**T. Danby.** Ex Harlequin R.U. Has played for England at R.U. and R.L. and was selected a Tourist in his first season with Salford.

**B. Hartley.** The only local in the side, now in his third season and is making the grade.

**J. Davies.** Ex Harlequin R.U., has played Union and League for Wales, a great player on his day, good goalkicker.

**T. Harrison.** Comes from Wigan, played for the Empire team against France last season, a seasoned scrum half who knows all the tricks of the game.

**D. M. Davies.** A Welshman, one of the Lance Todd discoveries, a long serving member of the team and still keeping up with the best.

**T. McKinney.** An Irishman, discovered by the genial Mr. Douglas the Manager, playing for Jedforest in Scottish football, is now securing the honours that he fully deserves.

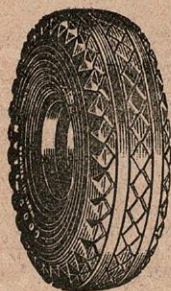

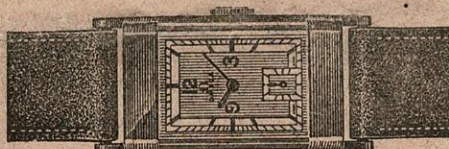
