THE 1974 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

Sixteen clubs will qualify for the privilege of competing for the 1974 Club Championship—a new end of season competition which substitutes for the former "Top 16" play-off which has been made redundant by the introduction of two divisions.

Three Second Division Clubs—at least—are guaranteed qualifiers because the top twelve Second Division Clubs are playing off for these places as follows:

1st Leg

Weekend 30 March. 1st Round

In this round the top team plays the twelfth, the second plays the eleventh and so on. The higher placed team in any pair has choice of playing at home or away in the 1st Leg.

Weekend 6 April. 1st Round 2nd Leg

Saturday 13 April. 2nd Round 1st Leg

The highest placed team of the 1st Round survivors play the lowest and so on.

Easter Monday, 15 April. 2nd Round 2nd Leg

The thirteen other teams having the highest number of merit points will join these three to make up the number to sixteen. The positions in the final League tables gain merit points (30 points for the top of Division One, 29 points for the second from the top down to one for the bottom club of Division Two), as do promotion (add four for promotion, subtract four for relegation) and all Knock-out Competitions (3 points for every game won).

The merit points which clubs have gained from Knock-out Competitions so far are given in the next column. It gives a fair

indication of which clubs have already secured for themselves places in the play-off but other places are still wide open. The final League position and the promotion/relegation battle will all play their part in determining good fortune for some and bad luck for others. One thing is certain, the sixteen most successful clubs of the season will be taking part.

If clubs tie on merit points they can either play each other (if a convenient date can be arranged which does not affect the match programme as a whole) or toss a coin to determine which has precedence in the Merit Points Table.

The first round of the competition proper will be the weekend of Saturday, 20 April, 1974, and subsequent rounds will be on successive weekends culminating in the Final on Saturday, 18th May, 1974, which will be on a neutral ground. All rounds will be on the "sudden death" principle with the club having the higher number of merit points in any one game having the privilege of a home fixture (except as stated above, for the Final).
