

* FROM THE TOP

WITH MARK SAWYER



Welcome to the Tetley's Stadium for our final home game of the 2016. The final game it may be but there is still plenty to play for as far as we are concerned. It's vital we pick up two

points against an Oldham team that secured Championship safety with their win over Whitehaven last Sunday — something we couldn't do the week before. Before I go any further I would like to congratulate Oldham Chairman Chris Hamilton, coach Scott Naylor and all the players and support staff for ensuring they have a place in the Championship come 2017. It isn't easy to survive your first season especially since you have less central funding than most others and it is unusual for both promoted teams to reach safety in the same season. Well done to you all.

As far as we are concerned the disappointing home defeat by Whitehaven really put us under pressure but the team came up with a super performance last Sunday to take the spoils at Sheffield and to leave a place in the Shield Semi-Final still within our control. Swinton are just one point behind us and could overtake us if we don't do the business today. Everyone at the club is fully aware of that and the financial implications it brings with it and hopefully will deliver the performance we need on the day. However sport is a strange animal and you never know what's in store – perhaps that's a big part of its appeal.

Since the last programme Wakefield Trinity have announced that they plan to remain at Belle Vue for 2017 so the ground share is off the agenda for the time being at least at first team level but we remain in contact with the club about other opportunities that will arise as soon as our new sports facilities come on stream. The club met with the contractor last week and hopefully an image of the facilities will have been published via our Social Media channels by now so you can see what one part of the set up will be. As soon as we have images of the other facilities these will also be released.

As a result of these new sports facilities we have taken the opportunity to sign a partnership with Hemel Stags of League One who will use the Tetley's Stadium as their northern training base. When Hemel first came into the league it was seen very much as a developmental league but the recent

restructure has seen a number of traditional heartland clubs now in the same division and the southern based clubs are finding it hard to compete for players. London Broncos and London Skolars already have a good relationship that works for them and hopefully our partnership will bring joint benefits as it provides a pathway for our younger players into the Championship via experience in League One. It's a big step up from amateur to Championship rugby league and this would go some way to easing the jump up in stages.

With possibly (and hopefully!) just two more games after today until the end of the season our thoughts have turned already to 2017 and planning is well under way for the new season. We need to look at our club structure to ensure that it is fit for purpose but obviously resources are limited. That's why we as a club are so indebted to our volunteers and I would like to thank them all for what they have achieved this season. If I name them all I will miss someone out which no doubt will cause offence but they cover roles such as running the club shop, manning turnstiles, selling programmes and lottery tickets, meeting and greeting visitors and sponsors and serving food and refreshments, running the scoreboard and PA system, being the club's Media Team, writing and editing the programme, fund raising with the Amber Ribbon, ground maintenance, cleaning, painting and the list goes on. Thank you once again for everything you have done. You have all jointly saved us and raised us so much money and you are a real lifeline to the club. But we do need more!

Finally thank you to all our supporters and to everyone who has bought anything from us this season from a season ticket to replica shirt, programme, beer, draw ticket — anything at all. Your income streams are vital to us. If anyone feels that there is something we are missing out on please tell us. We have listened to the comments on the shirt design which hopefully will result in improved sales in 2017 and we will listen to any reasonable suggestion that may help us improve on our match day cash flow. Supporters know I am approachable and happy to discuss anything to do with Dewsbury Rams.

Enjoy the game and see you in the Royal Suite after the game.

VIEW FROM THE DUGOUT

WITH GLENN MORRISON



The end of the season seems to have suddenly appeared on the horizon and this afternoon marks our final home game of the 2016 campaign. I'd like

to welcome Oldham coach Scott Naylor and his players and coaching team to the Tetley's Stadium and congratulate them on retaining their place in the Championship for 2017. It's a very difficult division to crack especially when you first come up but they have done it and will now be able to plan ahead with increased funding from last year and the opportunity to develop the club even further. They have had a new home in Stalybridge which seems to have been a perfect fit although I understand that there are some developments planned for their former ground at Whitebank.

For the Rams I guess the words that best describes this season are frustrating and inconsistent. We were crippled by injuries in the early part of the year and we struggled to plug the gaps. Our Reserve team was disbanded as the RFL reserve team competition fell apart following the withdrawals of Sheffield and Featherstone. We lost three games against the two relegated teams but have still won away at Bradford, Halifax and Sheffield. We performed well against top four sides losing by just one point at Featherstone, by two against Batley and by four against Batley at Blackpool and at both London and Sheffield. We could have been pressing for a top 4 spot or at least a home game in the Championship Shield Semi-Final had we been able to close these games down but I guess that's history now and we have to look ahead and not back.

