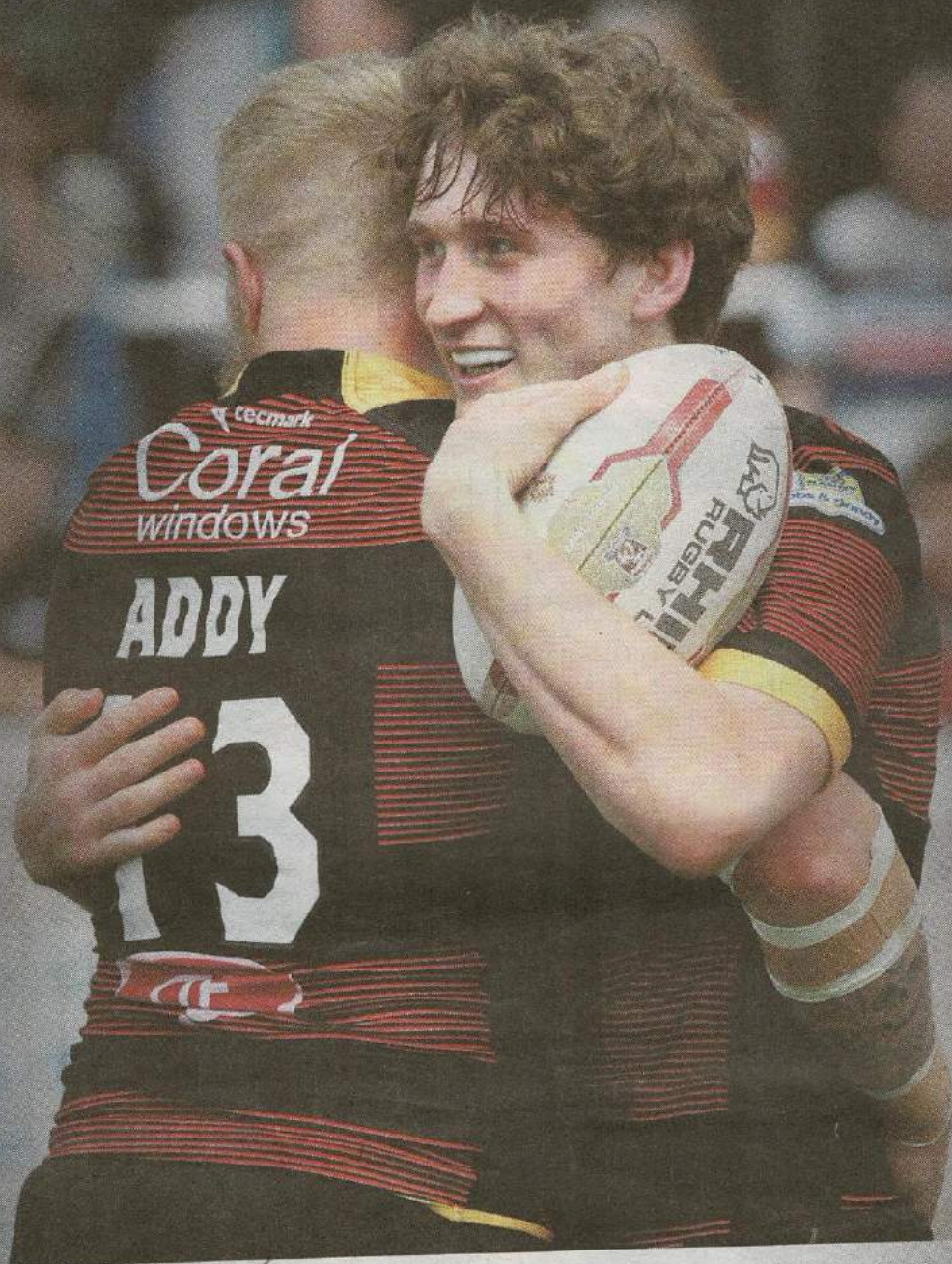

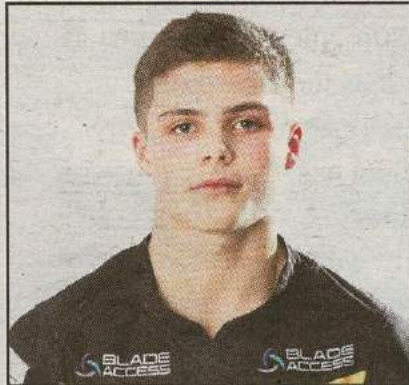

We cannot control the other fixtures which go on today. My job is to coach the lads into a performance against a tough Oldham team, who will be looking to put in a fighting performance.

