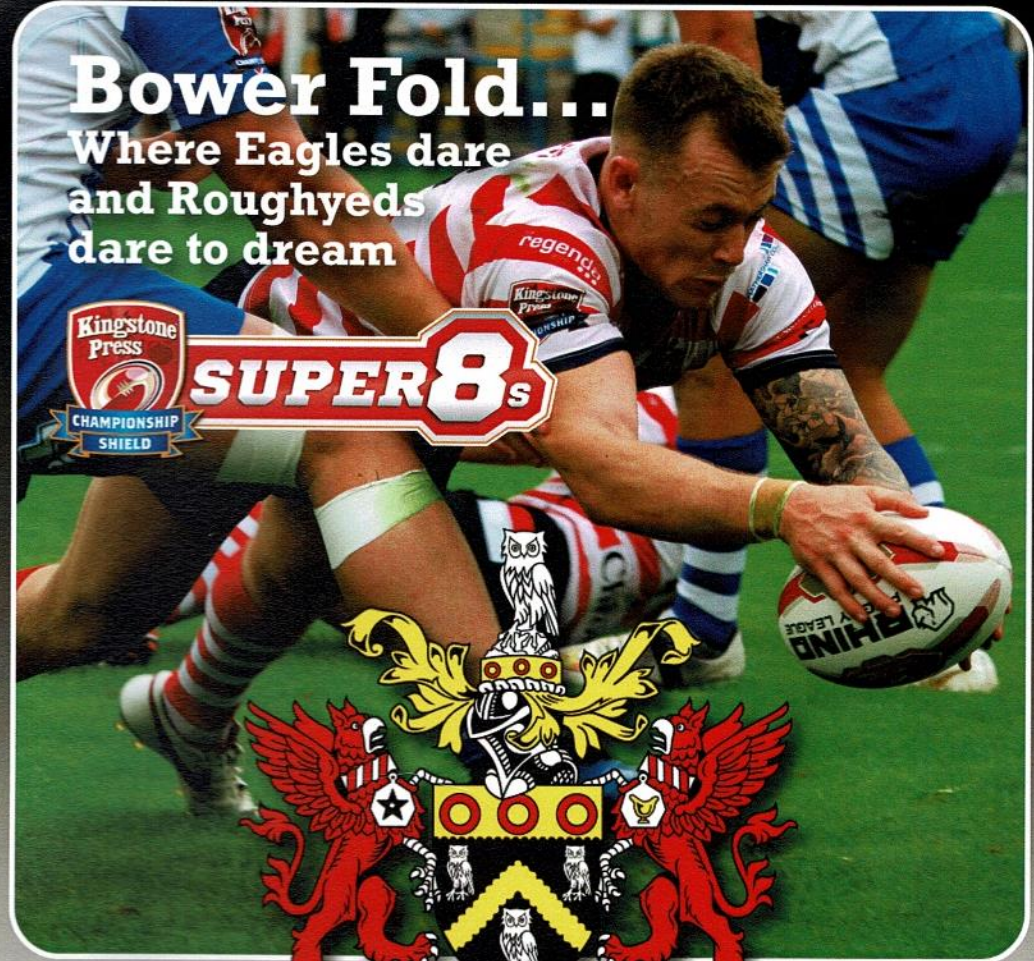

How Scott sees it...

