



To-day we have the pleasure of entertaining our old friends and rivals, Oldham, for this, our first Saturday home fixture of the season. In the past we have had many a keen tussle with our neighbours. Whilst wishing them the best of luck for a successful season and offering them our congratulations on taking the Law Cup back to Watersheddings by reason of their recent win over us there we hope to repeat our last season's performance and emerge victors to-day.

There is no doubt that Oldham are a fine side and that this season they will be all out to take back to Watersheddings some of the league honours which somehow have eluded them in the last season or so. They showed in the Law Cup game that they are going to be a team to be reckoned with, and two men in particular on whom the Hornets will have to keep their eyes in to-day's game are Frank Pitchford and Dave Cracknell, Pitchford was perhaps the most instrumental player in our defeat at Oldham a fortnight ago, for his dazzling display was of international standard, and he will have to be well watched to prevent him from repeating the performance to-day. Cracknell, too, is a most dangerous player and a very difficult man to stop when he breaks away.

Last season we took the honours in our three encounters with Oldham, for we retained the Law Cup by forcing a draw against one of the strongest Oldham sides since the war, and two weeks later won our league game at the Athletic Grounds by 12 points to 4.

In January Oldham turned the tables when they beat us by 26 points to 13 at Watersheddings.

Due to the holidays it has been necessary to write these notes before the Doncaster and Barrow games took place, so it is impossible to comment on the form shown by players in these two games, but we hope that it has been satisfactory to our supporters and that our side have made a commendable start to the season.

After to-day's game we have three matches all away from home. On Tuesday we go to Dewsbury for a league game, and next Saturday Warrington will be our hosts in the first round of the Lancashire Cup. Our trio of away matches end with a trip to Castleford in another league game.
