring this about, said: "It was a fabulous day for all concerned, especially the children. Parents and primary school Heads and teachers got involved, and the children loved it.

"It certainly won't be the end of plans to promote dance in our local primary schools. I'm sure the schools will be building on all that has been going on over the past few months,"

In a project called 'Oldham Moves', which was designed to get more boys and girls interested in dance, the children spent several weeks learning a specific routine in after-school clubs. They then got together at Hathershaw College for a collective rehearsal a couple of days before the big event.

Once in Blackpool, they teamed up with children from other clubs for a mass rehearsal on the beach in readiness for their big performance in the stadium later in the day.

The entire project was overseen by RESI-DANCE, working in conjunction with the RFL, and it was from RESI-DANCE that Oldham RLFC was invited to take part subject to a successful application to the National Lottery.

Said Oldham RLFC chairman Chris Hamilton: *"This was another great example of the work we are doing in the local community."*



"Most of the Oldham children involved had never done anything like that before and to perform on such a big stage in front of thousands of people at a televised sporting event was a wonderful experience for them, something they will remember for the rest of their lives."

In other Community Projects, we followed up our tag-rugby programme in the Hathershaw cluster schools by inviting them to Bower Fold for a curtain-raiser.

And we have continued, throughout the season, to host visits by the junior sections of local amateur clubs, to play curtain-raisers; to act as escorts to the Oldham players when they walked out on to the pitch; and to enjoy laps-of-honour at half-time.

The latest of several such visits was by the under-10s of St Anne's and Saddleworth Rangers, who were with us for the re-arranged game against Bradford Bulls on Wednesday, June 15.

A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

Whitehaven were first admitted into the Rugby League for the 1948-49 season and the first game against the Roughyeds took place at Watersheddings on February 18th 1950 with Oldham emerging triumphant 17 - 3 thanks in no small measure to a hat-trick from winger Joe Warham. The return fixture was the last match of the season when 'Haven gained revenge with a 5 - 3 victory.

That initial reverse at the Recreation Ground set a trend of Oldham struggling to make an impact when in Whitehaven and it wasn't until January 1957, at the ninth attempt in league and cup matches, that the Roughyeds came away the victors, although they had managed no less than three draws before their eventual success.

The new club first played Whitehaven in a 6th round Challenge cup-tie up in Cumbria on February 28th 1999. The home side eased through to the next round with a 18 - 2 defeat of the Roughyeds and completed a league and cup double with a victory at Spotland on May 30th by 32 - 24. (Only one league

match was played between the clubs that season).

Oldham flattered to deceive in this match by being well on top until the last quarter. After Whitehaven had gone into an early 6 - 0 lead the Roughyeds fought back to go in at the interval with a 12 - 6 advantage thanks to tries from Jason Clegg and Ian Sinfield and two goals from Australian scrum-half, Daniel Brown.

Things got better still after the break when Nathan Varley won the race to touch down a kick ahead from Brown who duly converted the try and then added a penalty to leave Oldham 20 - 6 to the good after 55 minutes. However, at this point the game was stopped for nearly ten minutes after what appeared to be a serious injury to hooker John Hough who was stretchered off the field.

Hough's injury wasn't as bad as was first feared but Oldham never got back into their rhythm whereas the visitors turned on the style to score tries from Hetherington (2), Lester, Purdham and Wilson to add to the first half touch-down from Lewthwaite.

Five of the six tries were converted to put 'Haven on 32 points and although Paul Round went over with five minutes left, this time Brown was unable to add on the "extras" and the Cumbrians held on to their eight point margin to seal the victory.

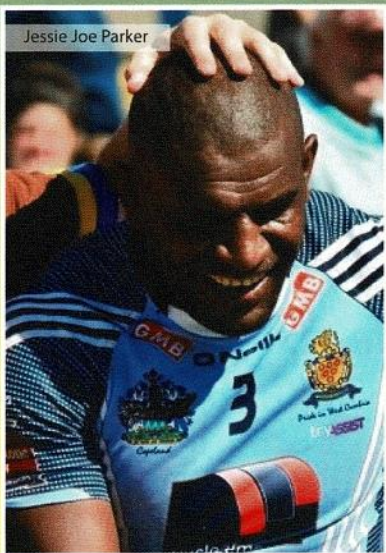


WHITEHAVEN RLFC

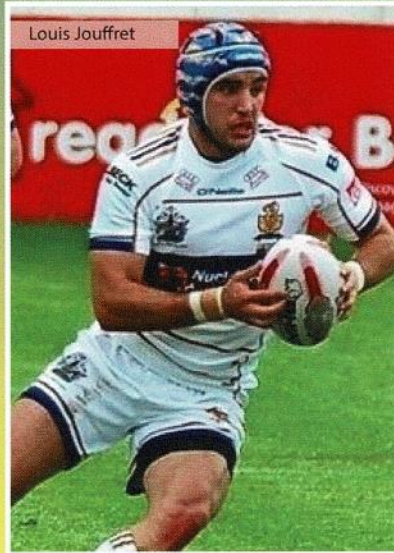

Over 100 appearances and 50 tries have followed since his arrival at the Recreation Ground and Jessie Joe continues to pose a threat to opposition defences.

Craig Calvert

Winger who has recently notched up his 300th appearance for his club and surpassed the all-time try scoring tally of Whitehaven legend David Seeds. Calvert made his debut for Whitehaven in 2004 and regularly heads the list of leading try scorers.

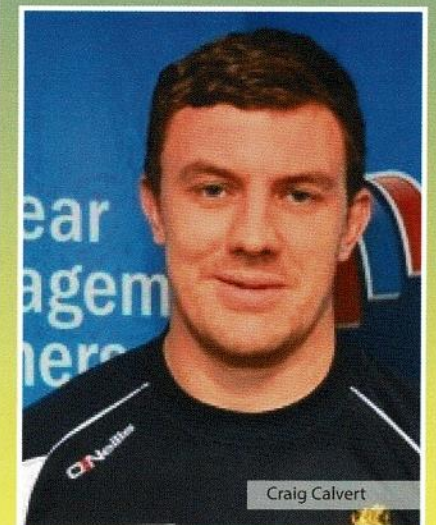
This season Craig has amassed 10 tries in 14 appearances.

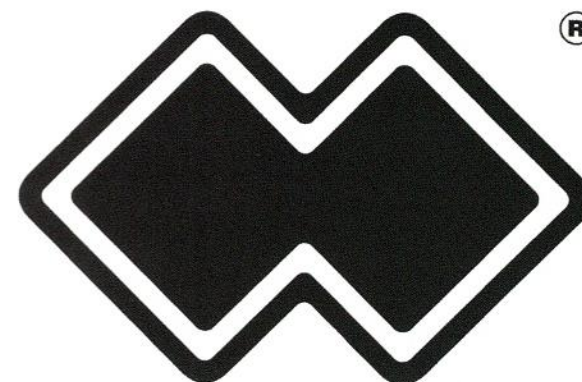
