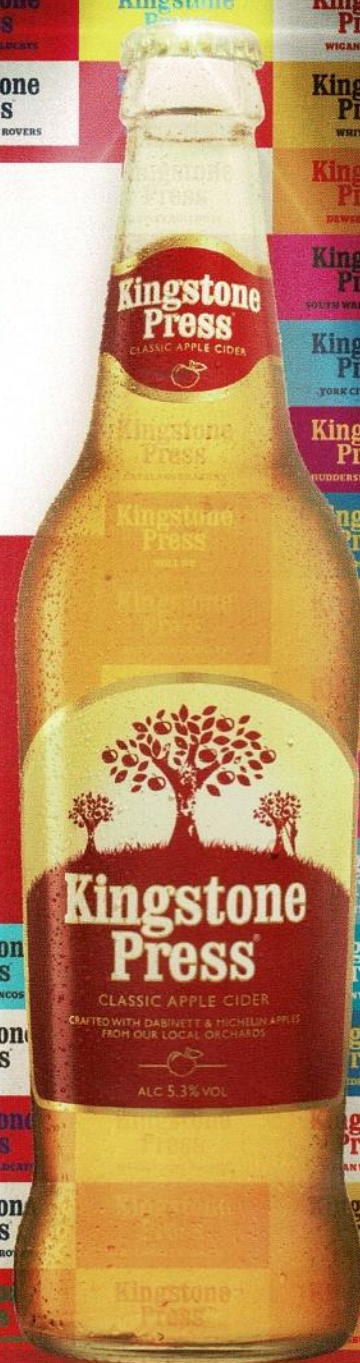

How Scott sees it...

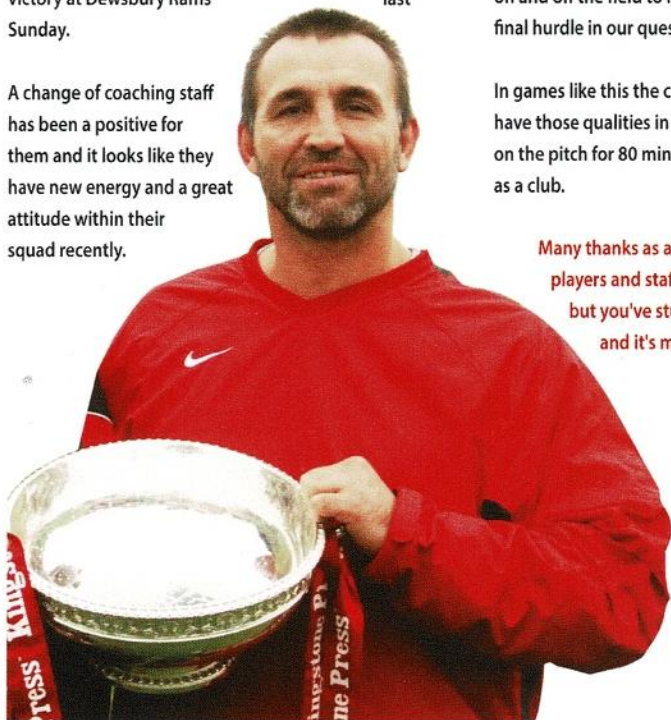
View from the Roughyeds' dug-out

I WAS honoured and privileged to represent Oldham RLFC as part of the 32-strong BBC Songs of Praise choir at the Ladbrokes Challenge Cup Final at Wembley. From leaving Bangor the day before the game on the 7.22am train to arriving back 36 hours later I had the time of my life. It was a fantastic experience.

We each had a video to help us to learn the words of 'Abide With Me' and to offer advice on when to breathe, pause and hold a note. Some of us, myself included, had never sung in a choir before so it was new and exciting. We certainly put the advice to good use under the expert tutelage of Steve Thompson, a great guy and a fantastic teacher. Without Steve's help, we could've not done it.

On the Friday we walked down the famous tunnel to pitch side where the ground-staff were busy watering and forking the pitch and cutting the lush green turf. We took in the magnitude of the vast stadium, taking photographs and trying to visualise how it would look when Hull and Warrington fans would make a cacophony of noise and create a fantastic atmosphere. This was the lull before the storm.

