As the English players sample a new season a former Great Britain star is still counting the cost of his explosive temperament in Australia.

That controversial character Malcolm Reilly is still dominating the headlines he first claimed during that memorable tour of 1970.

There has been quite an outburst in Sydney recently following Reilly's latest episode when he was dismissed for butting while playing with top club Manly Warringah.

The former Castleford loose forward has been suspended again and the Aussie inquest should interest those few players in this country who occasionally resort to this tactic in the heat of the moment.

A leading neurologist has warned that Australian players using 'the head-butt' risk serious damage to the brain and that they face permanent injury.

There were three incidents of this nature in one wild weekend and while this tactic isn't prevalent over here I hope it disappears completely from the game.

It is certainly one thing we do not want to see with the Australians touring here shortly and the memory of that last clash in this country here in the World Cup final in 1970.

Reilly was recently described as the game's highest paid player Down Under but he has plenty of critics and former Test full back Les Johns told him:

'Mal, you are a sucker for the slightest provocation. Every player in the game knows how easily you can be baited.

'We know how tough you are so what about settling down and playing football, cutting out the rough stuff which has cost you a three-match suspension.'

So it seems Reilly, with all his skill, hasn't changed a lot but there is another side to his character, revealed by his wife Susan, a 23-yearold Castleford girl.

The better half of Reilly reports that big Mal is now a water-ski-ing boating and fishing enthusiast and is looking forward to becoming a father in January.

He has also taken up chess, for with training three times a week and matches at the weekend, he is forced to spend a lot of evenings at his luxury Sydney pad.

It's still the life of Reilly mind you for he's made the most of his skill as well as his strength and is stacking the dollars away.

He is the target for most teams, partly because of his nationality, but is happy with the situa-

'I love it in Australia and still feel it was the best decision of my life when I moved to Sydney,'

If there is one thing missing I'll wager it is the chance to wear a Great Britain shirt and clash with Australia at the highest level.

On the Inside with **DAVE PARKER**

Rochdale's county prop forward Eddie Brown has gone missing again after only three weeks of pre-season training and a chat with chairman Joe Grinrod and coach Frank Myler. He played against Oldham in the charity match and was selected for an "A" team match at Warrington, but failed to turn up the previous evening for training and then was omitted from the reserve line-up.

Former Keighley reserve hooker Les Hobson has joined Halifax for trials.

Dewsbury reserve second row forward David Briggs, who is also equipped physically to play in the front row, has joined Bramley for a four match trial.

Featherstone Rovers players have, despite the Government's freeze, increased terms for this term in reward for their Wembley triumph. They have a £4 increase on the £16 of last season with also £3 for midweek and Sunday games thrown in.

Hooker Graham Wilson, second row Graham Naylor — the most under-rated forward in Yorkshire — and stand off Mick Chamberlain have yet to start training. Huddersfield's playing strength has never been so low in strength.

Bill Francis has returned from New Zealand to stake a claim in Graham Starkey's line-up, but a former Halifax junior, who was coached by Keighley coach Alan Kellett, Phil Lee, has emigrated with his family to Auckland to take up a position with leading Kiwi club Richmond Rovers.

Salford's stay-away Cumbrian forward Bill Kirkbride, who is claiming a "raw deal" at the Willows, is training with Halifax junior club Ovenden until a senior club prepared to offer somewhere in the region of £2,500 comes along.

Former Leeds and Keighley prop Ken Eyres is joining the New Hunslet board, and another candidate is the old Hunslet club's former scrum half Jeff Stevenson. But with so many experienced players on the board offering their own advice, the position of Geoff Gunney as coach could be a tricky one in the next few months.

Halifax are chasing Mayfield (Rochdale) county winger and captain Jim Power. Power, who also plays for England, has turned down the offer of trials.

The Rugby League council arranged for a sub-committee last Saturday morning to meet at headquarters and talk with representatives of the three county amateur commissions in an effort to work out a possible peace formula with the ruling executive of the recently formed British Amateur Rugby League Association.

The average age of the Keighley "A" team, who met Huddersfield "A" at Fartown last Saturday was 20.

The Keighley club received a letter last week from an Australian R.U. player saying he would like to guest for the club while looking up relations and would be pleased to receive the £573 return air fare before setting off!