Our last home game was one of those frustrating performances when Whitehaven, fighting for survival, took us apart in the second half. We had a lot of soul searching after that game and the players redeemed themselves with that great win at Sheffield last Sunday. We played some sparkling rugby at times and the win keeps us in charge of our

own destiny in spite of Swinton's win over Halifax. Hopefully the end result after today's game will be good and we can plan for another game against Bradford Bulls but that still has to be earned.

As I write these notes I'm not sure on what injury doubts we will have going into the game. We already know that Scott Hale is out for the rest of the season. Scott ruptured his pec muscle while making a tackle in the first half at Sheffield and others are still up in the air. We still have a number of players either out or playing with knocks and playing while going through the pain barrier is something that is not always recognised. Players do put their bodies on the line week after week as well as pushing through a three times a week training regime. It isn't an easy life. It does have financial rewards but you still have to have the heart to do it. That's why they do respond to positive support from the terraces. It can provide them with a lift when things aren't going to plan. Last Sunday for example you really got behind the team and I would like to thank you for that. We will do our best to give you even more to shout about

Finally we start to look ahead to 2017. We have already secured a kit deal which provides us with high quality training and playing wear. We have new equipment for the gym and wrestle room just waiting to be installed in the closed season. A new partnership with Hemel Stags has been announced and hopefully there will be other positive announcements as the weeks progress. We should have use of the brand new training facility for the start of next year much to the delight of our groundsman who has had to put up with us training on the pitch in all conditions throughout the year!

COMMERCIALLY SPEAKING

Today's "Commercially Speaking" has a slightly different look to it since it's the final home league game of the season and a chance to say thank you to all our sponsors and advertisers both ground board and programme for everything they have done for us in 2016. It's easy when you are a top club to get people on board but for Championship clubs, especially those of us with Super League clubs and other Championship clubs on our doorstep, it is a different matter. It's all about the powers of persuasion and hopefully once persuaded they stay with us!

We are already looking at the 2017 season. Fixtures are not published until November and we don't yet know the make up of the division except to say there will be at least one club coming down from Super League. Congratulations must go to Leigh Centurions on their promotion. They deserved a chance at the big time after three successive league titles and hopefully they will shake up a few more clubs on the way. Perhaps it will also open the eyes of potential sponsors that there is life after Super League and 2017 already looks like being another great season.

2017 will also bring us a new kit and new kit supplier. Our kit will be manufactured by Errea though Buysportskit.com who have supplied Oldham and Workington among others in 2016. Today is the final day for the submission of entries for the design of the 2017 and hopefully James Milner of Buysportskit.com will be at today's game to take a sneak preview at what we have received so far. We already have sponsors signed up for next year. Yorkshire Building Services will be our Main Shirt Sponsor once again with their associate company Flair appearing on the sleeve. Harron Homes are also already committed to being on the back of the shirt and Horde Consultancy will be a new name on the sleeve. For the first time ever we have a sponsor for the rear of the shorts but this is being kept under wraps until the kit is ready for launching. Discussions are ongoing with others as well about either renewing sponsorships or new partnerships and further details on these will be released as and when they come to fruition.

Carlsberg UK still have the naming rights for the stadium and at the moment there is one year left on their contract agreement with us that keep it as the Tetley's Stadium through to the end of 2017. A number of new board advertisers have started to appear in recent weeks and we are taking steps to put new resources in place to help us to develop our commercial portfolio.

There may also be some opportunities for clients who wish to become involved in the new sports facilities at the stadium. The image of the new full size 3G pitch has (or should have!) already been released but we thought it well worth including below.



It is a full size pitch — it's actually marginally larger than our main playing area! It will be marked out for rugby league with posts installed and will be the only pitch of this type for rugby league in the area. It can still host football and we have already had interest from football providers about using the facility. With an approximate build time of 16 weeks we hope to be up and running for the start of 2017. It will be a massive boost to the club as well as to other clubs and organisations in our area.

We will also be carrying out some improvements to our club gym and weight room. A sponsorship deal for 2017 has been agreed with Powerhouse and they have recently supplied us with two new top of the range rowing machines and a treadmill as a part of the agreement.

Today we bring the curtain down on the 2016 regular season as we look to confirm our place in the end of season Championship Shield play-offs. To conclude the campaign, the Rams welcome Oldham to The Tetley's Stadium who themselves will be hoping to squeeze themselves into the playoffs and give themselves a shot at silverware in their first season back in rugby league's second tier. Last weekend's 20-18 victory over Whitehaven not only confirmed the Cumbrian side's relegation, but also meant that Scott Naylor's side will be competing in the Kingstone Press Championship table next season. Just two points separate the Rams in fourth place on 22 points and Oldham on 20. However, with a superior points difference the Rams will be confident of making it into the top four.