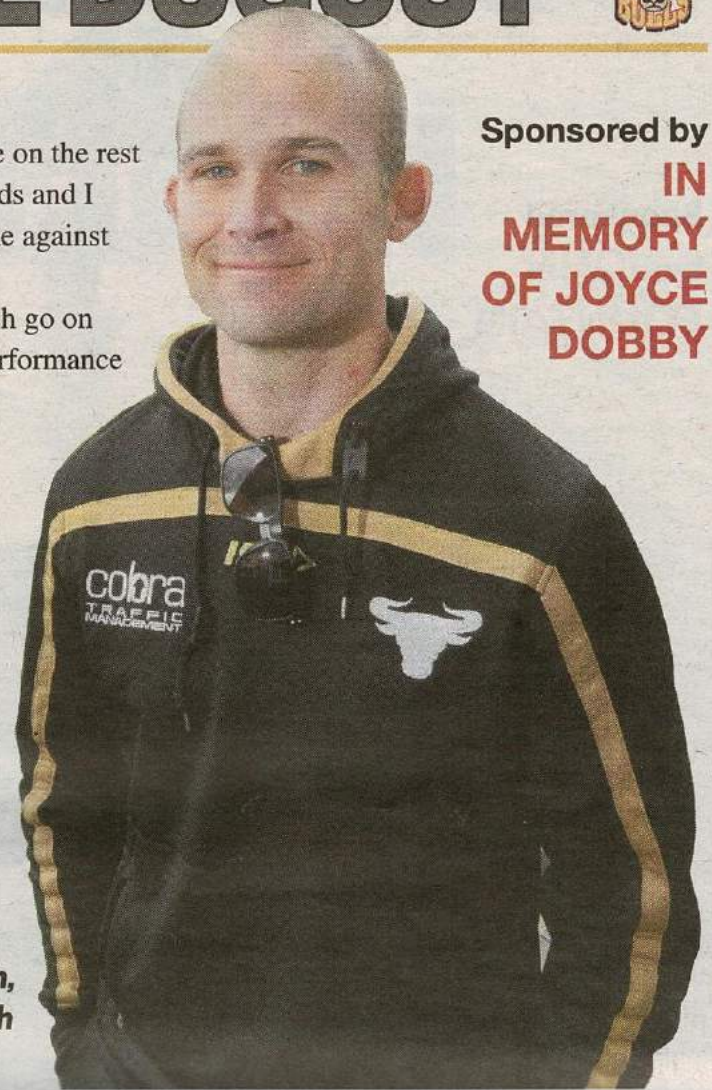
If we can take the same attitude and professionalism from the Whitehaven game, then I am sure we will be in a good position to claim the two points today.