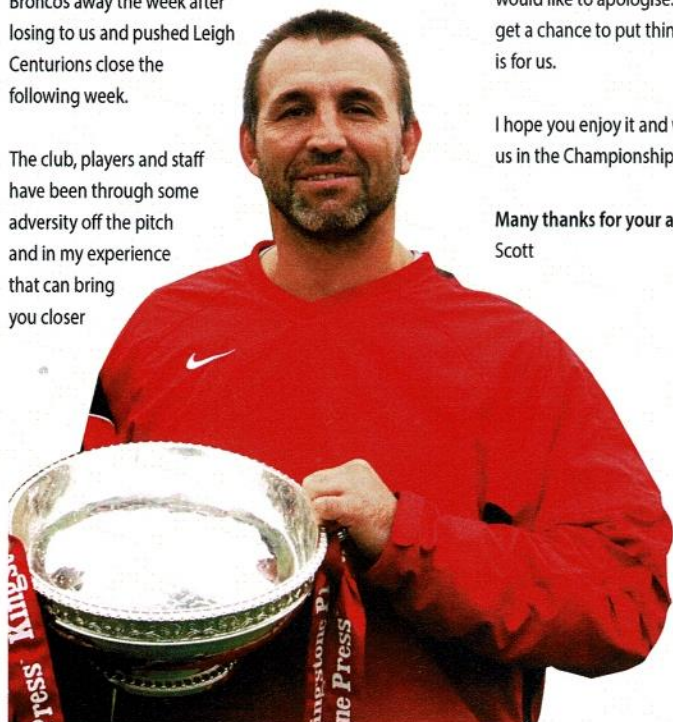
View from the Roughyeds' dug-out

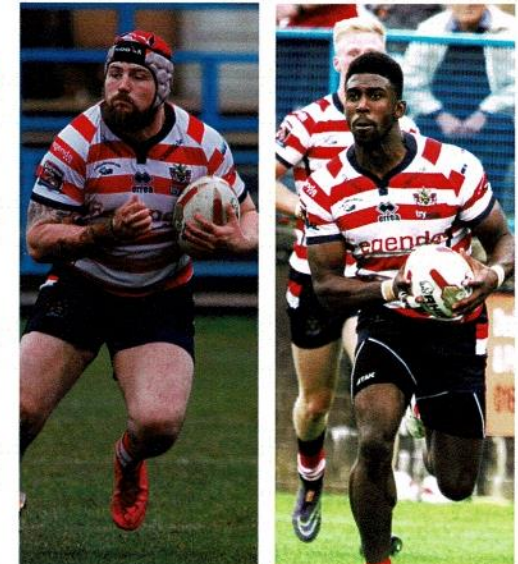
'Wardie' TRY-ing to pip Jamel at the post

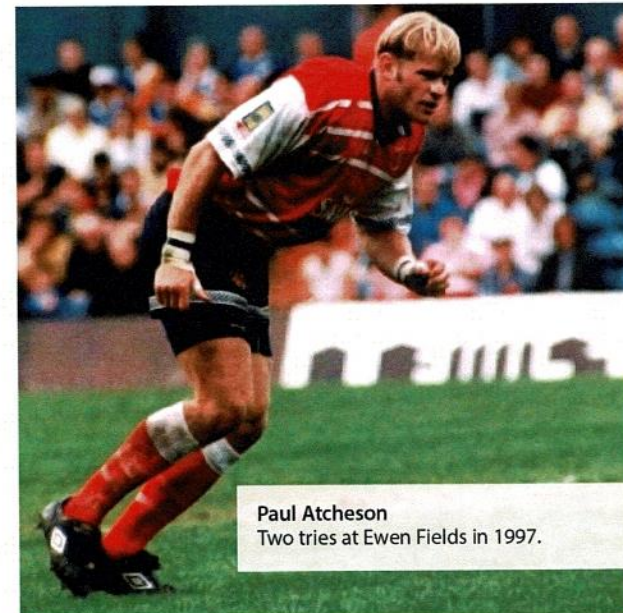
A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

In welcoming the players, officials and supporters of the Sheffield Eagles club to Bower Fold for the second time this season, we can take the opportunity to look back at the Super League fixture played between the two clubs at Hyde United's Ewen Fields ground on July 6 1997. Oldham's home ground at Boundary Park was temporarily unavailable but the decision to stage the match in nearby Hyde did not sit well with some Oldham supporters and the resulting attendance of 2,168 was the lowest of the season.

The Bears were looking to complete the double over the Eagles having won 18 - 14 in Sheffield on May 11. The visitors started brightly with stand-in hooker Darren Turner bossing the show in a dynamic performance that saw him lay on an early try for Rod Doyle before capitalising on some weak Oldham defending to crash over himself; both of the scores were converted by Eagles club captain Mark Aston. The visiting skipper also landed a penalty goal but ultimately it was his drop goal on the half hour that was to prove decisive. Oldham got back in contention with two tries from the impressive Paul Atcheson and one from Howard Hill. Hill's try was thanks to good work from substitute Brett Goldspink and it was his introduction off the bench, together with fellow Australian Matt Munro, that sparked the improvement in the home side's performance. However, Oldham goal

kicker Luke Goodwin was only successful in a single conversion attempt and as the game entered its final quarter the Bears were still one point in arrears. Goodwin tested the Sheffield line with some towering kicks but Fijian full-back Waisale Souatabua was equal to the task as the last line of defence. Aston was instrumental in stretching the Eagles' lead after 66 minutes when a cleverly delayed pass sent Souatabua through a gap in the Oldham line, this time showing his attacking prowess to race away for the match clinching score. Aston again converted and although Martin Crompton managed to scramble over in the corner late on for a try, magnificently converted by Francis Maloney from the touch-line, it was too little, too late as the Eagles ran out winners 21 - 20.