History

Oldham were actually present in the first two seasons of Super League in 1996 and 1997, under the Oldham Bears identity. In the inaugural league, they finished a credible 8th, but the next year saw the Bears relegated, having finished in last place. At the end of that season, the club was declared bankrupt with debts of £2,000,000. A new team, Oldham Roughyeds, were formed and accepted to play at a lower level. The new team competed in the Northern Ford Premiership and narrowly missed out on promotion back to the Super League in 2001, going down 24-12 to Widnes in the Grand Final. After a series of off the field problems plagued the club in the following years, Oldham were relegated to the third tier of English


Grand Final at Headingley, having beaten Swinton and Barrow in the play offs but were beaten by Featherstone in the final. Oldham reached the quarter finals of the 2008 Northern Rail Cup, beating National League One sides Salford and Whitehaven in the process. They also once again reached the National League Two Grand Final, but it was a similar story for Oldham fans, this time going down 18-10 to Doncaster at Warrington's Halliwell Jones Stadium. 2009 followed a familiar path for Oldham, as they once again qualified for the end of season play offs after finishing 4th. After beating Swinton, Hunslet and York to make their third straight Grand Final, they once again came up just short. Once more, they travelled to Warrington, this time to face the Keighley Cougars who came out on top 28-26 to gain promotion and once again break Oldham hearts. The Roughyeds were becoming known as a 'nearly team' and they came up just short in 2010. After finishing 3rd, they made it to their 4th Grand Final in a row but were beaten again, this time by the York City Knights 25-4. Oldham again qualified for the play offs in 2011 and 2012 but were knocked out in the early stages. 2013 saw a return to the Grand Final once again for the Roughyeds, where they were beaten vet again, this time by Rochdale who won promotion to the Championship. Oldham fans will have no doubt been wondering if they would ever be promoted, having missed out on so many occasions. Oldham finished 3rd in 2014, behind York and Hunslet but

rugby league at the end of the 2006 season. The side reached the final of the 2007 National League 2

made it to the Grand Final where they came up against Hunslet who they had beaten in the semi final. However, hearts were broken again when Thomas Covle scored a golden point drop goal for the hawks and to consign Oldham to a 9th straight season in the third tier of English rugby. What many Oldham fans would have thought was just a dream, finally became a reality last season when, after topping the regular season table, they defeated Keighley in the League 1 grand final to finally secure promotion back to the Championship.

Last Time Out

Dewsbury 46-10 Oldham

The Rams ran out comfortable winners when the two sides met in June with Paul Sykes putting in a man of the match performance to back up the previous week's win at Bradford. Dewsbury opened the scoring early on through Dalton Grant who crashed over in the corner. Dom Speakman then crossed the line before Sykes booted a penalty to make it 14-0. Oldham were starting to look more desperate and Jason Crookes extended the Rams' lead on 35th minute when he crossed the whitewash to make it 20-0. Sykes

then completed the first half scoring with his second penalty of the game to make it 22-0 at the break. Any hopes of an Oldham comeback was quashed shortly after the break as Etu Uaisele went over in the corner to start the second half as the first had finished. Oldham did get on the scoresheet through Joe Burke who went through a gap in the Dewsbury defence to reduce the deficit to 28-6. However, half back Andy Kain scored a quick fire hat trick to cap off an impressive individual display before Chisholm scored a late consolation for the Lancashire side.

Key Player

Lewis Palfrey (left) - Half back Palfrey is Oldham's current club captain and is a huge part of Scott Navlor's side. Having had spells with Whitehaven and Batley after leaving Salford early in his career, Palfrey was voted the League 1 player of the year in 2015 having scored 11 tries and 129 goals during the campaign. The former Salford Red Devil joined Oldham prior to the 2013 season having abandoned a plan to play in New South Wales, Australia, Since then, Palfrey hasn't looked back and will no doubt be a player that the Dewsbury defence will have to keep a keen eye on in today's match if they are to stand a chance of emerging victorious.

It makes us look a laughing stock as a sport and harms our relationship with existing and potential sponsors. If you were a small business, why would you want to put money into something which may not be around until the end of the season? Same with league sponsors, do you want to put your name to something which is unsustainable. How the RFL can

help, I don't know. Perhaps they can implement a low cost loan scheme tied into off field development work and league performance. So if a club is doing good work all round but is struggling for the capital to expand, they can do so with an RFL loan. The RFL can then perhaps dock points if the loan wasn't repaid rather than issue winding up orders which endanger the whole clubs existence moving forward.