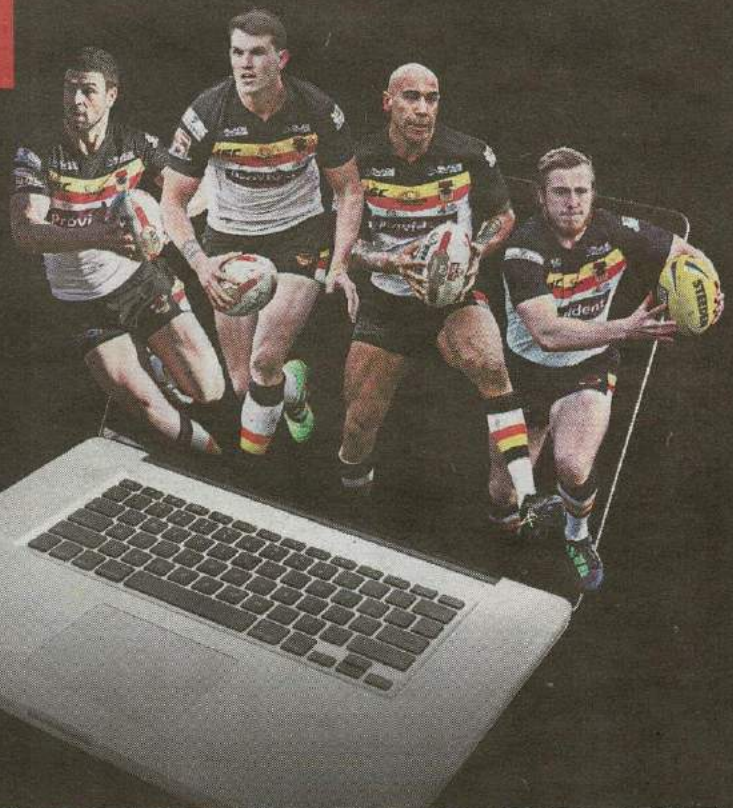

EVER PRESENT TASK

TWO rounds remain of the regular season and Bradford Bulls returned to winning ways in considerable style with a 64-18 thumping against Whitehaven last week.

The win saw the Bulls move to within a point of the top four placings, just behind Halifax and Batley

Bulldogs, meaning an exciting finish for the Qualifiers is in store. Bulls forward Jay Pitts enjoyed the win and is looking forward to the final two fixtures.

The 26-year-old is aware today's fixture is crucial and will be tough,

as Oldham will seek revenge for their home drubbing by the Bulls last month.

"We're just worrying about Oldham at the moment, it will be a good game as they got a decent win last weekend so it will be a tough game.

"We have to go into this afternoon with the same mentality as we had in the Whitehaven match and we have worked hard this week to make sure we do just that.

"We may have a backlash from the last time we played them, as we went to their place and did a number on them.

"They'll be pretty fired up for it as well so we need to make sure we are at the top of our game to counter-act them and attain a solid performance."





PITTS FOCUSSED ON IN HAND

Pitts has been ever-present since the Bulls joined the Kingstone Press Championship in 2015.

Since his move from Hull FC the year before, his presence has been valuable in helping the Bulls be one of the dominant forces in the past two seasons.

The utility back has recognised this achievement and wishes for much of the same in the weeks to come.

"I know I haven't missed a game, and though it does sound better than what it is, I take each game as it comes.

"I try and look after myself and hopefully carry on and stay there for the full year, especially going into the Super 8s."

Following on from such a fantastic victory against Whitehaven, Pitts has stated the morale within the camp has significantly risen.

A trait you would expect from such a result, though he recognises the importance of maintaining it within the final two matches.

"Morale is very good at the moment. The win against Whitehaven and how we did it was excellent and morale is very good as it brings smiles to the player's faces.

"We take each week as it comes and we'll use our good morale in this afternoon's game and see what the result will be."

A key player in Bradford's win against Whitehaven was the new boy Dane Chisholm from NRL side Canterbury Bulldogs.

Chisholm received high plaudits from Pitts for his contributions, as

the debutant shone last Sunday.

"He was very good. He eased a lot of stress for the forwards with his management in the middle and around the park by having some organisation there.

"He took some pressure off other players too, which was good as he is a natural half. He knows what to do there, better than others who

have done a decent job there this season.

"Overall, he played really well and helped us out a lot."

Chisholm arriving in the country may be the key ingredient to achieving promotion for the Bulls and Pitts is confident of this.

Though despite that, Pitts believes the importance of attaining success

is for each individual to prepare for each fixture physically and mentally, something a lot of players find challenging.

"It's tough as you have your ups and downs but coming in on a Monday, you maybe sore a few times, but you have to get your head around that. I'm a professional player and I love my job and what I do."

BULLS BEAT OFF SUPER LEAGUE SIDES FOR SCOTT'S FUTURE

DURING the week, the Bulls announced England Youth player Cameron Scott had signed for the Academy side.

The 16-year-old has played for the Bulls Scholarship team for two seasons and has now signed a contract with the Academy team.

The highly rated centre earned a call up to the national side in December last year, before featuring for England in the test against France at the end of March, where he scored three times over the two games.

Scott, who joined Bradford's Youth system from local side Wyke ARLFC, will play for the Bulls Academy side next season after choosing to commit his future to his boyhood club.

"I'm delighted to have signed for the Academy side, especially, as I'm a Bradford lad," said Scott.

"I've supported the club as a kid, stood out on the terraces watching and I want to be a part of the future, which will make the club great again and get us where we deserve to be.

"For me to sign and to be one of the lads to come through the system and help the club is absolutely fantastic.

"The aim is to follow in the footsteps of the players before me, especially, when you look at the lads (Danny Addy, Tom Olbison, Adam O'Brien, Alex Mellor, Joe Lumb and Ethan Ryan) who have come through system and gone into the first team recently.