SHEFFIELD EAGLES - Today's Visitors

Sheffield Eagles arrive at Bower Fold today in this fourth-round game of the 2016 Championship Shield. On their last visit, Sheffield lost out to Oldham by one point when a Lewis Palfrey drop goal won the game for the Roughyeds in the dying moments of the tie.

The Eagles were hoping to turn the tables on Oldham when the two sides met again at the Sheffield Hallam University Sports Park on a cool Friday evening back in early July. Things didn't go to plan though and the Roughyeds were able to complete a regular season double over the Eagles, the final score finishing 24-16 to Oldham.

Sheffield set themselves high standards for the 2016 season. Taking the decision to become a full time outfit was a signal of their desire to regain Super League status. New players were brought in to bolster the side and this included three men that had featured in Oldham's 2015 League 1 campaign and subsequent promotion to the higher division. George Tyson, Adam Neal and David Hewitt were lured by the prospect of becoming full time professionals and signed deals with the South Yorkshire club.

Despite winning their first three Championship fixtures, Sheffield failed to build on their early promise and when the league split they found themselves placed in the lower half of the division and twelve points below a place in the Super 8 Qualifiers. At one point there was a real threat of finishing in the bottom two relegation places going in to the Super 8s. A late season rally elevated their league position with a victory against London Broncos in Ealing and almost toppling high flying Leigh Centurions.

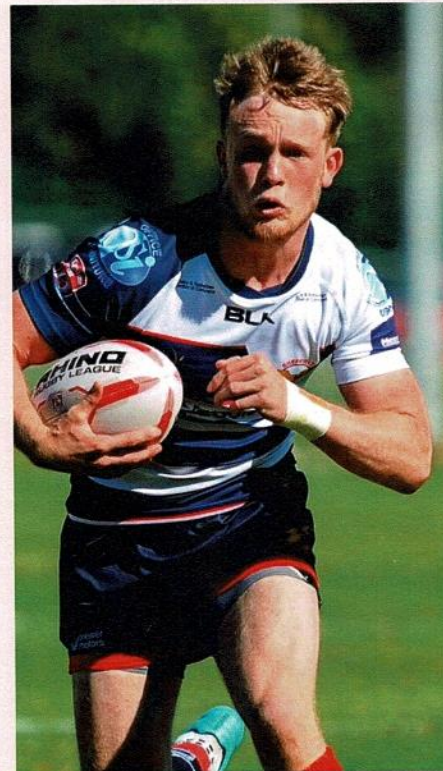

Aston progressed to the first team after building his reputation in the reserve side. Has scored 14 tries and 61 goals in his 28 appearances this season.



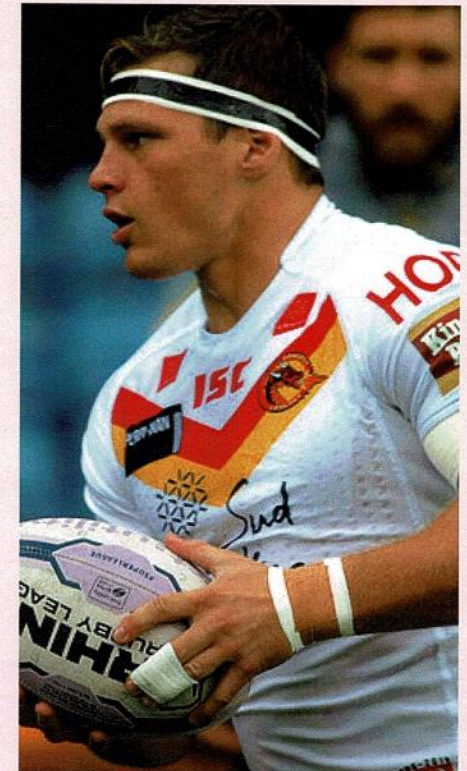
Stan Robin
