I firmly believe that there is talent today in the field of sport that requires unearthing, and with the required expert coaching, and the will to make good by the individual concerned, together with the practical experience of knowing how to do things and when, then, and then only, will the supply exceed the demand in any form of sport. Old timers may disagree with the standard of the past players in comparison with the players of today, and it is a very moot point whether in many things, among which all our great sports may be included, such attempts at arriving at a comparison of the relative standards of skill of two widely separated generations are of real value, from whomever they come.

Cup No. I.

The charity match at Rochdale on Saturday last against the Hornets resulted in a good win by 18 points to 7, and our team well merited their victory. Although the game never reached the high standard which we expected there were some good moves and fast running by our team. One must take into consideration that this match is always a derby match, with keenness which at times may become excessive, but we came through the game without injuries and a fit team was reported for the match today. Our backs appeared to have that little extra speed over our opponents that mattered and we are of the opinion that our engagement of a sprinter-coach for our team will have the desired result. The Committee realise that there are certain weaknesses which no doubt will receive attention.

The receipts at Rochdale on Saturday last amounted to £430 which must be considered satisfactory under the weather conditions that prevailed. After tax and expenses are deducted from the above amount, the residue is divided between the two competing clubs, and final distribution of the amount received be paid according to R.L. Bye-law, being 60% to Junior