"They are a real asset to the club and they perform really well, week in week out, and it is all because they have come through the system having put in a lot of hard work.

"It definitely works for them and they have progressed their career, so I can't see why it won't work for me."

"I'm very proud of him, as well as the 11 others who have been given Academy contracts," said Scholarship Head Coach Leigh Beattie.

"Cameron joined us from Wyke and at the time he wasn't favoured. He came with a baby face and now we've seen him mature physically, plus his skillset has also matured over the past few years.

"Getting selected for England was outstanding for him. He is great to coach and he's really dug in and kicked on. Hopefully, he'll kick on again in the next step of his career.

"We have 12 players coming through from the Under 16s into the Under 19s, which shows the direction and strength of the Youth system."

"I'm really excited to have Cameron staying at the club," said Head Coach Rohan Smith, sponsored In Memory of Joyce Dobby.

"He's an extremely talented player and we're looking forward to his development over the next couple of years.

"The process which Cameron has taken is what we want to see happen. We want to develop our U16s and see them come through the ranks.


"Cameron is a great character and comes from a great family, plus he's a Bradford lad and we really want to harness all those things and push him along."

THE FORMBOOK

OLDHAM have been relegation fodder all season, as expected from last season's League 1 Champions, however, recent form demonstrates their desire to survive.

Following their home drubbing by the Bulls in mid-June and a heavy away defeat to the London Broncos, the Roughyeds have attained three consecutive victories since then.

They held their nerve to defeat Whitehaven at home 26-18 before travelling to Sheffield and surprising the full-timers with a 24-16 win.

This form was capped off as they battled from a 14-6 deficit to clinch a derby victory over Swinton Lions 26-24 last time out.

Oldham will be underdogs in the clash at the Provident Stadium, but the Bulls should be careful of a backlash.

THE BRAINS

SKIPPER and stand-off Lewis Palfrey will be the man to watch for Oldham in this clash.

Palfrey was part of the squad that helped Oldham claim the League 1 title in 2015 and has been pivotal with Oldham's competitiveness in 2016.

This is clearly demonstrated as Oldham have edged away from the relegation places, despite being heavy favourites to go back down.

Palfrey has a single try to his name, but his assists as well as 41 successful goal kicks have helped Oldham from being cannon fodder in the Championship.

He will be a tough player for the Bulls to deal with, but Rohan Smith's side should be more than confident of succeeding.

THE COACH

HEAD COACH Scott Naylor (*pictured*) retired as a rugby league player in 2004, whilst playing for Salford in their return to Super League that season.

Though his highlights of his playing career were at Bradford Bulls, serving six seasons with the club.

Naylor was part of the squad that won the clean sweep in 2003 and has also featured in the 2001 and 2002 Grand Final clashes.

Naylor enjoyed a fantastic time at the Bulls, where he now returns to his old stomping ground for the first time as the opposition Head Coach.

Now assuming the role of Coach, past achievements include guiding Oldham back into the Kingstone Press Championship for the first time since 2006.

Naylor has bags of experience in both playing and coaching, and under him they are a club that should not be underestimated, just ask Hull Kingston Rovers.



CLUB CONNECTIONS

NO CURRENT player from Oldham has any club connections, though back to Head Coach Scott Naylor, as he had several years with the Bulls as previously mentioned.

Naylor's achievements in full include 2001 and 2003 Grand Final triumphs with the Bulls, as well as scoring a try for Bradford in their 19-18 defeat in 2002 against St Helens.

Other achievements include defeating Leeds Rhinos in 2003 to memorable win the Challenge Cup. Furthermore, Naylor was part of the squad that defeated Newcastle Knights in the 2002 World Club Challenge at Huddersfield's John Smith's Stadium.

THE ENGINE ROOM

UP FRONT, a key player to watch for the Roughyeds is former NRL prop Jack Spencer.

Spencer (*right*) has spent the majority of his career in England, officially turning professional during his 2011 season with Salford.

He moved in 2012 to the Wests Tigers but fortune in the elite division of rugby league never favoured him, so he returned to England and signed up with the Barrow Raiders.

Spencer then moved onto Halifax for two seasons before his move to Oldham at the start of 2016.

He has proved a hit with Oldham this season, utilising his bags of experience so the Bulls will have to be at their best to contain this powerhouse.