Later that day we were taken to a hotel where, after dinner, ex-referee John Kendrew, a choir rep for Castleford Tigers, brought out his guitar and led us in a sing-song in the hotel bar, a lovely end to a great day.

We were up early next morning to fill a 7.45am slot on Radio Five Live with 'Abide With Me' which we sung to the nation in the hotel car park. Then it was back to Wembley for more rehearsals, during which we were introduced to Aled Jones, Martin Offiah and the wonderful Lizzie Jones, who sang 'Abide With Me' beautifully last year, only three months after the tragic passing of her husband Danny, a Keighley Cougars player. Lizzie told us not to be nervous, to enjoy every second and to remember to breathe!

We also met BBC anchor man Mark Chapman, Leeds Rhinos forward Jamie Jones Buchanan and the two leading lights at the RFL, Brian Barwick and Nigel Wood.

We entered the arena via the West Tunnel, underneath thousands of cheering and chanting Hull fans.

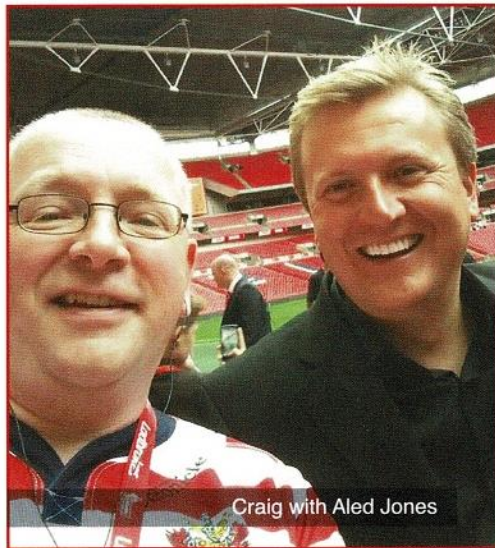
What an experience that was. As 'Old Faithful' rang out around us we walked on to the pitch, waving to the crowd as we went. Many choristers had a tear in their eye. I stood in awe and looked around at the stands, barely believing this was happening to me. Then, with Steve encouraging us, we broke out into 'Abide With Me, fast falls the eventide...'

We all got on brilliantly over the two days, united by rugby league and support for our great clubs. I made new friends with whom I intend to stay in touch.

Songs of Praise organisers Charlotte Hindle, James Harrow and Hannah Swinglehurst were great people too - efficient and professional in their work. It was great to watch the whole event again on their TV show the next day.

I was pleased Hull finally got the Wembley monkey off their back and it was good to see an Oldham lad, Marc Sneyd, win the Lance Todd Trophy.

By the time Lizzie presented the cup to Gareth Ellis I was heading back to the station - the end of a truly memorable two days which I will never EVER forget.

Thumbs-up for 'Gilly' in season-long loan deal

THE Oldham club can take considerable pride and self-satisfaction in retaining Kieran Gill for 2017 on a season-long agreement.

Not only is the up-and-coming Castleford Tigers centre prospect happy to commit himself to a full year here but, equally significantly, his full-time Super League employers have demonstrated they have no worries about trusting the ongoing development of one of their own to Oldham during the whole of what remains of his current contract over there.

That in itself speaks volumes for the environment Chris Hamilton and Scott Naylor have created at this club and for the quality of the work Scott oversees on the training ground, flanked by his assistants Lee Spencer and Peter Carey, writes ROGER HALSTEAD.

'Gilly', only 20, has a burning desire to become a Super League player with his hometown club and he is of the opinion that he couldn't get any better preparation for that than by complementing all he does in the gym and on the training paddocks at Cas by playing regularly for Roughyeds at Championship level.

The admiration is mutual. "Kieran is a credit to himself and to Castleford Tigers," said Scott. "He has coped admirably with the jump from academy to Championship rugby. He is keen to learn and I can only see him getting better and better."

He has scored seven tries in ten games for Roughyeds since arriving in late June on an initial loan agreement to the end of this season, with an option for next year.

He scored an impressive try on debut, putting the finishing touches to a set move direct from the scrum, and has since made something of a habit of running in long-range interception tries thanks to his instinctive game-reading and powers of anticipation.

Tigers were happy for him to continue his development in the care of Scott, 'Spanner' and Peter, who was his coach when Gill was in the academy at Salford Red Devils.

