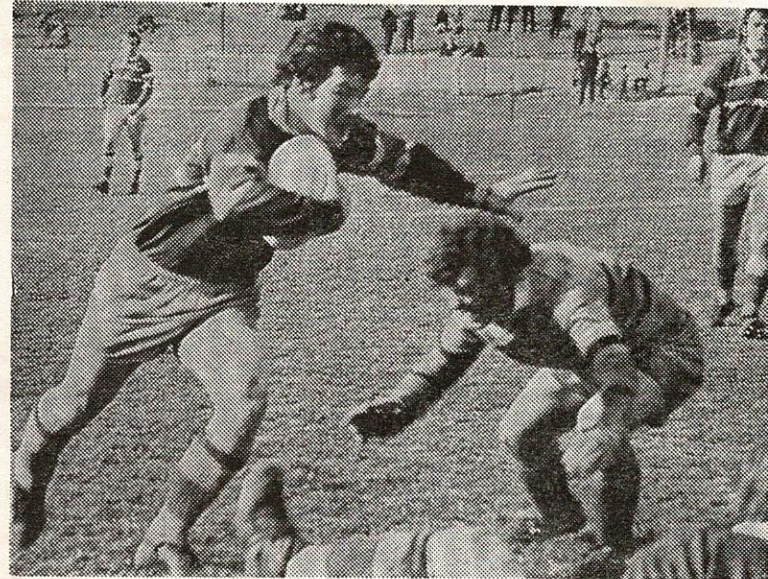

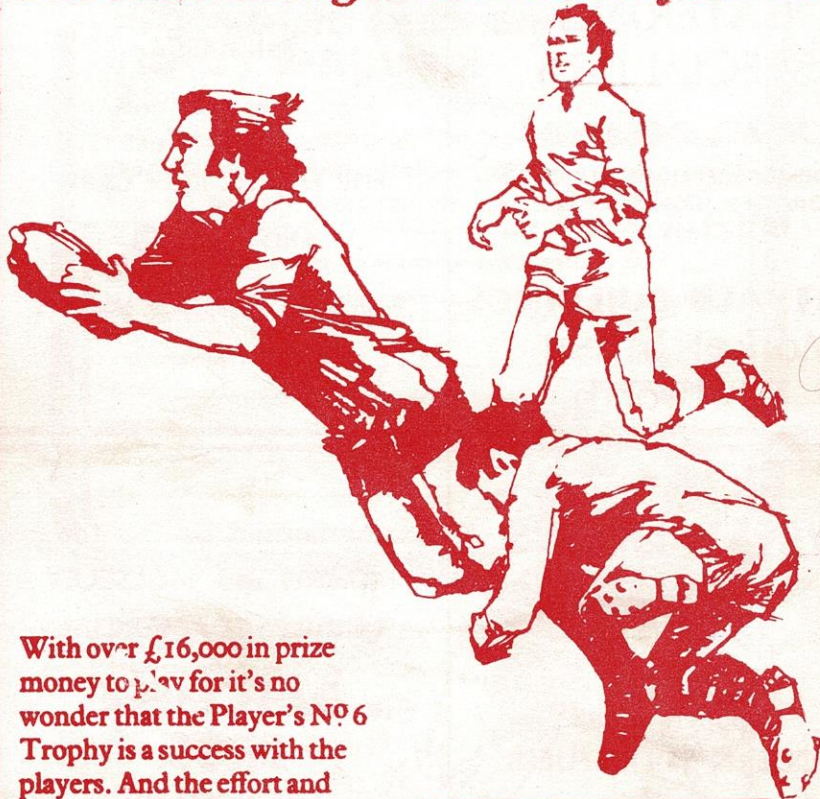

This is it. — **THE BIG ONE** —
Hornets v. Oldham. What a way to end an amazing season. Who would have thought at Christmas, when both teams took part in that fog-bound "derby" classic at Wattersheddings, that the season would have ended in such a traumatic fashion.

That Boxing Day game ended in victory for us and was in the middle of a superb run of 12 games without defeat. Oldham had gone through seven successive victories before that game. Alas for both clubs, darker days were just around the corner. Oldham won their next game against Whitehaven but since then have taken only five points from their League programme. We, on the other hand, continued the good run right until 9th February. That was the day we lost in the Players No. 6 final to Warrington.

Since then (these notes were written before the start of the Easter programme) we have drawn with Bramley and beaten Wakefield. A disastrous spell which has seen us clinging grimly on to our First Division place.

Oldham's purple patch in October, November and December, saw them chalk up successive victories over Castleford, Featherstone Rovers, Widnes, Wigan, Featherstone, St. Helens and Leigh.

At that stage of the season Oldham like ourselves, were looking forward to a good season in the

First Division. How times change. Still, whatever the situation, 'derby' games usually bring out the best in both teams, so we are confidently expecting a great game today.

Oldham this season have spent £30,000 on strengthening their first team pool. Terry Clawson, Brian Gregory, David Treasure and of course, our former second row forward Bob Welding have found their way to Watersheddings since the start of the season.

Incidentally, Bob Welding has impressed the Oldham supporters with his all-action displays, but was unlucky to be ruled out of last week's game at Castleford because of injury. The last three clashes between Hornets and Oldham have been very close. At this time last year we scraped home 14-12 at the Athletic Grounds, thanks mainly to a late try by Willie Aspinall and a fine touchline goal from Bill Holliday. In October last year, in a Floodlit Cup Competition we just managed to pip Oldham 4-0 at the Watersheddings and then there was that Boxing Day 15-11 win of ours against them at Watersheddings. The highlight of that game was, of course, Stuart Whitehead's sensational 70 yards try midway through the first half. A try never to be forgotten by those people fortunate enough to be there that day.

We can only hope today's game is as entertaining as that last clash. If it is we are in for a bumper end of season climax.

John Butler's selection for the Great Britain's tour of Australia this summer was a little belated but still one of the most popular in the 26 strong squad.

It is generally accepted that all the players heading Down Under on May 23 are dedicated and determined to succeed in the quest to regain the Ashes.

But I was impressed by the immediate reaction of Butler when he discovered he was to replace Salford's Keith Fielding, who withdrew for personal reasons.

'I am not going out there to be a ham-and-egger,' he declared. 'I want to win a Test place.'

That honest approach is characteristic of a player who has quickly carved out a dazzling new career with Rochdale Hornets when he was almost swept up to the game's scrapheap.

There was a most unhappy chapter in the Butler success story when he was forced to retire injured in the Players No. 6 final against Warrington, after making a great start in this game. Fortunately,

Butler has made a habit of bouncing back as he did after packing in the game 12 months ago.

'I was fed up with travelling from my St. Helen's home to play for Kegihley and decided to call it a day,' he recalls.

'But when Rochdale came for me I had second thoughts and decided to play again.'

It was, of course, coach Frank Myler's experienced eye and sound judgement which prompted the Butler switch from loose forward to stand-off.

After winning recognition from Great Britain's selectors to travel to France as reserve, it must have been a disappointment to Butler to find he had failed to win an original place in the 26-strong tour party.

The value of Butler's inclusion is that he can play loose forward, stand-off or even centre for he is powerful, skilful and enthusiastic.

When he isn't working as a mechanic in a St. Helen's garage he is improving his home on
