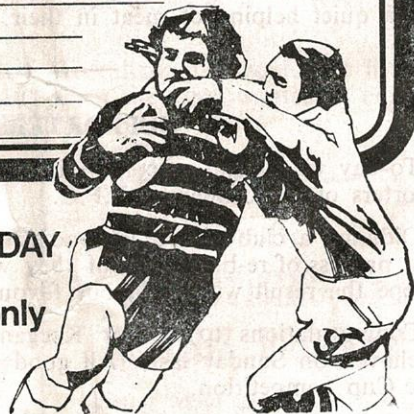

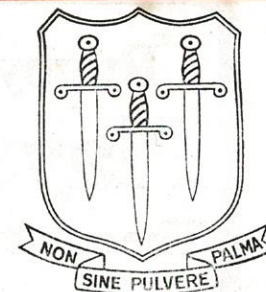

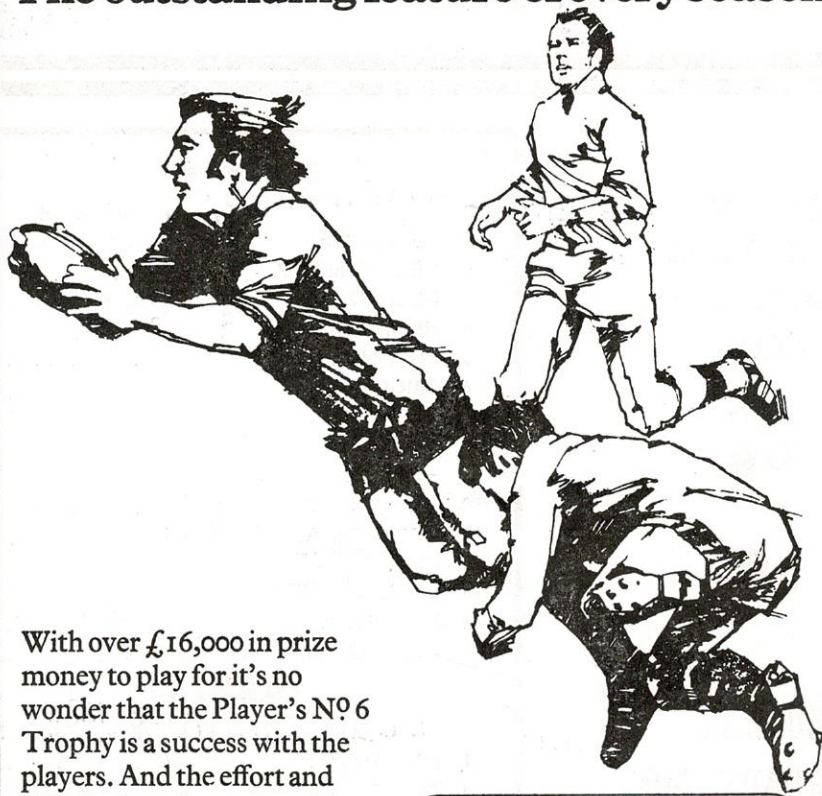

We played at Watersheddings in the early part of the season and won 30—17pts.

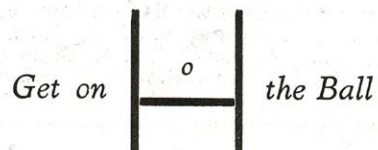

After leaving school David Sampson joined Trinity Juniors and gained County honours whilst playing for them. He was signed by Wakefield Trinity in April 1960 and joined the Bramley Club in 1966. He made his debut on the 20th August that year against Leeds.

Until last season David successfully occupied the centre position and then the experiment was tried of playing him in the forwards. This has been so successful that only in an emergency is he likely to revert to his former position.

He is 28 years of age and is "mine host" of the Ship Inn, Stanley.

It is still quite a while before the Gt. Britain tour party sets off in May yet, somehow, we can't keep the Australians out of the headlines these days. It seems they are not going to be content with stripping us of our stars but also want to keep our game on the breadline.

They ignored repeated warnings on the recent tour, that Wembley was not the place to play the First Test, and it will be interesting to hear how they react to a £500 loss.

I know they can rightly point to the influence of television but I was among those who felt they were determined to have it at Wembley — or nowhere.

"The annoying thing is that the Australians just would not listen to us and we gave them plenty of warning when they first wanted to change the itinerary", says League secretary Bill Fallowfield.

Personally, and I'm not being wise after the event, I was in favour of taking the Test to White City, where it drew 18,000 in midweek in 1967. The costs would have been considerably less for Wembley took a 25% cut and White City would have been far more accessible to those Australians in the Earls Court area.

With an evening game the second half could have been shown live on television.

The profits of £2,500 from the Second Test at Headingley and the £1,000 from Warrington in the weather-hit Third Test are still peanuts compared with those for Tests in Sydney and Brisbane.

So now the Australians want to introduce a new system of pooling tour receipts or rather the profits. They claim that it is wrong for the English Rugby League to collect a profit in the region of £40,000 for a tour of their country when they are running at a loss in this country.

I think one must sympathise with them to a point but there seems to be no comparison between the drawing powers of the two countries.

"It is like the boxer who can command the fans", says secretary Fallowfield "He is able to bank on recovering a bigger purse from the takings."

The British teams have always captured the imagination of the crowds Down Under, maintaining their reputation for playing fast, exciting and open football.

This could not be said of the first part of this season's tour by the Australians, who were more intent on earning a reputation for toughness rather than talented play. They are always more physical than skilful and this makes it harder to sell a tour even though some people are reputed to enjoy a quiet helping of meat in their sporting sandwich.