THE GROUND

OLDHAM play their home games at new ground Bower Fold in Stalybridge.

The move cemented a ground share with non-league side Stalybridge Celtic from their former stadium – Whitebank Stadium – after six seasons.

Bower Fold is far bigger than Whitebank, able to house 6,500 supporters, 5,000 more than their former home.

The Bulls visited Bower Fold in mid-June and as aforementioned, managed a resounding 48-4 victory and will hope for a similar outcome this time around.

ACADEMY STARS EARN PROFESSIONAL CONTRACTS

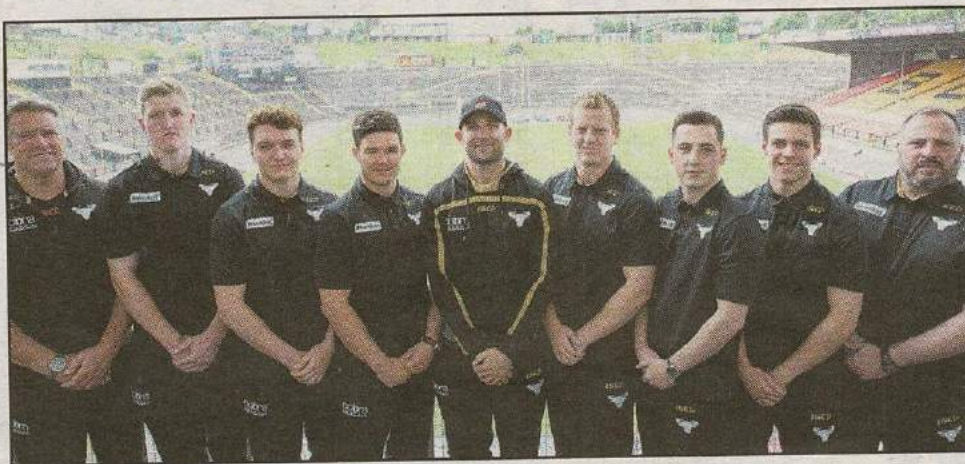
THURSDAY saw six Academy players sign first team contracts for 2017.

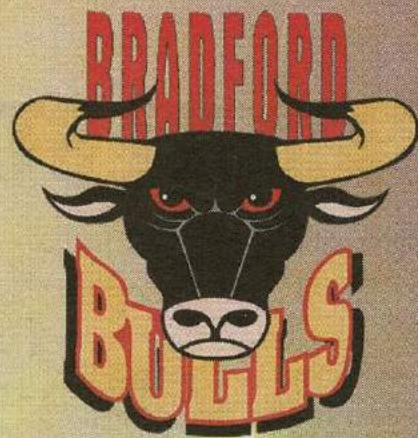

It is great to announce that these boys are here to stay. I've been watching these kids on video before I came to the UK, so it's been great to get to know them and see their progress in the last couple of months.

