

# CHAIRMAN CHAT - BY EAGLES CHAIRMAN IAN SWIRE

I would like to welcome the directors, supporters and players of Oldham Roughyeds to the Sheffield Hallam University Sports Park for this evening's Kingstone Press Championship fixture. Both teams broke their losing sequences last weekend and will be looking for back-to-back victories.

## MATCH REPORT - FEATHERSTONE ROVERS BY MATT YOUNG

Sheffield Eagles ended a run of six consecutive league defeats after a 35-10 victory over Featherstone Rovers.

The Eagles eased their relegation fears after recording their first victory since April 29 following a stirring performance at Bawtry Road. With new signing Nathan Chappell in the side, plus the availability next week of Catalans loan duo Stan Robin and Thibaut Margalet, the Eagles finally have some momentum going into a crunch clash with fellow strugglers Oldham on Friday.

The Eagles made light of the form book to make a blistering start which stunned their top four chasing opponents. Their early pressure was rewarded on 11 minutes thanks to a brilliant individual score from Cory Aston. The half-back jinked back on the inside, then threw a sublime dummy before diving over. Aston converted his own score.

The Eagles increased their lead when a flat pass from Keal Carlile was collected by Scott Wheeldon who breezed through for the second try. Aston converted. After a delay for an injury to Rovers' Michael Channing, the Eagles resumed their strangle-hold on proceedings. Debutant Chappell's offload in the tackle ricocheted off Jamie Foster into the hands of Ben Blackmore, who scored in the corner. Aston missed the extras. An errant elbow saw Mark Mexico in the

bin, but despite being a man light the Eagles were in again when a loose pass allowed Garry Lo to sprint 70 metres to score. Somehow Aston failed to extend the lead after missing the kick in front of the sticks. The visitors gave themselves hope through Jamie Cording's try which was converted by Foster. Rovers then put the Eagles under a sustained period of pressure, not helped by Duane Straugheir being the second player to see yellow.

The home side's resistance was broken on 52 minutes when James Duckworth squeezed over, but Foster missed the conversion. With the visitors sensing an opportunity, the Eagles got the crucial next score through Menzie Yere following Aston's grubber kick, but the latter failed with the kick. The game was sealed when an error gave the Eagles posses-

sion with Aston handing over to Blackmore for the sixth try, which wasn't converted. It didn't matter as a Michael Knowles drop goal, and a late Elliot Minchella try added the gloss to the performance, with Aston this time kicking the extras.

LAST season's Championship campaign was characterised, in part, by the stunning late-season progress of Richard Marshall's Halifax.

A nine-match winning run propelled them into the competition's top four, and they then won two games in the Qualifiers, ensuring they finished above both Sheffield and Leigh in the final shake-up.

Now it looks like history could be repeating itself. Given last year's achievements, and the increased central funding that brings, there were heightened expectations for 2016.

And by Marshall's own admission, they were failing to live up to those early in the season. A shock home defeat to Swinton in April - having lost three games straight in February/March - left Fax off the top four pace.

But since that Lions loss, Marshall's charges have lost just once in nine league matches (at Batley, while they also drew at Whitehaven last month with a late Gareth Moore try). In that run has been emphatic wins over Sheffield and Featherstone, the

latter of whom they beat 37-0 in an eye-catching Summer Bash performance.

On Sunday they brushed aside full-time local rivals Bradford, with the final 32-24 scoreline at Odsal not telling the full story - Fax were 32-12 up before a late Bulls rally.

It was their fourth straight win against their West Yorkshire neighbours, signalling a shift in power that has lasted the entire summer era and beyond. Sunday's result puts Halifax in third with four Championship games remaining.

And although their top four spot

is far from assured - fifth placed Bradford remain only a point behind - their destiny is very much in their own hands.

Marshall, as is his way, was not getting carried away after the match.

"There's still a long way to go," he said

"But to put in that performance, taking into account with had 15 players (Matt Sarsfield and Ben Heaton were injured in the first half) was outstanding - better than last year's Qualifiers.

"The players should be very proud of that performance."

It should be noted that Fax have arguably the toughest run in of any team in the Championship now. After this week's game against ever-improving Swinton, they still have to travel to full-time top two Leigh and London, with Qualifiers rivals Featherstone sandwiched in between.

But with the likes of Moore, Ben Johnston and Adam Tangata in fine form at the moment, Marshall's charges will fear no-one in coming weeks

will buy better foods. The thing with forming habits is to start with the simplest habit possible that will lead you to the next necessary action towards achieving your goal.



We have the core of this side signed up for next year and with the addition of new players in some key positions, I am confident that we can once again become a force to fear in this competition.







# TODAY'S VISITORS - BY EAGLES MEDIA EXECUTIVE ADAM WHITESIDE

Following the Eagles first home victory since April last weekend this week's visitors are the Oldham Roughveds.

Oldham managed to put an end to their horrible run of form last weekend with a 26-18 victory over Whitehaven in which the Roughveds managed to score all of their points unanswered. This win ended an eight-game losing streak for Oldham which dated back to 1st May. The Roughyeds currently sit in 11th place in the Championship table but are five points above bottom club Workington Town and they also sit just two points behind the Eagles.