"It suits me fine as well," said the youngster, who has supported Cas since he was a boy, but is now too old to play for their under-19s.

He added: "I've a lot of respect for Scott and the coaching staff at Oldham, who have already taught me a lot. Staying around for a full season, I will learn a lot more.

"It's no secret that I'd love to play for Cas in Super League and I'm sure that another year at Oldham will stand me in good stead.

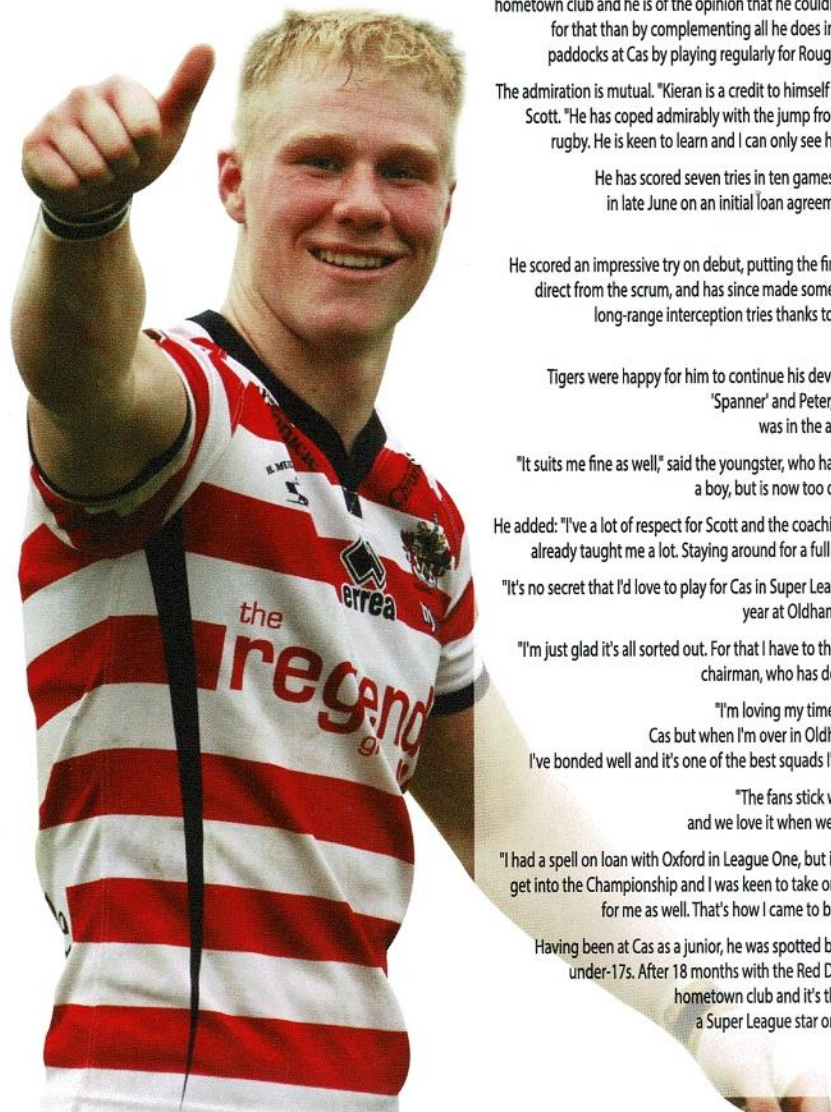
"I'm just glad it's all sorted out. For that I have to thank Chris (Hamilton), the club chairman, who has done all the loan stuff with Cas.

"I'm loving my time at Oldham. I train full time at Cas but when I'm over in Oldham it's like home from home. I've bonded well and it's one of the best squads I've ever been associated with.

"The fans stick with us through thick and thin and we love it when we can put smiles on their faces.

"I had a spell on loan with Oxford in League One, but it was a natural progression to get into the Championship and I was keen to take on the challenge. Cas wanted it for me as well. That's how I came to be at Oldham in the first place."

Having been at Cas as a junior, he was spotted by Salford playing for Yorkshire under-17s. After 18 months with the Red Devils, he was lured back to his hometown club and it's there that he hopes to become a Super League star one day... with Oldham's help.