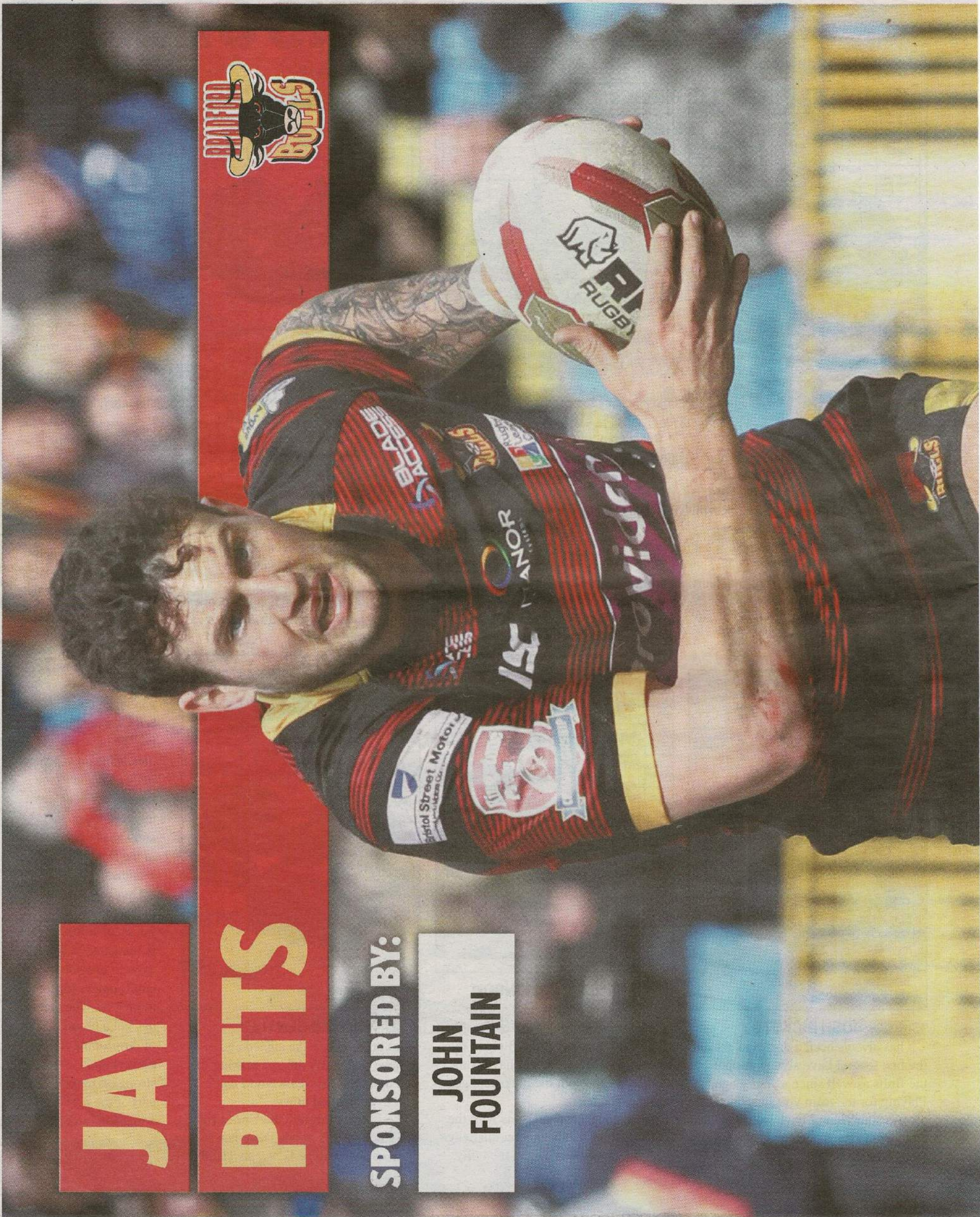

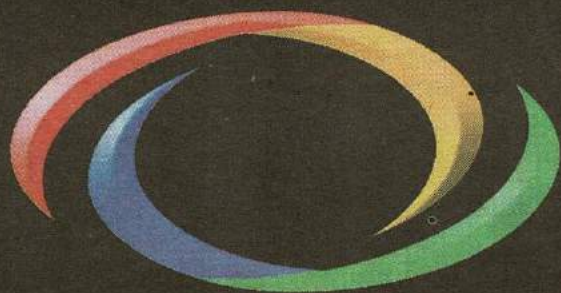

BIRCH LANE HEROES

TWO months into the season it was generally admitted that instead of football being a hindrance to recruiting it has proved to be valuable aid to getting new recruits to join the colours.

Having a day off, Bradford Northern were able to arrange a charity match with a team representing the Northern Union section of the Bradford Royal Field Artillery.

Bradford Artillery had taken quite a fancy to Bradford Northern so much so that Major Priestley's popular brigade organised a charity match against the club on 23rd October 1915. The match was used to boost recruiting to the Derby Scheme the last ditch attempt at voluntary recruiting to prevent compulsory conscription being enforced. The scheme was run like an election

campaign with daily advertising bills on trams and billboards and a recruiting platform built in the Town Hall Square. 1,100 canvassers called house to house to speak to all eligible men and employers sent their

employees to register en masse at the Church Institute. Initially they aimed to process 50 recruits a day between 9am and 10pm but this increased to 1,000 men a day in many cases the whole process taking just 15 minutes.

"There are quite a number of players in the Bradford district who are eligible for the Army but the reason they don't enlist is their business not mine. There are men in other walks of life also who do not join the colours, and why should all the stigma be cast on the poor

footballer? We boast a great of our voluntary system and rightly so but we must be very careful in the methods we employ to persuade men to join the colours or our voluntary system will become a mere empty boast."

There were also calls from some quarters for the sport to stopped during the war.

