



#### Junior attractions.

#### Play the Ball Law.

Amendment to the Play the Ball Law has been approved by the International Board and will be in operation next season. The chief points are as follows.

The tackled player must play the ball without delay and the tackler must release his hold on the tackled player immediately the tackle is effective.

The tackled player must drop the ball to the ground in front of him.

An offside player must be penalised if he takes advantage of his position and interferes with play.

The forwards on the tackled player's side must not obstruct by preventing opponents from advancing after the ball has been played. If a player accidentally loses possession of the ball after he has been tackled a scrum shall be formed at the spot. If he deliberately loses possession of the ball after being tackled a penalty shall be awarded against him.

Any player who is not nearer to his own goal line than the tackled player shall be offside and shall be penalised if he gains or attempts to gain an unfair advantage provided that such penalty is not to the disadvantage of the non-offending side.