Scott, Adam put pen to paper on new deals covering 2017

WE are delighted to confirm that we have re-signed two more players for 2017 in back division aces Adam Clay and Scott Turner.

Talks are going on with a lot of other players, both internally and externally, and more announcements will be made soon.

So far, we have announced that the following players will be with us again next season:

Backs: Adam Clay, Scott Turner, Jamel Chisholm, Danny Grimshaw and Kieran Gill, who will be here on season-long loan from Castleford Tigers.

Forwards: Phil Joy, Jack Spencer, Michael Ward and Danny Langtree, who is half way through a two-year agreement.

Scott Turner, who can play equally well at wing or full-back, only joined us at the beginning of August after scoring 28 tries in 34 games for North Wales Crusaders. Initially, he signed a short-term deal to the end of this season to test out the water, but he has since said that he knew he had made the right decision within a week.

He has underpinned that confidence in the club by extending his commitment for another year and we are very pleased indeed that he will be sticking around.

He said: "The back end of a season is not the ideal time to join a new club. I was a bit apprehensive as to how I would be fit in, but within days I knew I would be okay. Everybody was so welcoming."

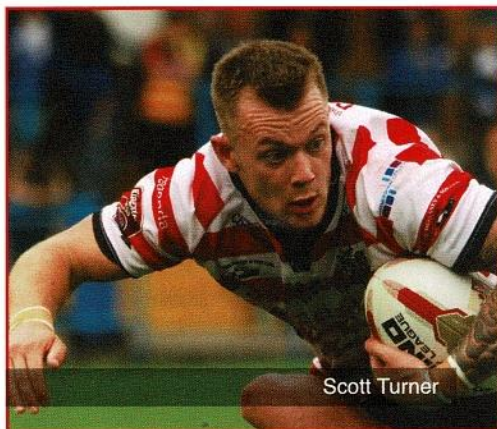
Aged 22, Scott said he was happy to play anywhere in the team, but the positions he knew best were wing and full-back, although he hadn't played much at No 1 for three or four years until asked to do so in recent Oldham games.

"I was a little bit rusty," he added, "but I do like playing there because you're more involved than when you're playing on the wing."

His best season was in 2015 when he scored 20 in 23 appearances.

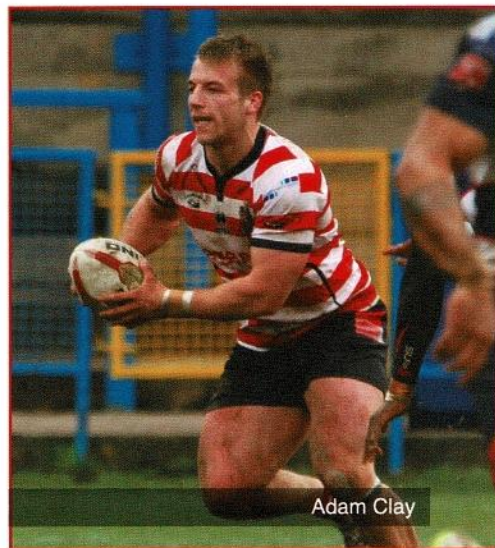

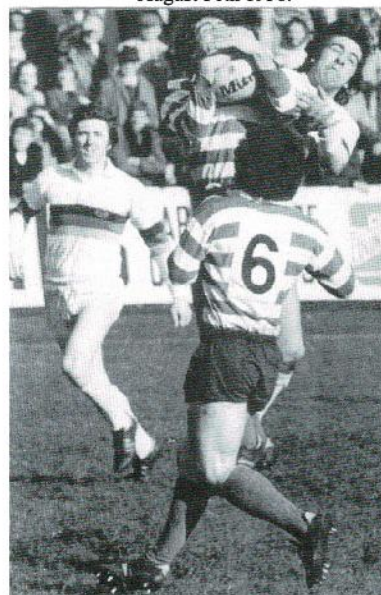

The sticky problem of playing arch rivals Workington away provided enough impetus for a 28-24 derby victory. The Dewsbury result now sees Haven sandwiched between relegated Workington and tenth placed Oldham.

Whitehaven fans will surely travel to see this nerve jangling encounter; a favourable result could lift the lid off their club's season. The same goes for the Roughyeds and a slice of luck either way could send one set of fans home happy. Here's to a good game.