Last season Oldham gained promotion to the Championship for the first time since 2006. Oldham topped the League One table finishing two points ahead of the Keighley Cougars who they then defeated in the League One Grand Final 31-20. An impressive season for the Roughyeds saw them lose just three league games all season.

Scott Navlor is the current coach of Oldham and has been since his appointment in 2012. Navlor guided Oldham to promotion last season and now has the task of establishing the Roughyeds as a long-term Championship side. The 44-year-old had spells at Wigan, Salford and Bradford during his playing days and also represented England on four occasions. His success as a player came as part of a Bradford Bulls

side who won the 2001 Super League Grand Final as well as beating Newcastle Knights in the 2002 World Club Challenge.

Full-back Richard Lepori is an instrumental player for Oldham and will pose a threat throughout the game much like he did when the Eagles travelled to Oldham earlier in the season. Lepori often slots into the attacking line at pace creating an overlap before finding wingers such as Adam Clay and Jamel Chisholm who both cause serious danger down either flank.

In the forwards Oldham second-rower Danny Langtree managed to crash over for two tries in the space of five minutes in their recent victory over Whitehaven and he will be looking to carry over his try-scoring form into the game versus the Eagles. Oldham also have a trio of loanees from

1st placed club Leigh Centurions with Jonathan Pownall, Tom Spencer and Lewis Foster all currently in their squad and all possessing a lot of talent in the pack.

The Roughveds currently play their home games at Bower Fold which is also the home of Stalybridge Celtic FC. They have had a number of grounds over the past few seasons including Park Lane and Whitebank Stadium following the news the club would no longer be able to share Boundary Park with Oldham Athletic FC. Their current home holds 6,500.

Oldham head into the final four games of the regular season trying to close the gap on the rest of the league and their sole aim from the Championship Shield will be to avoid relegation and secure a second season in the Championship.

This week, we recieved an email from 16-year old Eagles supporter Courtney who wrote about her feelings when Don Valley Stadium closed as part of a school project. Courntey's article is below and we'd like to thank her for this piece:

I was at the heart of so many people. It was so many people's dream to be my best friend, but like everyone, there was some people who hated me and wished that I had never been brought into this world. Could I help it? Could I change? No! All around me, there were different groups which merged into one massive- but not ginormous popular group on weekends, which was out to bully everyone else.

It was like a school playground, with the popular groups which runs the school, the unpopular groups- who wished they were popular- and the groups who were popular occasionally or when something needed doing. But, at the end of the day if anyone needs anything we are all there for each other and stay loyal to each other. We was like a massive family. I was a baby that everyone adored.

Lonely, that is what I am apart from that one day every few weeks when the Sheffield Eagles RLFC are playing. A supreme rush of elation went through me, and I had a party. All over Sheffield and different parts of the country, everyone wanted to

come to mine for that day, and it was always a magical day for some people but a wretched day for others. All the laughter and happiness coming from my best friends is the best feeling in the world. But, the unhappiness of them is the worst feeling existing and I am distraught for them and just want to cry for them. I love everyone enjoying themselves in my modern but debilitated home. It was like a shooting star making my dreams come true every few weeks.

Everyone around me, leaves me to go to a different part of the country when Eagles aren't playing at home. I taste the cold and lonely air, sympathising with me. Loneliness, that's what I can taste. Would you like to be used? Be owned by someone else so you can't change it? I didn't agree to this? I was a massive 'fan' of dog-racing and have parties for that; then racing (e.g. race for life) and now rugby league. How is this fair? I wish there was a way out of this godforsaken deal. I was quite big in both ways, but it is what made me how I am and I thought that everyone loved me for it and didn't want me to change. I thought I had an amazing life ahead of me...

Then, they couldn't afford to keep me, so they destroyed me...

The pain I felt when they murdered me was a bullet going through my heart and shattering it. All I am is an empty shell with nothing inside. I am just waiting for the day when my destiny is made. I am waiting for the day when I will be told my fate. All I am now is a discarded site.

All the memories, gone! All my friends can see of where I was is a massive building site. Disgusting, all the scree and rubble is frightening. It is like someone has taken a massive sports stadium and annihilated it. I see people coming up and crying because I was a big part of their lives. I see the tram going to and from Meadowhall and people are looking at my out of the window devastated and sobbing their hearts out at the fact that I am gone. Even though it is a building site, there are gorgeous flowers and notes there as people have built a little memorial for me.

A piece of me falls off and hits the ground. It drops onto my death certificate. It was so hard to read it. It reads: Don Valley Stadium (also known as DVS or The Home of The Sheffield Eagles RLFC)! It was me, I was the demolished, abandoned stadium. It was the hardest things I ever had to hear.

#### CRASH!

All of my body starts being torn apart and a plan is laid on top of me for a new stadium. After all these years, I can't believe that they are just going to supplant me.

Also in the match against Featherstone, a lot of praise was directed towards Cory Aston. And rightly so.