Purely from a Rams point of view we played some good rugby at the weekend and I think it is always good when you score points from all over the park via different methods. I hope Tony Tonks is retained for next year as he has added a great deal to an already good pack. It must have been an interesting occasion for him revisiting a club he is held in high regard in Sheffield. Similarly, it would have been interesting to see Eagles icon Mitch Stringer run out in different colours. Etu Uaisele has

proven a good addition in the last few seasons and I can't see him ever appearing again for Bradford with the new regime in charge, so hopefully he can become a full time Ram, although I understand he is off back Down Under. At this stage in his career he is at (although he plays with such enthusiasm it's easy to mistake him for a rookie). I can appreciate wanting to be close to home. But if he doesn't stay on he will be well remembered as a consistent and skilful player who it was always a pleasure to watch. Lucas Walshaw was a coup to get however and he continues to impress. 
Lions Take Play-Off Fight To Last Day

Bradford will be aiming to get back to winning ways when they face off against potential Championship Shield finalists Sheffield Eagles.



FLASHBACK...

This series takes a look back into recent history to see how our two teams fared around this particular weekend 5 and 10 years ago!

5 years ago this weekend For the Rams 2011 had been a

really poor affair and it has to be admitted that it was down to the demise of the fortunes of Barrow rather than performances on the field that had secured safety. Barrow were the subject of a massive salary cap scandal that saw them deducted all 29 points for salary cap breaches. The Rams endured a mid season spell of 14 games without a win but stood by coach Warren Jowitt for the 2012 season. Dominic Brambani led the points scoring charts with 103 from 28 games but he moved on to Sheffield Eagles at the end of the campaign along with winger Scott Turner, James Lockwood and Anthony England the two real cornerstones of the pack also left for pastures new with both players joining Featherstone Rovers. Rob Spicer is the only player from 2011 now still at the club. The highlight of the season was probably the 38-22 win over Batley in the Northern Rail Cup Quarter Final with the long run without a win definitely the low light! The club's average league attendance was 1,048 with a low of 862 against Barrow (although there were just 692 for the Challenge Cup defeat by Swinton) and a high of 1,184 for the derby game against Batley.

Oldham were a Championship One team back in 2011 and they at least had the benefit of a better season results wise. They finished in 7th place which got them the final play

off spot well ahead of 8th placed South Wales. Unfortunately that meant a trip to Rochdale in the Elimination Play Offs and their season ended at the first attempt as they lost 39-18 to condemn them to another season in the third tier. Carl Forber was the leading points and goal scorer with 146 and 63 in all competitions with Mark Brocklehurst leading try scorer on 17. The season had been a real disappointment to coach Tony Benson who had hoped for so much better after a run of four grand finals in a row prior to 2011. Winger Shaun Robinson weighed in with 8 tries in 19 games and he was later to move to the Rams via Oxford for a short stint at the Tetley's Stadium before moving back over the Pennines, Oldham's average league attendance slumped from 808 in 2010 to 627 in 2011 but there was a hardcore of around 400 who real stuck it out and have seen their club continue to evolve.

10 years ago

Oldham had played out the 2006 season in National League One the equivalent to the current Championship - but it had been a far from successful campaign as the club lost all 18 league games in a disastrous run of form in the wake of a massive six figure tax bill that the club did well to survive. John Pendlebury was coach as the season started but by the end of the season Steve Deakin had taken over the reigns. Their limited finances meant that the club was forced to call on trialists to fill in the gaps on many occasions but in a division that included Hull KR, Widnes, Leigh and Halifax among others this was always going to prove

difficult. Chris Barber with 68 points (including 24 goals) was the leading points scorer in all games with Andy Gorev (10) the only player to reach double figures in the try charts. Possibly their season long highlight was the 34-10 over local amateur side Saddleworth Rangers in the Challenge Cup.

For the Rams it was a season of success in National League Two as the club finished as Champions just two points ahead of Sheffield Eagles who had a better points difference. With an average home crowd of under 900 it still wasn't all sweetness and light as the crowds didn't quite respond to this successful title challenge as the club had hoped. Francis Malonev (186) was leading points scorer 19 ahead of Liam Finn with Richard Chapman (18), Bryn Powell (18), Liam Finn (17), Danny Maun (16), Chris Hall (14) and Eddie Mack (11) all reaching double figures of tries for the season. The final home game saw an innovative offer by Rams Chairman Mark Sawyer who threw open the gates with free entry for all to the decisive home game against Workington. 1,313 people took advantage of the offer to see the Rams awarded the trophy.