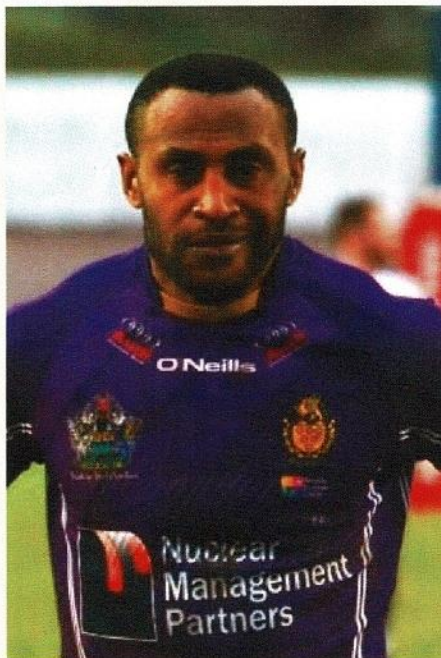
Trio of Stars...

Former Oldham player Allen is in his second full season at the Recreation Ground having joined from Super League club Widnes after the 2014 season.

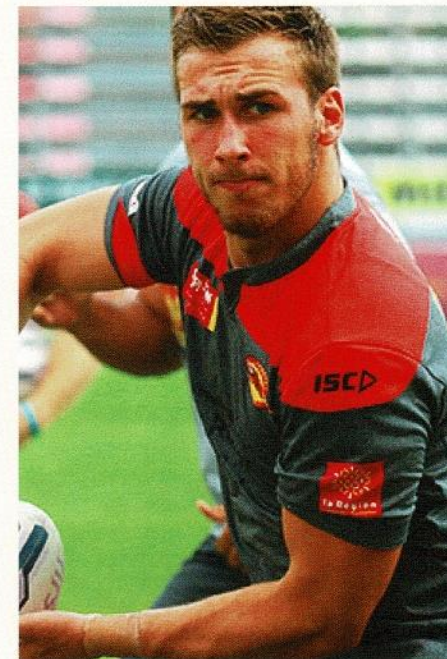
The forward has represented Ireland on 9 occasions and has pulled on the Whitehaven shirt 25 times this season scoring 5 tries.

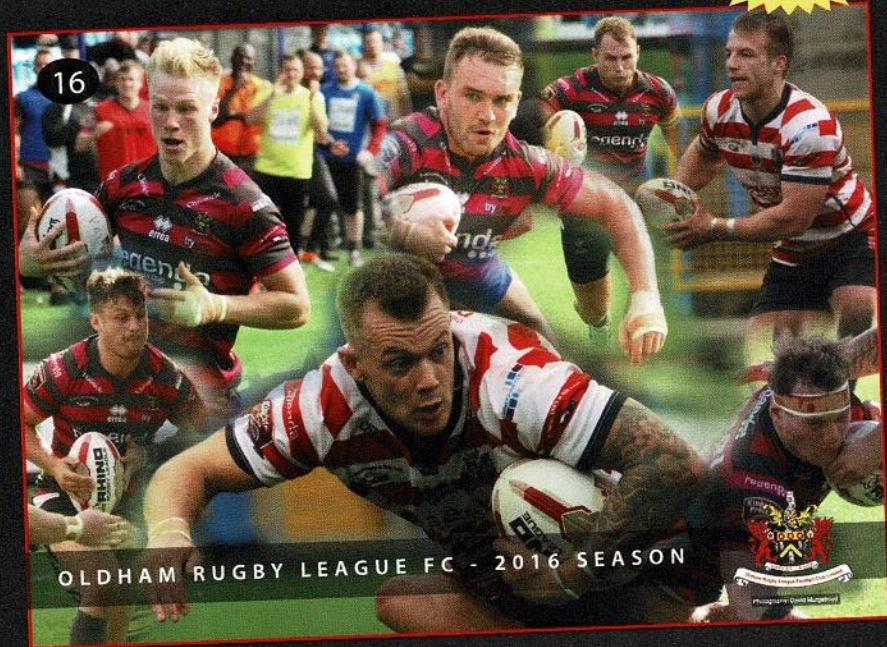