"If the Birch Lane ground was shut down tomorrow it would not result in a single recruit being secured. The ground is at present the happy hunting ground for the recruiting sergeant and the military authorities have shown by their continual attendance at home matches that they appreciate the opportunity our games afford of getting into touch with a larger audience than can be obtained at the street corners. So long as it can be shown that football does not interfere with recruiting and that it provides a little relaxation for the men engaged on war work the whole week long it cannot but serve a most useful purpose."

The Artillery's route march complete with their Band down Wakefield Road attracted great interest and although crowd of about 2,000 attended the match it was not as many as they had hoped for.

"The game itself of course was no attempt at seriousness and from the start it was evident that northern could have scored at will. Occasionally we saw glimpses of Northern's excellent combination in the back division, Brook, the new recruit being prominent in one or two fine bursts which showed his great capabilities as a stand-off half back. On the artillery side we had an old northern union player in Crossley who at one time gave promise of making an excellent centre three quarter had he persevered with his training. Today he was prominent in some useful work and assisted by Sergeant Major Newsome, once or twice gave Northern some difficulty. On the whole, however, the game was interesting enough from a spectator's point of view and the only regret is that it did not receive greater support from the public."

FIRST HALF

Gadsby started for the Artillery and Northern took up the attack promptly. A round of passing between the home backs ended in OLIVER threading his way through the khaki representatives and scoring the first try. Hardaker failed at goal.

A good movement initiated by Sergeant Newsome gave Northern some trouble, but Bartholomew saved the situation. Of course, the R.F.A. could not be expected to seriously challenge Northern but they were making a good fight of it. Major Priestley's men were in good condition, and their work in the scrimmages was especially good.

The home side took advantage of the opportunity to have a little hand-to-hand passing, and frequently the ball travelled amongst nearly the whole of the home side before a movement was stopped. BROOK scored the next try for Bradford, but Hardaker failed to improve.

Then came the Artillery's turn, MARSHALL scoring their first try as a result of a strong forward movement by the Gunners, Newsome failing. TOWN was the next scorer for Northern, after a good opening had been made for him by Oliver, who had no difficulty in threading his way through the opposition at will. WILSON added the goal points.

BROOK next scored an unconverted try for the home team, and then the R.F.A. were given a chance to add to their points, PICKARD running over with a try for CROSSLEY to score the goal.

After this STACEY scored two tries in quick succession the first one being improved by WILSON and the second by STACEY himself. The referee evidently thought that this was enough for the first half, the score at this stage being Northern 24 points, R.F.A. 8 points.

SECOND HALF

During the interval the Artillery Band played a few appropriate selections. The Artillery started off as though they had been shot out of a rocket, and fairly took the homesters by storm, carrying the first movement by sheer force to the Bradford line for FARRAR to score, the same player kicking the goal. Bradford retaliated with an unconverted try by HARDAKER.

The next score was made by the Artillery, BUCKLEY being credited with the try, the goal-kick failing. The next incident of interest was a really magnificent goal from near the half-way line by NEWSOME, the Artillery's Sergeant-Major. FAWCETT and WHITAKER each ran in tries, which were not improved.

OLIVER added the concluding try for BROOK to goal.

CHISHOLM STARS ON DEBUT

IF ONLY Bradford could have signed Dane Chisholm in February.

Since the beginning of the season, Bradford have gone through countless half-back pairings, with both James Lowes and Rohan Smith failing to find a winning combination throughout the season.

But on this evidence, Smith has pulled off an incredible capture, as Chisholm put in a dazzling display to help Bradford move to within a point of the top four.

Bradford's destiny remains out of their hands, but this performance, combined with defeats for Halifax and Batley, will have their part-time counterparts in West Yorkshire looking over their shoulder with two games to play.

Chisholm scored two and created four more as Bradford ran in 11 tries against a disappointing Whitehaven outfit.

The game was effectively over within nine minutes. Ethan Ryan scored acrobatically in the corner after Kris Welham's pass before Adam Sidlow charged over the line soon after. With confidence high, Chisholm showcased his tremendous ability with the first of two fine solo efforts. The debutant ran at the Whitehaven defence down the left, stepped away from two and changed direction to eventually go in under the sticks. Addy's three conversions made it 18-0.

Five minutes later and the lead was extended further. Fullback Kieren Moss, who continues to improve with every performance since his move from Parramatta, was the beneficiary of a fine Welham break down the left.
