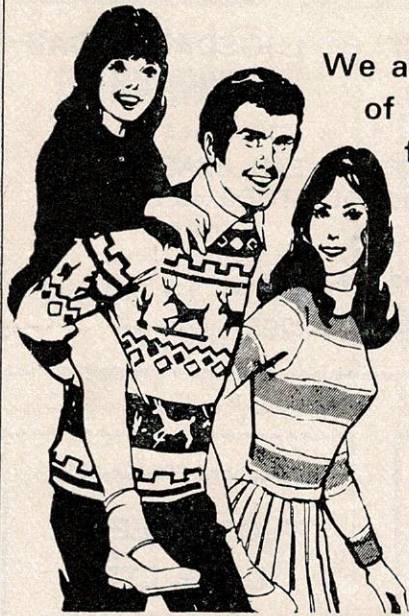

Welcome to Oldham

After an absence of four weeks in which we lost in the Challenge Cup to Leigh, but had notable league wins at Featherstone and Whitehaven, first-team rugby returns to Naughton Park with today's vital league clash against Oldham.

Oldham are still in need of points to ensure first division football next season, and with six of their remaining seven games away from home they are sure to be in determined mood today. It now looks as if Whitehaven, Leigh and Hull K.R. will be relegated, but the remaining team could come from any one of seven or eight clubs, with Wigan, Castleford, Bramley, Oldham and ourselves having the most to do. Several of these teams have to play each other, and the outcome may not be known until the last day of the league programme, Easter Monday, April 15th.

Oldham have spent heavily this season and have acquired the services of Clawson from Leeds, Holland from Salford, Treasure from Bradford, Gregory from Warrington, Welding from Rochdale, and McCracken from Whitehaven. All six are fine players, with prop Terry Clawson having been selected for the forthcoming tour to Australia. Congratulations, Terry!

Their second row looks particularly strong with Gregory and Welding, both big, strong runners. However, the key to the game could be at half-back, where McCone and Treasure have the speed and guile to create problems for any opponent. Who our stand-off will be is as yet uncertain, but Reg Bowden is certain to be at scrum-half, and his display at Featherstone put him on the short list for the touring party.

At full-back, Martin Murphy is a fine attacking player, whilst centres Wainwright and Larder have plenty of experience. Wingman Holland, signed from Salford a few weeks ago, is a determined runner as well as being the side's goalkicker.

Finally we should not forget Kevin Taylor, their hooker, judged by many to be the best in the game, and possession could be vital today.

MATCH REPORTS

In the cup-tie at Leigh the side looked the better equipped team throughout. In the first ten minutes two good chances went begging, but it still looked as if we would win with plenty to spare. Alas, Jim Mills was sent off, and from then on we faced an uphill battle. Jim Fiddler somehow managed to play the ball to himself on three occasions, the result being two drop goals and a try. Nevertheless in the last 20 minutes we scored a fine try, and in the last minutes of the game Eric Hughes almost got his second but was grounded a foot from the line.

The following week we travelled to Featherstone and gave a display to rank amongst the finest ever by a Widnes side. The tackling was ferocious with Ged Lowe, captain for the day in the absence of Doug Laughton, setting a wonderful example. It was a wonderful team effort, with Jim Mills clinching his Tour place with a great display. Reg Bowden gave Steve Nash a terrible time, and Ray Dutton proved himself once again the game's best full-back. A final pat on the back to John Craig, who made his debut at No. 8. It will surely be the first of many games John will play for the senior side.

At Whitehaven last week-end we won a hard game by 12 points to 2. Press reports indicated a dour game, but that was hardly surprising as underfoot conditions could hardly have been worse. John Foran and Alan Prescott scored our tries, and new boy Steve Tilley had a fine game at centre. For the second week running our line was not crossed, and it was a happy party that made the long journey home.

JIM MILLS

The selection of Jim Mills for the Australian Tour came as a surprise to some, but not to the Widnes players and fans. Jim has been in great form recently, and a lot of thanks is due to the wonderful training methods of coach Vince Karalius. Jim is now just under 17 stone, and has never felt better; his display at Featherstone not only ruined the chances of their prop, Harris, but also clinched Jim's place. Many congratulations, Jim!
