Entertainment Tax.

The recent Budget issue has increased the rate of entertainment tax for football matches and we are of the opinion that such increases will have to be passed on to the public. A meeting of the Rugby League Management Committee has recommended that the minimum charge of admittance to our first team matches for season 1952/53 shall be 1/6 against the present charge of 1/3. Other prices and the cost of Members' Cards will also be affected by this increase. The cost of running a club is always on the upgrade and if the increase of Entertainment Tax had not come along we are of the opinion that the minimum charge would have been increased to 1/6 as an offset against increased expenses of running a club.

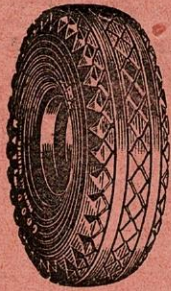

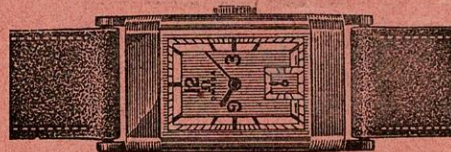
