JACK ROBINSON'S DEATH

News reached the town this week of the death of Jack Robinson, a former hero of the Athletic Grounds crowds. He was with the Hornets from 1908 to the end of the 1914-1919 war and from 1910-11 to 1934-35 held the club's try scoring record with 28 in a season, Jack Williams beat the record in 1935 with 30 tries. The sympathy of Rochdale sportsmen is extended to Mrs. Robinson in her great loss. Jack toured Australia in 1914. Latterly his sight failed but he was able to follow his employment until last year.

OLDHAM HERE AGAIN

This is only the fourth Saturday of the present season but it marks the second visit of Oldham, who took back with them the Law Cup on August 11th. The Watersheddings team have begun the season in fine style with three wins in four league fixtures. The Hornets will have to be at their best to check them today.
